Friday Morning Service
September 10, 2021**

Many brothers and sisters traveled from across the country to gather together at the Pilgrims Prayer Church in Dorton, Kentucky for the Twenty-Second Annual Session of the Solid Rock Association of Old Time Baptists of Jesus Christ. After singing a few well-loved songs of Zion, our moderator, Elder Daryl Newsom, stood and welcomed everyone who had met out. Elder Daryl Newsom asked Elder Ken Turner to open the services.

Elder Ken Turner sang, “No Graves on That Bright Shore”, and, “Poor Wayfaring Stranger” with his wife before he began to open up the services. He spoke about the challenges we face in this world, but reiterated that we all need to look to the Lord.

Elder Larry Hargett lined, “Jesus Left His Home in Glory,” and Elder Ron Woodward led us in prayer. He thanked the Lord for being such a king and he prayed for the lost.

Elder Chris Newsom began to preach the Introductory Sermon. He said, “The harder I work for God, the more satisfied I am.” He wants our association to be more Christ-like. He said, “If you think your minute book is more important than your Bible, then you are wrong.”

Item-1

Elder Daryl Newsom called for the church letters to be handed in to the clerk, along with any contributions, obituaries, queries and/or requests. A move by Elder Chris Newsom and a second by Elder Larry Adkins was made to grant the Turner Church's request to become a full member church, receive their letter, and seat their delegates along with **all** churches and delegates who submitted a letter in regular form.

A move by Elder Jeremy Newsom and a second by Deacon James Newsome was made to grant the Southern Home Church's request to remain as a fellowship church, but to also grant them full membership rights by seating their delegates.

Item-3

The assistant clerk, Elder Brandon Newsom, then read the letter from the **Turner Church**. A move by Elder Larry Adkins and a second by Elder Larry Hankins was made to receive the Turner Church's letter and all other letters that were submitted in regular form.

Item-4

The moderator appointed Deacon Thomas Pinion, Elder Brandon Newsom, and Deacon Joey Justice to go back and take the vote for officer elections.

The officers agreed to serve this association to the best of their ability.

Item-5

Elder Daryl Newsom stood as moderator. A move by Elder Jeremy Newsom and a second by Deacon James Newsome was made for Elder Daryl Newsom to make all temporary appointments.

Item-6

A move by Elder Michael Stanley and a second by Elder Larry Hankins to grant the request of the Shiloh Association of remaining a fellowship association.

Item-7

Elder Daryl Newsom asked if the delegates would like the Charter, the Rules of Decorum, the Constitution and the Articles of Faith read or omitted from being read. A move by Elder Chris Newsom and a second by Elder Jeremy Newsom was made to omit reading the Rules of Decorum, Constitution and Articles of Faith, but to read the Charter.

After the clerk, Deacon Thomas Pinion, read the Charter, Elder Daryl Newsom admonished the brothers to obey the Rules of Decorum.

Elder Daryl Newsom called for transient ministers or members to sign in with the clerk at this time. The following responded:

A move by Elder Jeremy Newsom and a second by Elder Clyde Bentley was made to receive their report and discharge the committee.

Item-11

A move by Elder Chris Newsom and a second by Elder Larry Hankins was made to forgo the Committee on Arrangements and the Committee on Resolutions. Typically, the purpose of the Committee on Resolutions is to work with the Committee on Arrangements and write recommendations to come under consideration of the delegates for Saturday's work. This committee typically consists of association officers and one delegate from each member church.

Item-12

A move by Elder Larry Adkins and a second by brother Bud Cornett was made to adjourn for the day. Elder Clyde Bentley sang, "Beulah Land," and Elder Bennie Slone led us in prayer with asking a blessing over the food.

Friday Afternoon Service September 10, 2021

After a few well-loved songs of Zion, Elder David Nichols welcomed everyone who met out and spoke about the wonderful news he got from the doctor today. Then he asked Elder Shadrach Newsome to introduce the services.

Elder Shadrach Newsome sang, “God on the Mountain”, and began to open up the services. He spoke about carrying the cross and how he wanted to lead by example. He spoke about how God saved him when he felt he was unlovable.

Item-20

A move by Elder Michael Stanley and a second by Elder Ron Woodward was made to have the Constitution, Articles of Faith, Rules of Decorum and our Charter printed in the minute book.

Item-21

Elder Shadrach Newsome, chosen by the delegates during the 2020 session to write this year's circular letter, came and read his circular letter. After reading his letter, a move by Elder Larry Adkins and a second by Elder Larry Hankins was made to receive the letter as written and print it in the minute books.

A move by Deacon James Newsome and a second by Elder Larry Hargett was made to have the assistant clerk write a letter of thanks to the hosting church, the Pilgrims Prayer Church for their work and hospitality during the 2021 Solid Rock Association.

