Dear parishioners,

June 6th, 2026

My classmates and I have finished our first half of study and presumably passed our classes so now we have begun two more classes: “The Juridic Structure of the Sacrament of Matrimony” and “Sacramental Law.”

Our professor for the marriage class really likes Latin terms and one thing that he has emphasized is that Canon 1055 calls marriage a *consortium*. That word is the combination of two Latin words *con* (which means “with”) and *sors* (which means “dice”). So marriage is a “with-dice.” What does that mean? Does it mean that your spouse is an erratic person and on any given day it's a gamble whether you are waking up next to a grumpy bear or a happy golden retriever? Does it mean that we go into a marriage hoping for the best but whether it lasts or not is left up to chance and out of our control? No! Instead, *consortium* recognizes that, yes, the course of our lives is not completely in our control and, yes, it's anybody's guess what joys and sorrows we will experience. Life is indeed a roll-of-the-die, **and** through marriage you commit to rolling-your-die **with** someone else. In marriage the husband and wife are committing to put together their lot in life, the result of their roll. On their wedding day the man and woman don't know what is going to happen to them throughout their life, and they commit to going through their life together.

Here's two questions for you, “When did the roll-of-the-dice turn out way better than you could imagine in your marriage?” “How did you and your spouse stick together and support each other when the roll-of-the-dice bitterly disappointed you?” Think about those questions and talk about them with your family and friends.
