Papi Rae Ranch Derrick Lopez

Meet Papi Rae Ranch (PRR) located in Naples, FL. Derrick Lopez and Allyson Lopez are the founders and owners of the ranch.

PRR is an upcoming ranch, focusing on Appaloosa breeding. They will be standing the ICAA F6/ApHC GAP 6 stallion PAPA Nuksays Smoke, who is EE, aa, LP/LP, PATN1/PATN1. "Smoke" has descendants from Blue Creek Appaloosas. With him, PRR will continue to assist in advancing toward the ICAA purebred division and the ApHC GAP program.

PRR also has a perlino stallion, Platinum Zip, that they acquired out of Canada and will start working on cream color genetics to grow into the ICAA purebred division and the ApHC GAP program, since they have found that there are not a lot of cream horses with multiple generations of Appaloosas but are very desired by Appaloosa enthusiasts. They also have a gold champagne quarter horse mare, Spark of Awesome, who is a descendent of National Cutting Horse Association champion Shining Spark on her dam's side. She will help bring the champagne color genetics into the Appaloosa breed as well.

Derrick was dealing with massive amounts of rain in mid-June to try and get their horses cleaned up for photos, so please excuse any dirt!

Derrick's aunt is a Paint horse breeder and the owner of Hill Cross Ranch in Belle Fourche, SD. His uncle is a team roper that went to the Las Vegas National Finals three times. He also spent the summers in Tucson, AZ with his uncle riding his quarter horses.

Derrick and Allyson always wanted horses and in August 2023 they were searching for their perfect companions. They found "Smoke" at Primed N Painted Acres in Hill City, MN, and just couldn't pass him up. They started looking for Allyson's horse and found an LP/LP, PATN1/PATN1 mare at Double M Bar Ranch. While searching for these, they realized that with the land they have, they can start their own breeding program. From there they started to learn genetics, network, and find horses for their breeding program.



FORWARDING MAIL ISSUES

At the end of November, ICAA moved from west TX to southeast OK. Right before leaving, change of address cards were given to the local Post Office. Since then, things have gone from bad to worse. A second set of change of address cards were put in at the local Post Office in OK after the first ones were canceled for unknown reasons. Long story short, both the local Post Office in OK and the old one in TX have tried their best to get this right, but we are all at our wits end and realize it will not be fixed. We did leave address labels with the postmaster of the old Post Office with the new address. 
ONLINE PAYMENTS

This is the perfect time to enroll in the ICAA Horsemanship Program! If sold, time goes with the horse for the rest of their lives with just a one-time enrollment fee of \$15.

At every bend - you'll change your path to keep horses in it...


All for just a few more hoofbeats on your heart.
