ARCHDIOCESE FOR THE MILITARY

Come to the Table! Fr. Jay Clarke and Deacon Brook Benedict will walk us through a Mass, explaining what is behind the rituals that we take for granted. If you have never heard Fr. Jay speak, you are in for a treat. Certainly no pressure on him...however at a St. Therese Mass on Super Bowl weekend, he received applause! And it wasn't because they were happy he stopped talking!

I could not be more excited!

Let me explain why we are doing this dry mass. The USCCB (United States Council of Catholic Bishops) has called for a Eucharistic Revival for the next three years. If you are reading this, you understand that coming to Mass weekly is important for your faith in God. Let's be honest, sometimes Mass begins and ends and we think, wait - what? Our minds can easily roll into our to-do list or our worries or whether our favorite team is playing this Sunday. It happens we are human. So the purpose of a dry mass (note: a dry mass is NOT a real mass) is to explain things like...why does the priest add water into the wine?...the bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ because the priest has the "magic" to do that, right?...and many other questions and misconceptions. Many of us have come to Mass for years without knowing why we do what we do. This is not only an opportunity to understand our faith more, it is an invitation to know Christ in a different way.
