The Secretary & Treasurer report was read by Secretary/Treasurer Roger Thalman. 
A Big thank you to Don Fischer for instructing us on carving a "Tiger", even though we had to put up with his jokes, when is wife wasn't around.

- A small board
- String
- A small rock
- Drill and bits
- · Handsaw or pull saw
- Permanent marker
