So the waterway has not yet been dredged. At our last meeting we were optimistically looking at construction beginning around now, so we'd be ready for the winter season. Sadly however, one of the national agencies is apparently experiencing a backlog which is delaying the issuance of permitting. There are also some funding issues still being worked upon.

I've been in regular dialog with the County MSBU Department and the Pro-

ject Manager and am satisfied that they are trying hard to shake the permit free, and I will provide an update for you at our next meeting.

On a positive note, Smitty, my immediate neighbor, has just returned from island-hopping all the way up from Trinidad in *Sarah Noble*, a large ketch which draws 5.5 ft. Despite my dire warnings of most certain doom, and my suggestion to have a tow boat standing by at the ready, he valiantly entered the Manchester on a +2ft tide and arrived at his dock without touching bottom. I suspect that he didn't have much water under his keel during passage ©, but it's clearly still possible with the current tides and a spot of luck.

Minutes of the 5/14/2013 General Meeting

Past-President Goulette called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. President Randall was out-of-town. There were 17 members present, representing 14 memberships, including Board members Jim Goulette, Cheri Bauer, Kim Carless, and Al Lange. No new members were present, and no County MSBU Representative was in attendance.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Kim Carless gave his report, showing a current balance of \$2,563.23. 96 memberships have been renewed for '13, with 8 new members added. An additional 30 are paid through 2012, with a total of 211 on the membership roster. The check register and expense log are available at all meeting for review. Motion was made/passed to accept the report as presented.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the last meeting were printed in the newsletter that was mailed to all members. Motion was made/passed to accept the printed minutes.

OLD BUSINESS: Past-President Goulette reported that the overhanging obstructive vegetation at the Midway terminus blind corner has been trimmed by Earth Balance, with costs picked up by the County. Members were urged to assess the enhanced visibility through the blind corner, and report back if further work was necessary. Thanks were expressed to Diane Grant(?) at the County Commissioners Office for her assistance in this matter.

A reminder was issued to all boaters: Vessels going WITH the tide have the right-of- way, and 1 LONG BURST on your horn as you approach will give warning to approaching traffic at this corner, and any other obstructed view locations, and is a wise safety precaution.

Information forwarded from MSBU Rep Dawn Harrison: The Army Corp of Engineers have yet to approve the dredging proposal, with over 4,000 cu of spoils estimated to be removed. Chuck Mopps at Public Works hopes to complete a cost breakdown between the Ackerman & Manchester MSBUs by next meeting. The Ackerman MSBU Committee has disbanded, reasons unknown. County Purchasing has not yet started the 90-day public bid process. At the end of this new permitting process, we should have a new 5-year permit in place for the Aquatic Preserve dogleg area. Dredging estimates are still running between \$28 - \$85/cu yd, so the final cost could run anywhere from \$318K to \$968K. Our last "spot dredge" was \$65K.

New Business: Member Q: Members complained of trash being dumped at the old lock site property. **Jim G:** We will **c**ontact the County for cleanup or pickup as necessary. If members see anyone dumping in that area, try to get a license number on the vehicle, or at least a good description if possible. The meeting adjourned for coffee and desserts at 7:50 PM.
