What is Emergency Use Authorization (EUA)?

The FDA can issue an EUA during a public health emergency for vaccines that have been proven safe and effective in large clinical trials and when certain criteria have been met

Tested by 110,000+ people

The COVID-19 vaccines have been tested the same way as any other vaccines, but faster



The vaccines are given in one or two shots
They are believed to be effective 1-2 weeks
after receiving the final dose

The vaccines will not give you COVID-19
None of the vaccines use the virus that causes COVID-19

of clinical trial volunteers were from racial and ethnic minority populations

Research is ongoing and expanding to additional groups, such as children under the age of 16

Most people experience few, or only mild, side effects


After any vaccine, you may have symptoms like a fever. This is a normal sign that your immune system is learning how to recognize and fight the virus

Father Nick Shori

Memorial Mass April 20, 2021

Homily by Fr. John Jerek

Today many of us are feeling the pinch of time as we recognize that it has been five years since Father Nick Shori's death. Still he remains greatly loved – our presence here today testifies to that.

When Nick comes to mind, most of us smile. I remember a friend and colleague whose laugh was contagious, and how when he would laugh, he would often start clapping his hands. A few weeks after his death, I found myself clapping my hands as I laughed. I said to myself "Oh no. Heeee's here!"

Some of you recall a priest who loved his parishioners, a dedicated son and a devoted brother. You remember the spirited announcer at the Springfield Tigers football games, an energetic police chaplain, a man who laughed easily, often broke the mold, loved the Dallas Cowboys and was a picky eater. You remember the pastor who led you in building your church. A man who made you feel at home. He was hardly a conformist. When he chose the readings for his own funeral some five years ago, none of those readings was typical....none of them found in the normal assortment of readings found in the Order of Christian funerals....imagine that! He went outside the box, as he often did. Some of us wondered if he knew that there even was "a box." He took those around him to the edge.

And he never forgot about those on the edge. The hungry, the homeless, the disadvantaged – these were always close to him. He spent many years as a hospital chaplain at St. Elizabeth and taught several courses in Mercy's School of Nursing. He understood the human need for healing in a wide variety of circumstances – from the patient in the hospital bed, to the parishioner facing terminal illness, and of course his own final journey among us. *Thus it was that he lived in the hope of a better world as he constantly learned about our fractured world, why it was fractured, and Who alone could heal it.*

How beautifully he brings to life the words of the 25th chapter of Matthew's Gospel, the scene of the final judgement. The King who says "When I was hungry you gave me to eat, when I was thirsty you gave me to drink, when I was a stranger you welcomed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to me." Nick probably would not see these as the standards by which we will one day be judged, but rather as an invitation to open our eyes a bit wider. To see where God's grace can be powerfully present. To see and understand Jesus Christ more deeply.

Contrasting these powerful words from Matthew's are the gentle words of the prophet Micah:

He has told you, O man, what is good, and what the LORD really wants from you: He wants you to carry out justice, to love faithfulness, and to walk humbly before your God.

Another uncomplicated message – simple and direct – rooted in that need we all carry within us as to what is truly important in this life.

To live the words of both passages requires an ardent trust in the Holy Spirit, one of the hallmarks of Father Nicholas Shori's life. He loved the Holy Spirit. He trusted the Holy Spirit. The Spirit's mysterious, unpredictable nature seemed not to unsettle him, but to hold him together. How appropriate that we celebrate today's Mass and that we soon dedicate the sculpture he donated in the heart of spring and in the heart of the Easter season.

Even as we may still mourn our beloved brother in Christ, we rejoice in the presence of the Risen Lord among us. We give thanks for the return of warmth and growth in this part of our world. Nick loved the Easter season and he loved spring.

Like the disciples of the Lord in the Upper Room and like Father Nicholas Shori, we wait for the Holy Spirit to lead us where we need to go....to where we need to look for the Risen Lord...to where we need to find Him.

We recall the words of St. Teresa of Calcutta – "Never let anything so fill your heart with sorrow that you forget the joy of Christ Risen"

Father Nicholas Shori never forgot the joy of Christ Risen. And because of him and others like him, we pray that we shall never forget that joy that shatters death and brings us hope to last a lifetime.
