DID YOU KNOW?

Haiti, is a small country in the Caribbean Sea that includes the western third of the island of Hispaniola. It is slightly smaller than the state of Maryland. Current estimate population is 12,257,000. The capital is Port-au Prince.

Haiti, whose population is almost entirely descended from African slaves, won independence from France in 1804, making it the <u>second country in the Americas</u>, after the US, to free itself from colonial rule. However, over the past centuries,

economic, political and social difficulties as well as a number of natural disasters have beset Haiti with chronic poverty and other serious problems. Haiti's government is a republic with two legislative houses (Senate [30]; Chamber of Deputies [99].

Right now Haiti is in chaos with much gang violence! Haiti's unpopular current Prime Minister, Ariel Henry is in Puerto Rico and has agreed to resign once a transitional government is in place. Food is scarce.

OUR MISSION

Friends of the People of Haiti is a non-profit Christian group established in 1989 in order to broaden our vision of church by building a relationship of prayer and friendship with the people of St. Anne's Parish in Trouin, Haiti. Our focus is to foster awareness of the plight of the Haitian people as well as to share our resources by providing regular financial support to the parish. St. Anne's Parish in Trouin, Haiti was established in 1924 and has one parish church and ten outlaying chapels, a primary school and a secondary school.
