Pope Leo's first words to

the crowd after being elected pope.
"My dear brothers and sisters, this is the first greeting of the risen Christ, the good shepherd who gave his life for God's flock," he said, praying that Christ's peace would enter



people's hearts, their families and "the whole earth".

"The peace of the risen Lord, he said, is "a peace that is unarmed and disarming." Signaling strong continuity with the papacy of Pope Francis, Pope Leo told the crowd that God "loves all of us unconditionally" and that the church must be open to everyone. "We are all in God's hands," he said, so "without fear, united, hand in hand with God and with each other, let us go forward."
