FR. FRITZ'S HOMILY NOTES FOR OCTOBER 27TH

For a blind beggar Bartimaeus has a pretty good lot in life. He has a spot at the gates of Jericho, an important crossroads. Many pilgrims would have passed by him on the way to Jerusalem. No doubt full of pious sentiment they would have spared him some coins. Indeed begging is so lucrative that the city of Canton has put up signs at the most prominent spots encouraging people to instead give to local charities.

With this mind set we see how Jesus challenges and Bartimaeus responds with faith. Jesus calls on him to leave his place to give up his livelihood to encounter Jesus, and Bartimaeus heeds Jesus. He leaps up and tosses away his cloak. He doesn't want to be a beggar anymore. He wants to see. It's worth risking his livelihood to be healed. What would we risk to follow after Christ? What does Christ call us to leave behind?

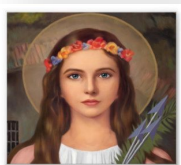

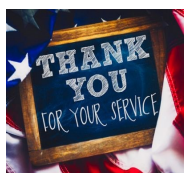
