

**NAPLES RESERVE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.**  
**PARKING POLICY UPDATE**

March 12, 2025

The NRHOA Parking Policy is hereby amended to prohibit overnight parking at mail kiosks as the previous rules unintentionally allowed this exception to the general rule which restricts on-street overnight parking. Residents driving automobiles or golf carts to mail kiosks must be present at the kiosk (or in the case of the kiosk near Paws Awhile Dog Park present at that dog park) for the duration of the time that the vehicle is parked. Reading mail in the car while occupying a kiosk parking space is discouraged.

Owners and authorized Renters may obtain permission for their specified visitors to park overnight for specific periods of time to address parking space shortages on their properties. The following rules will apply to obtain this permission:

1. Only an Owner or an Authorized Renter can request permission. No guests or any other visitors can request permission.
2. Permission will only be granted for vehicles of Owners, Authorized Renters or registered guests or family members.
3. Unregistered overnight visitors cannot access the parking allowed under this process.
4. Only vehicles otherwise allowed overnight in NR are eligible. All provisions of the Prohibited Vehicle rules continue to apply.
5. The applicable vehicles must be registered with the Property Management Office. The Property Management Office will record the name of the Owner/ Authorized Renter, the name of the eligible registered guest/family member, and the make/model/license plate of the vehicle. A registration paper which indicates the aforementioned information, and the approved start and end dates, will be provided by the Property Management Office. This registration paper must be kept visible on the dashboard of the vehicle while it is parked. There is a three-day maximum for each registration. There is no limit on registrations.
6. Parking will either be in Kids Cove or the Island Club. Parking in any other community parking spaces under this privilege is prohibited.

Nothing in this Parking Policy Update is intended to modify parking rules and restrictions that apply to prohibited, stored or inoperable, recreational vehicles, and so on, or other parking rules otherwise in effect for the community.
