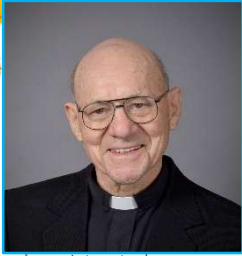

Hope: A Beacon of Light in the Storm

Hope is a common and universal quality of mind in our human existence. A desire for something good to happen. Hope is spoken of in the future, based on faith and in some ways similar but different. Faith is conviction. Hope is expectation. In our human nature consider the peach tree; our faith is like the root and our hope is the fruit. Beyond these general, ordinary concepts there is a higher, spiritual, Christian Hope, often called Biblical Hope. It is beyond mere optimism or wishful thinking.

Biblical Hope is a conviction that God is in charge and there is a divine plan which will ultimately be fulfilled. Pope Francis proclaimed the theme of Jubilee Year 2025 "Pilgrims of Hope" and called hope "a light in the night." We will discuss Biblical Hope and reflect on how we can apply and use it in our Christian lives and help others to face the future. Romans 8:24 "For in hope we were saved."

Pastor Emeritus of St. Paul, North Canton, Fr. McKarns pastored St. Barbara Church for 9 years. Retired in 2000, he traveled 10 years preaching missions in many states and giving parish missions and retreats for priests, deacons, sisters, and parish groups. He authored several books on liturgy, scripture, homiletics, and self-help topics and writes for religious publications like *Living Faith*.
