



THE GOSPEL: Luke 2:1-20


The Gospel is read in parts with carols sung between each part. While the carols are sung, the characters are gradually placed into the nativity scene.




THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION


- O: What is the Sacrament of the Altar?


