#### Meet Cornelia Riedel


My name is Cornelia Riedel and I was born and raised in Germany which at that time had barely any western riding and so I took dressage lessons. In 2000 I leased a Western Horse and the owner of that horse bought an Appaloosa Mare who was going to change my whole life.

High Hand Rosie was a 3-year old unhandled filly that would let nobody but me close to her, so within one week I was the proud owner of an Appaloosa mare. Little did I know that she would rock my world, literally and figuratively speaking. Yes, I fell off that horse a lot during my first try in training a horse, but in 2001 we actually completed the Bronze Western Riding Badge in Germany

In 2003 I immigrated to the USA and "Honey" was shipped to me as soon as I had found a boarding facility. Due to personal reason I was not able to do any showing or breeding until I had moved to Texas and in 2009 I finally found an Appaloosa stallion whose dam and sire were Appaloosa. I was surprised at the amount of Appaloosa stallions standing here where only one of the parent was an Appaloosa.

"Honey" made my joy complete with the birth of my stallion "Ima Rockin Secret" in 2010. Unfortunately due to an accident as a yearling, he is only on a light riding schedule, but is always willing to help with ponying any of the mares on the facility or helping me cut any trees since I have this weird aversion against ladders.

In 2013 I was able to breed "Honey" with an Appaloosa Cutting stallion and my other Appaloosa Mare "Belle" with my

stallion. But again it was not meant to be and "Belle" had a dystocia and had to have an emergency C-Section which resulted in a dead-born filly and the mare needed several Plasma and Blood Transfusions.

To make matters worse, "Honey's" foal "Smart Rockin Rosie" decided to try and jump into a door at the age of 5 months and broke her front leg and was on stall rest for 4 months. Constrained with those medical bills, I was unable to do anything but work and work some more. I was interested in starting to do some showing later that year, but meeting several members of the ApHC who were not very nice neither helpful, so I decided to not go down that road.



- Bids should include the stallions full name
- · Bid amount must be in US dollars
- Starting bid is \$100.00
- Bidding will be in \$25.00 increments
- You do not need to be an ICAA member to bid on a stallion
- All bids are final and CANNOT BE WITHDRAWN
- All monies from the winning bids must be sent to the ICAA office or paid via Paypal within 10 days of the auctions end
- Winning bidders and stallion owners will be notified of winning bids when the auction ends
- Stallion owners will send the winning bidders a contract. Bidders will be bound by the stallion owners contract and any and all mare care and/or chute fees shall be payable to the stallion owner.



#### **ICAA Programs**

Nominate your ICAA horses and Youth for the *Open Show Point Program* and earn points for year-end awards!

Enroll your trail horses in the **Saddle Logging Program** with rewards for hours enjoying your partner in the saddle or driving! Solid Breeding Stock horses may be enrolled.

**Production Achievement Awards** are given to mares that produce five (5) colored ICAA registered foals and to stallions that produce fifteen (15) colored ICAA registered foals. Open to Breeding Stock mares and stallions.

**The ICAA Distance Program** - Earn year-end awards for challenging miles with your equine partner in Endurance and/or Competitive Trail Riding competition! Solid Breeding Stock horses may be enrolled.

Find information on these programs on the ICAA website, along with all of the necessary forms and rules! These programs can be paid for online and the forms scanned and emailed to ICAA!

REMINDER: Starting January 1, 2017, ALL incoming horses from other registries will be required to have 5-Panel N/N test results AND have DNA Typing on file with AGI! If a horse has already been DNA Typed with the ApHC, those results MUST be on file with AGI, or the horse must be typed again through AGI. There is a discount for current ICAA Members to do DNA Typing (\$35) through AGI and may be easier to do it again than trying to get the results from the ApHC (\$10) and sent to AGI for them to enter in their database (\$10). There are also discounted packages with AGI for current ICAA Members for 5-Panel with DNA Typing included, 5-Panel with DNA Typing and SCID included, and Color and Pattern Packages. Use the form available on the ICAA website Forms Page for these discounts. You do not need your membership number to send in the test samples so proceed to submitting these to AGI (instructions are on the form). You will need to be a current member to receive the results but do not need for your membership to be completed prior to sending samples to AGI. At ICAA we believe that when you pay for testing, these are YOUR tests and if you are a current member we send you the results as soon as we receive them from AGI. You pay AGI directly with the form and sample.

ICAA makes zero dollars off of these tests.

Our partnership and discounted packages with AGI are 100% a member benefit.

#### REMINDER

As an ICAA member you'll get reduced registration fees, reduced transfer fees, reduced testing fees, and other fees at reduced rates. You can file your ICAA Stallion Reports for free if filed by Dec 31st of the breeding year. You can enroll your Appaloosa or Youth in the Open Show Point Program, The ICAA Distance Program, and/or enroll in the Trial Logging Program, and you can receive Production Achievement Awards for your mares producing 5 (five) colored ICAA registered foals or for your stallions producing 15 (fifteen) colored ICAA registered foals. You can advertise your ICAA registered stallions for free in the Stallion Showcase, as well as advertise your ICAA registered horses for sale in the Sale File, also for free.

You do not need to own an Appaloosa to be a member and support ICAA.

Registrations and other work can also be paid for and submitted online

if paperwork is quality scanned and emailed!
