We still have 8 children waiting for a sponsor & many more who could be put on the waitlist. Without a sponsor most cannot attend school. Sponsoring 1 child costs \$160 for 1 year or \$40 a quarter. It was February 2002. I was on a plane headed to Haiti on a medical mission trip. The poverty overwhelmed me and because living in the USA, we are so fortunate to have whatever we have. Yes, we have poverty, but not to the level of this country. I came home with a changed heart.

Our days started out by going to the clinic site after breakfast. Hundreds of people came seeking medical attention. We were staffed with one doctor, three nurses and nine assistants. When we finished for the day, we headed back to our home base to prepare for the next day.

One of my fondest memories was one night when I couldn't sleep, so I walked out onto the veranda and noticed how big the stars were. It was beautiful and amazing. Another memory is seeing how happy the people were in the midst of all of their lives. Even though they had very little materials, they were filled with joy.

As I reflect, I found myself loving the people there and loving the people who were part of the team. I thank God for touching and changing my heart.