Item-28


A move by Deacon James Newsome and a second by Elder Larry Adkins was made to allow the clerks to make all grammatical corrections in the publishing of the minutes.

Constitution

From a long series of experiences, we the churches of Jesus Christ, being legally baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, and convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches in order to have a union and communion among us, and preserve, perpetuate, and maintain a correspondence with each other in our union, we therefore propose to keep the order and rules of an Association, in accordance with the following plan, or form, of government:

Article 1. The Association shall be called the *Solid Rock Association of Old Time Baptist of Jesus Christ*.

Article 2. The Association shall be composed of three (3) delegates from each church in our association, along with the elected officers. These delegates shall be duly sent to represent their church in the Association. They shall be members whom their church judge best qualified for that purpose. Upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to seats.

Article 3. Each church letter shall bear their annual statistics for numbers: in fellowship, baptized, received by letter, received by recommendation, received by restoration, dismissed by letter, dismissed by request, excluded and deceased.

Article 4. The delegates thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's children, nor shall they have any clerical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in our union.

Article 5. The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper decorum.

Article 6. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk. Each shall be chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

Article 7. Any church petitioning, for either full membership or fellowship status, is to submit formal paperwork to the Association at the annual Solid Rock Association meeting. They will fall under the watch care of the Association's Committee on Council for an examination period of one year. If, at the conclusion of the examination period, they are found to be orthodox and orderly, per report by the Committee on Council, they shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator, who shall give them the right hand of fellowship.

Article 8. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in the Association.

Article 9. Every query presented by a church to the Association, being first debated in their own church, shall come under the consideration of the Association.

Article 10. Every motion made and seconded shall be considered by the Association, unless it be withdrawn by the party who made it.

Article 11. We think it absolutely necessary that we have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper, and to send it by their delegates to the Association. Such sums shall be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer, chosen by the Association, who shall be accountable for the money.

Article 12. There shall be an Association Book kept wherein the proceedings of every association shall be recorded by a Secretary appointed by the Association. The Secretary shall receive annual compensation for his services.

Article 13. The minutes of the Association may be read, and corrected if need be, and shall be signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with. All queries, requests and resolutions which have been debated in the current association, shall be read back.

Article 14. Amendments to this plan of government can only be made by unanimous decision of the union, if deemed necessary.

Article 15. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association; the best method of effecting the same shall be determined by the Association.

Article 16. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by a will of the majority of the delegates present.

Article 17. The Association is to remain as an advisory council, and not as an administrative government. Each church SHALL hold its own Ecclesiastical Keys. Each church shall be the sole judge of its members' conduct. Each church shall also have the right to decide who is worthy of membership, office or ordination.

Article 18. This Association shall have the power to:

A.) Provide for the general union of the churches, and to preserve an inviolable chain of communion between them;

B.) Give the churches all necessary advice in matters of church difficulty;

C.) Inquire into the cause as to why any church shall fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association;

D.) Appropriate the money contributed by the churches for any purpose it may think proper;

E.) Appoint any member, by their consent, to transact any business it may think necessary;

F.) Withdraw from any church in the union that does violate the Constitution, Articles of Faith or Rules of Decorum of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles of the Word of God as found in the book of Hebrews 6:1-2;

G.) To admit any orderly minister of our faith and order to a seat in the Association;

H.) To adjourn to any future time and place it deems convenient.

Articles of Faith

Article 1. We believe in one true and living God (*1 Cor 8:6*): Father, Son and Holy Ghost (*1 John 5:7*); and these three are one (*John 14:8-11*).

Article 2. We believe the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, as translated in the King James Version, to be the inspired written word of God (*2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:21*). The New Testament is the standard of faith and the ONLY authorized rule of faith and practice to the church of God under the gospel dispensation (*Gal 5:4*).

Article 3. We believe in the doctrine of election by Grace (*Acts 10:43; Eph 2:8*). We do not believe in particular election (*Titus 2:11; Rom 10:13*) and reprobation, so as to make God partial directly, or indirectly, or to injure any of the children of men.

Article 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin (*Rom 5:12*), and of man's inability to save himself from the fallen state he is in by nature; therefore, the Savior is needed for our redemption (*Rom 5:17-19; Eph 2:8-9*).

Article 5. We believe that sinners are called (*Mark 2:17*), converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit (*1 Peter 1:23*), and that all who are so regenerated and born again by the Spirit of God, shall never fall finally away (*Eph 1:13; Heb 10:14*).

Article 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God (*Acts 13:39; Luke 18:13-14*) only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ in obedience to the calling of repentance (*2 Timothy 1:9*).

