However, we have it in hand - the County BCC has settled the lawsuit with our antagonist, Mudge, \$15,000. Now we can move on, remove the lock and dredge our canals! This price is a drop in the bucket compared to the cost of further litigation to obtain absolute victory, and the escalating costs of marine construction. As you may know, the hearings on December 5th, and 7th, 2006, did not

transpire as County **Attorneys** and Mr. Mudge were in active negotiations; both Patrick Randall and I attended the December 12th, 2006, Charlotte County BCC's Regular Meeting voice our support for the consent agenda item to settle with Mr. Mudge. MWCA 10/10/06 GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Meeting called to order at 7:30 PM; 43 members present, representing 31 memberships, including 7 Board members. Current Board members were introduced. Pres. Jim Goulette presided. Motions passed to accept Secretary & Treasurer reports. VP Patrick Randall, also a Manchester MSBU **Advisory Committee** member, reviewed the Manchester MSBU revised budget, dropped from \$1.2 million to \$500K by the postponement of the Flamingo /Como Waterway dredging. The current \$100 per ERU ad valorem tax will remain in place until such time as the lock removal is underway. The **County Commissioners** have agreed to a current maximum \$205 per ERU assessment to allow for necessary Waterway projects, which can be invoked in November 2007. This would mean that no public hearing would be necessary. MWCA

members are urged to notify the MSBU Board of any problems in the canals as costing of projects by Public Works for spot dredging and other small improvements can be done on a case-by-case basis. **DEP/County lawsuit:** The letter from complainant Mudge and subsequent emails were posted on the wall for viewing by members. His estimate of current damages listed \$31K in compensatory damages to his eroding seawall and dock. Several members complained of problems in and around the lock enclosure due to swift current and water depth reduced by silting. Members again requested that bumpers on sidewalls of lock be replaced if lock is not removed in very near future. It has been noted that the lock is eroding under the solid floor, and current is passing underneath the lock enclosure. Heated discussion, ensued on the lack of progress in

the lock removal process,

and the resulting dangerous

conditions created at the lock, which are endangering boats and boaters.

Tara M. from Public Works informed us the Alligator Creek dredging was bid at \$27.59 per cubic yard, as a guide for the cost associated with the Lewis Creek S-bend dredging bids, which will be published for bids in November. New depth soundings have been taken by members at the S-bend and marking stakes were replaced, so the website will be updated with new information.

Members suggested hiring an attorney to speed the lock removal process, but /County rules prohibit MSBU Waterway funds from being used to pay attorney fees.

Meeting adjourned at 9:55 for oral presentations from District 4 County Commissioner candidates Richard Loftus & Joan Fisher's representative, and coffee was served.
