


Ukraine Missions Relief Effort Update 25 March 2022

Family Buckets... On the Way

On Wednesday 16 March, the first cargo relief container of "Family Buckets," 372 buckets from East Tennessee, left Columbia TN to a port in Savannah, GA headed to the town of Zalischyky, Poland. The city is located about 180 miles from the Ukrainian Polish Border. This town of about 9000 has received about 4000 refugees. However, the town is only able to provide relief for about 1000 people. So, help was requested, and this is where the first container is going.

Typical of the situation in Poland is this one as reported in an e-mail:

"...In our apartment alone it is about a 700 ft.² apartment which is two bedrooms one bathroom we are currently hosting 10 people. And another apartment we are currently hosting 17 people 11 of them being children."

The generosity of the Polish people is heartwarming.

"...My family has two warehouses in that town that [Zalischyky] were once

manufacturing windows and doors and we have decided since the war started again to turn those into shelters for those who have no family who have nowhere to go and I simply have nowhere to stay... Some of the rooms and the warehouses we are turning into small kitchens and showers so that the people can shower and have their personal space and then other rooms will be turned and some of them are already turned into living space where we will put families on or there's some rooms that are just large enough to just have multiple dad multiple families."

The most needed items, as of today, are personal hygiene, medicines, any bedding like blankets pillows towels, and food. Toys, any box activities for the kids. Small appliances for kitchens; those would be a blessing as well (these would need EU current adaptors to operate). Many of these items, especially large or electrical items, are best purchased locally.



25 March Shipment

A second round of relief was delivered to the drop-off point in Columbia Tennessee, Graymere Church of Christ, with a tentative cargo ship date of 30 March.

This load consisted of 109 "family Buckets" plus several hundred pounds of boxed baby care items, personal hygiene items, clothing, toys, etc.



The community, congregations and individuals from across the region continue to generously support relief efforts: The Kingston Church of Christ with students from Kingston High School; the Helen Street Church of Christ, Fayetteville, NC; the Stockton Baptist Church, Loudon, TN; the Mountain View Missionary Baptist Church, Sevierville, TN; and many individuals continue to give support. The reach has been tremendous with monetary support received from Congregations as far away as Michigan. There are not sufficient words to express the generosity of everyone who has answered the cry for help.
