My Mission Story

Recently, I had the opportunity to spend a week in Harlan, Kentucky with my grandson as a volunteer with the Appalachia Service Project. This faith-based organization has been in operation for over 50 years and is dedicated to repairing and replacing homes in Central Appalachia. The volunteers are primarily young people under the age of 18 and older and dedicated group leaders, some who have been coming for years. Our group was from Guardian Angels (my grandson's church), Akron. We had a group leader, a younger woman, and four students ages14-18 on my team.

We were sent out, with a manual in hand, to a home that needed a porch replaced. We demolished the existing porch and constructed a new one, starting with digging 10 two foot deep holes through concrete and bricks. Thank goodness the rest of the project went better.

With ASP one of the goals is to develop a relationship with the family you work for. Our young mother suffered from extreme anxiety, but on Tuesday, she was able to come out and meet with us and for the rest of the week, she spent a good bit of time cheering us on. In the morning we packed enough lunch for ourselves and the family and she and her daughter joined us every day. We got to learn quite a bit about her family and some of the hardships they were trying to get through. On Friday, they had their electricity shut off. Fortunately, they were able to come up with the money to have it restored.

I have to say this was a hard week. Some of the work was physically demanding and it was hot. At the end of the day, we returned filthy and sweaty to our dormitory type housing where 50 women shared 3 showers, cafeteria food that makes school lunches look like 5 star dining, and cleaning chores. We accessed the dormitory via a loading dock where we stepped over the homeless who spend most of the day sleeping on the cement.

Then you deal with your own assumptions and judgements. Our family did not get up until very late in the morning including the man of the house who appeared healthy but for whatever reason did not offer to help. Perhaps an illness not visible or simply embarrassment kept him secluded, we could only guess. There are few jobs in the area now that the coal mines have almost all closed. The terrain does not lend itself to building of factories and the jobs that are available provide just enough income to remove them from government assistance but not enough to live on. Yes, it is easy to judge, but none of us know where we might be given a different set of circumstances.

Although it was hard work during the day, each evening everyone gathered together to sing and share their experiences. One of the most rewarding parts of the week was listening to the young people share their Christian faith with the families they worked for and each other.
