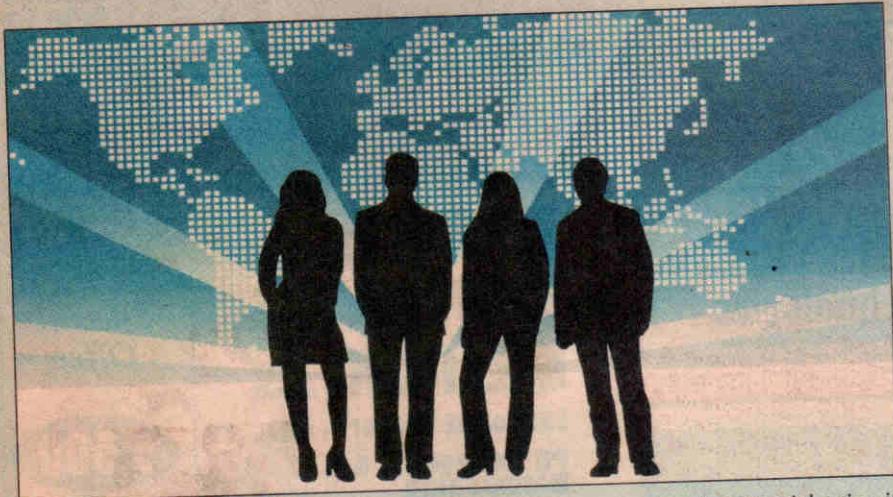

One of the most endearing characteristics of the word success is that it has no clear definition. Sure, the dictionary states a literal meaning for it, but the parameters of success are different for each individual, thus making it both an eluding and engaging concept. For many, success is the completion of a target, an achievement of what one had set out to do. But there are others who believe, success is nothing but a synonym for happiness; doing what makes one happy rather than pursuing goals in search of happiness. Could success then be the eternal conflict between the heart and mind? Doing what you want or wanting what you do?

"For me success is achieving my goals. Set targets, try hard to get there, and if I manage to accomplish the task, then I consider myself successful," says Roshan Matharu, a student of Khalsa College. What about intangible achievements, such as one's relationship with family or emotional growth? Does one set targets for them as well? "You do need to assess your emotional quotient from time to time," replies Matharu, adding, "But it really is a matter of how you look at the role of emotions in your life. For me, I would rather pursue material achievements."

While it may make sense to

measure your success by material gains, it can also breed a spirit of unhealthy competition, making people adopt unscrupulous means in their endeavor to achieve what they desire. Moreover, rivalries can take ugly turns, one may go overboard in their eagerness to pip someone for the post, and all sorts of undesirable consequences can arise. Do the ends justify the means? "Certainly not," replies accounts student Harsh Bafna, "Distinguishing between right and wrong is more important than the mere achievement of your goals. I may want a lot of money, but if it has been garnered through incorrect means, it will take away from my sense of achievement. Thus, I look at success as doing something you will not regret later or look back at with the thought, 'what if?'"

Then, there are those who believe that success is not about what you achieve, how much money you have or what your status is in society. For them success is not a destination, but a journey. "I look at success as the realisation of my potential. Whenever I feel that I have reached a certain level, I raise the bar higher, and this way I continually strive to become a better person," explains Venance Roche. One advantage of this mind set is that it eliminates the complacency factor. Often, once a goal is achieved, one often tends to take things lightly from there on and rest on the laurels.

When I tried to tell my child about Gandhiji & his freedom struggle, **26** the response is the same: "Oh: please stop it! We hear enough of him at school." So much has been written about the freedom struggle till the subject has become stale for children who did not grow up with it. But for me, it was so much part of my growing up that I wish to share it with my readers. The first glimpse I got of Gandhiji was when I was in **III** form (Brent & Elms) when they passed through Mellore to Madras to attend a plenary session of Congress in 1942. People started breaking coconuts & singing songs. He was more than God for most of the waiting people who indiscriminately waited along the Railway Track.

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The past five decades have shown so many bitter political & nonpolitical & divide explosions for the sake of an pluralistic society; but there is an urgent need to reinvigorate peaceful methods of dialogue & communication (in keeping with Gandhi's Thinking)

If all the creation has a common origin & all the people, whatever party they belong to, ultimately reach the same kabrashaans. Where is the scope for mounting of misunderstanding? It lies within ourselves only. If we could only teach our children that the stability of our neighborhoods, schools, state or country & indeed the entire world hinges on our ability to discuss our feelings rather than those of violence, we might be able to ensure

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a safe world for our children or children's children

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to

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The only way of doing this is to show to our children how it is to be done. Every parent who has ever struck a child knows the hollows feeling it brings even though it buys some sort of obedience or submission only for a while & not of a permanent nature.

The truth about dealing forcefully with others is no different - we may think we have won now - it is only a temporary solution. It only tightens insecurity; insecurity breeds fear and fear leads to panic & loss of control.

While at times clearly lacking good moral leadership, the heroism & endurance of the average Indian, despite his limitations, is probably our only hope for a bright future. His simple forms of communication with neighbors & personal circles might still save our country.

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The way forward may not be

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not easy but fraught with dangers

like a Separate Telengana Movement (+)

Then differences like this drove people apart

If their temperatures rise, it is easy to believe

that a rapid solution lies at the end of a

dagger but not a dialogue. Yet, we,

as peace lovers, like Mahatma Gandhi ji,

must resist the temptation for crime &

think otherwise in calm & cool atmosphere.

There is a way out paved with negotiations,

understanding & the strength that comes from

a determination to achieve success through

friendly dialogue.

Don't look around for peacemakers,

they are within us & not outside our

body & within our reach only. Best of luck

This enables him to perform a daily chore of
Gayathree in a list of promises like:
(as described in detail in the next schedule)

This regents to be renewed every 12 years and
also at important events like Sravasti Parvini
and Sankranti Festivals on which days
a male has to perform Tapaswari to his
ancestors, three generations back and
both from father's side as well as mother's side.

Similar tapaswari to be performed on the days
before performing father's mother's annual ceremony
after their departure from this world. Then
the person will make up to repeat all the promises

before changing your Yagnopavithram.

Satpatha Brahmanas, was a descendant of this Bhavadevaja Maharshi. Also 'Bhardwaj'. Was a host of Dasavatha (810 Bhavatha). When he was enroute to meet Lord Rama to persuade him to return to Ayodhya.

Bhardwaj had a debate with ~~Parrugo~~ about the Caste Systems, who reconciled with the thought that there is no difference between members of different castes. He also proposed "यजुषोऽस्त्राय" as to be performed by Dasavatha to beget a son to rule his kingdom.

Bhardwaj's Vedic mantras were placed in the Sixth Mandala of Rig Veda written by Veda Vyasa.

Dharma Sootraas & Shrauta Sootraas were written by Bharadvaja & their manuscripts were in Pandu Script & is available in Bombay Visva Vidyalaya.
