

Ukraine Missions has been blessed with resources from across the region and the eastern United States. The generosity provides relief to the displaced in Ukraine and elsewhere.

I am happy to report that your contributions are making a difference across Ukraine. Following is a brief update.

**Krasnophilla, Sumy Region, Eastern Ukraine:**

The village of Krasnophilla, located about five miles from the Russian border, was spared much of the shelling that Russia rained down on Mariupol, Kharkiv, or even Shoshka district in northern Sumy early in the Russian invasion. The village was shelled on 25 May and again 2 June. Your contributions have helped bring a ray of hope to the village through the compassion and labor of Ira Z.

In the early morning hours of 2 June, this house and others near by became a target of indiscriminate Russian terrorism. These are images from a video shared by Ira. The cruise missiles exploded near her house. She described it as the scariest night of her life.





Somewhere in Poland and Ukraine, the buckets that you filled so generously are arriving awaiting distribution; the exact location was not divulged. Most are going into Lviv and there loaded into smaller trucks and taken throughout Ukraine.



29 May, the congregation meets in the "new" building. While not completed, a certificate of use was received from the local government. Many of who assembled on this day were refugees from Eastern Ukraine. Work is moving forward complete the classrooms to be used as shelter for those fleeing the war zone in the east.

Vladimir, a refugee from Kramatorsk, is a graduate of The Bear Valley Bible Institute. He spoke in Ivan's absence when I visited Ivano-Frankivsk in April.



20 May was the latest shipment going to Ukraine. Among the buckets, were 37 backpacks for women and babies, 50 hygiene bags, diapers, soft toys, and Quilts handcrafted by the women of The Quilt Patch in Jacksboro and The Maryville Church of Christ. The quilts are earmarked for refugee camps in the mountains.