Article 7. We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper and feet washing are ordinances of Jesus Christ (**Matt 3:13; Matt 26:26-29; John 13:4-14**), and that true believers are the only proper subjects of these sacraments. And, we believe the only true mode of baptism is by immersion after receiving the spiritual baptism of the Holy Ghost (**Rom 6:4**).

Article 8. We believe in the resurrection of the dead (**Luke 24:46; I Cor 15:51-53**), and a general judgment, and that the joys of the righteous (**1 Thess 4:16-17**) and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal (**John 5:28-29**).

Article 9. We believe no minister has the right to administer the ordinances of the gospel, unless He has been called (**Rom 10:15; 1 Cor 2:4**) and has come under the imposition of hands by a presbytery of the church (**Acts 13:2-3; Titus 1:5-15**).

Article 10. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge people in their sins (**1 Cor 5:2**) or causes them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation (**Matt 7:13-14; Matt 7:21; Luke 13:23-24**), is erroneous and such doctrine shall be rejected by us (**Gal 1:8-10**).

Article 11. We believe that all people reaching the age of accountability must be born again (**Rom 7:9-10; John 3:3**). We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the law of God (**Rom 4:15**), are only subject to the first death which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam. No child dying in that state shall suffer punishment in hell by the guilt of Adam's sin (**Matt 18:1-5**).

Article 12. We believe that God is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance and the knowledge of the truth, that they might be saved (**2 Pet 3:9; John 3:16**). All men, at one time or another, are found in such capacity as that through the grace of God they may be eternally saved (**Rom 5:18**).

Article 13. We believe that Christ has but one true and gospel church, and that it will finally persevere through grace to glory (*Matt 16:18; 1 Cor 12:13*). When the trump shall sound, the Son shall deliver up his church and present it to his Father, and so shall we ever be with the Lord (*1 Thess 4:16-17*).

Article 14. We believe that the Church is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and with one another (*Acts 2:41-42; 1 John 1:3*). Jesus Christ is the head of the church, and the government thereof is upon His shoulders (*Eph 5:23-24*).

Rules of Decorum

Article 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

Article 2. The Moderators and Clerks of the Association shall be selected by the delegates who are present.

Article 3. Only one member shall speak at a time and shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to speak.

Article 4. The person speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone, except the Moderator, until he is done.

Article 5. The person speaking shall strictly adhere to his subject, and in no way reflect on the preceding speaker, but shall define his ideas on the proposition for debate so far as he can.

Article 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the same.

Article 7. No member shall rise to speak more than three times on any one subject, without permission from the Association.

Article 8. No member of the Association shall have the liberty to laugh during the Association, nor whisper in time of public speech.

Article 9. No member shall address another in any other form or term other than that of "Brother" or "Sister."

Article 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt a Brother, or prohibit him from speaking, until he gives his views on the subject, unless he has violated the Rules of Decorum.

Article 11. The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association may require.

Article 12. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any member, provided the chair be filled. But, he *shall have **no** vote*, unless the Association be equally divided. In this event, he shall give the deciding vote.

Article 13. Any member who shall willfully and knowingly violate any of these rules shall be reprimanded by the Association as it may think proper.

Resolutions

Article 1. We believe that our article of faith #10 rejects sin, including homosexuality. We also believe that marriage is a union between a man and a woman, neither of which gender has been altered. It is further agreed that our ministers refrain from marrying people into this ungodly sin. (Adopted in 2004 minutes)

Article 2. In regard to letters of dismissal, the association recognizes the complexity of this issue and agrees that this request falls under article #17 of our constitution, which states: *The association is to remain as an advisory council and not as an administrative government. Each church shall be the sole judge of its members conduct. Each church shall also have the right to decide who is worthy of membership, office or ordination.* (Adopted in 2004 minutes)

Article 3. We agree that several churches have already established a method of receiving previously ordained members into their fellowship. We recommend that the churches take care to uphold our articles of faith and constitution already established, particularly article of faith #9, and we note that the laying on of hands to issue credentials is an accepted practice with in our union. (Adopted in 2004 minutes)

Article 4. Under Article 7, any church organized under the authority of the Solid Rock Association, seeking membership, shall be immediately received and given the right hand of fellowship. This Article shall include any new associations seeking correspondence. Being a full member church of the Solid Rock Association grants voting rights to delegates, qualification to have members selected to preach the Introductory Sermon, and to write the Circular Letter. Fellowship churches only, are extended the right hand of fellowship as individual churches but do not have these authoritative rights. (Adopted in 2016 minutes)

Article 5. Under Article 14, the term "plan of government" pertains to the Association foundational documents including the Charter, Constitution, Articles of Faith, and Rules of Decorum. This does not apply to Article 16, which pertains to standard Association matters. (Adopted in 2016 minutes)
