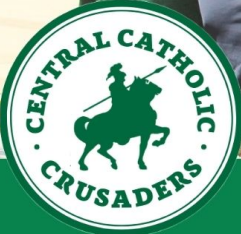

Dear Parishioners,

This past week we discussed the role of the Vicar Forane. He is a priest who is entrusted (among other things) with the responsibility to care for the other priests in his region. One of Fr. Kevin's many jobs is to be one of the Vicars Forane in our county, and I think he does a good job of looking after other priests and supporting them in their challenges.

As we were discussing the Vicar Forane, we also discussed how when a priest is encountering a challenge in his ministry and identity he is often wary of coming forward and seeking help. As we reflected on this, one student suggested that the reason priests don't open up about their problems is that we priests don't want to be seen as failures. Someone else asked, "what is more important, to be successful or to be faithful?" I think that is a very good question. I think that when a priest is struggling, opening up about it and seeking help may indeed cause him to be labeled as a failure, AND it is the only way that he has to be faithful to his calling.

What about the rest of us? Would we rather be known as a couple that is successful or a couple that is faithful despite challenges and difficulties? Do we care more about the success of our parish or that we are faithful to God's will? Is looking good in front of others more important or do we prefer to do what God wants?

As we celebrate Independence Day may we all be free from seeking success and free to be faithful to God.



Last fall Bishop Bonnar asked me to take on the role of Diocesan Pastoral Associate to assist Fr. David Misbrener in re-establishing his leadership at the Basilica of St. John the Baptist and St. Peter Parish in Downtown Canton. This was in addition to my role within our Office of the Pastor leadership. Fr. Misbrener was a joy to work with and I was sorry to see him step out to take a leave of absence. He is a dutiful son and knew his parents, in frail health, were his priority as well as his own health issues that needed to be addressed.

Our Fr. Kevin was then assigned as Pro-Tem Administrator until Fr. Brian Smith was assigned, shortly after Easter, as Administrator. Fr. Brian spent time at St. John and St. Peter during his Seminary years, so he was warmly welcomed home.

The past six months has moved their parish from Covid protocol to full and active participation of the Assembly. The return of ushers, Offertory gifts brought to the Altar and the genuine welcoming of parishioners at the doors all breathe new hope for this downtown parish. Their women's group is redesigning itself and that is something I would like to introduce to our parishes as well. It is called Martha and Mary Ministry.

You will read more about it over the next couple of weeks.

As of July 1, I will be back with St. Francis of Assisi and Holy Family Parishes, marking office hours between the two sites. I will be of assistance to Fr. Brian if needed, and Fr. Kevin will continue as his mentor. It takes many hands to keep our Diocese strong and we are privileged to help. That said, it is great to be fully back "home".
