Most families in the areas of Trouin, live in one room with dirt floors, no electricity, no running water, no indoor plumbing and very little food to eat. The families make difficult sacrifices to afford to send children to school. Jobs and opportunities for income are extremely scarce. Now, add the commonplace fear of kidnappings and other violent gang activities. This paints a very different picture of "normalcy".

Friends of the People of Haiti is a non-profit Christian group established in 1989 in order to broaden our vision of church by building a relationship of prayer and friendship with the people of St. Anne's Parish in Trouin, Haiti. Our focus is to foster awareness of the plight of the Haitian people as well as to share our resources by providing regular financial support to the parish. St. Anne's Parish in Trouin, Haiti was established in 1924 and has one parish church and ten outlaying chapels, a primary school and a secondary school.

FOPH WORK MISSION FEBRUARY 23 - MARCH 4, 2021

Once again we were unable to travel to Haiti in person due to COVID-19 and the political unrest in Haiti. We followed the same format as we did in 2020, sending money for supplies, wages, and food. Our ever so faithful interrupters and workers under the direction of Father Charles carried on the work of repairing houses and interviewing our sponsor children.



We hired three interpreters as our liaisons and supervisors and sent the funds for supplies and wages through Father Charles. Three work teams repaired eight houses, St. Theresa's Chapel, and St. Anne's School! We

required and received before and after photos of the properties. The team interviewed 81 of the 85 sponsor students and waitlisted students. They sent photos and the student letters to Mary, our SAC coordinator, by WhatsApp and email. It worked well but we missed being in person with our friends in Haiti and working with them.
