Mostly, I'm reassured by the actions of the Haiti CPR (Covid-19 Prevention Response) program spreading information of the prevention of Covid-19 throughout Haiti including our friends in Trouin. (see related article) Their efforts have been extraordinary in many ways, but the speedy cooperation and

cohesive teamwork of these organizations to aid the greater good has encouraged me and extremely impressed me. My heart is filled with pride, comfort and hope.

However.....

The reality is that the doctors in Haiti are not expecting the peak of the disease to be realized for several weeks yet, and struggles of this virus are real and only multiplied several-fold by the hazards of daily life in Haiti Just imagine a household of 4-6 people trying to social distance in a 10 x 12 one room hut. Just imagine no indoor plumbing. Imagine trying to wash hands when soap / sanitizer and water are scarce and expensive. Imagine extreme shortages of food and other necessities (toilet paper doesn't even make the list). Imagine no electricity – no television – no computers for Zoom meetings or school lessons. Imagine loosing what income you had selling mangos at the market when told to quarantine. Life in Haiti is hard, especially with these conditions.

Please continue to pray that our loving God will embrace us all with strength, courage and peace and gratitude for those living saints working the Haiti CPR program providing hope.

I often end my messages with "Haiti hugs" because to me, the hugs from my Haitian brothers and sisters are full of sincere warmth and love. I carry them with me across the miles and hope that those feelings sustain you all as well until we can hug in person once again.

SUSTAINING PLEDGES


Hopefully in the last several days each of you will have received either an email or letter requesting your prayerful consideration to become a sustaining FOPH

OUR MISSION

Friends of the People of Haiti is a non-profit Christian group established in 1989 in order to broaden our vision of church by building a relationship of prayer and friendship with the people of St. Anne's Parish in Trouin, Haiti. Our focus is to foster awareness of the plight of the Haitian people as well as to share our resources by providing regular financial support to the parish. St. Anne's Parish in Trouin, Haiti was established in 1924 and has one parish church and ten outlaying chapels, a primary school and a secondary school.
