Talking to Pattie one day as I was contemplating retirement, she asked me to keep in mind doing something with the church when I was no longer working a full-time job and this past winter I took her up on the invitation and I am now volunteering as Religious Education Coordinator,

continuing to grow in faith as I witness the beautiful spirit of each and every one of you.

WHY DO YOU FEEL IT'S IMPORTANT TO TALK ABOUT GOD TO OUR CHILDREN AND TO OTHERS?

Kelly Green, Catechist, Kindergarten & 1st Grade

I am new to teaching the Catholic religion to our littlest parishioners. Three years ago, Mickie Richards had told me that there was a need for a Kindergarten-1st grade teacher. Since my son, Will, would be in my class, I told her that I would teach. I had no idea how to teach our faith to little ones. I began to think about how I was taught at that age. Of course, I was given a very firm foundation in faith being raised by my devout mother and father. I also had good examples watching my seven older siblings growing their faith. In fact, my oldest brother and sister are my Godparents. Wanting to deepen our faith, my parents send my siblings and I to school right here at St. Clement from 1 to 8th grade, my love and understanding of the Catholic faith grew. Whether I learned my love of hymns from Sr. Christina Marie or how to pray from Mrs. Brediger, or learned love and acceptance of all from Mrs. Dyrlund, all of the teachers I had there molded and shaped my idea of what it is to be a good Catholic. Many times people don't realize that they are a guide for others. When I returned to Holy Family Parish, I saw many people share their faith in many ways. Anytime someone gives of their time, talent or treasure, others take notice. They strive to be more like the people who are leading by example. Seeing all of my fellow PSR teachers' passion for our kids to learn Catholicism serves as inspiration for me on my teaching journey. St. Augustine once said, "Each of us had something to learn from the others and something to teach in return." Being the teacher of these little ones has not only taught me more about my faith, but it has taught me more about myself. There are weeks when I am not sure how I will fill the time with activities that will keep their minds engaged and learning about God's love. With prayer and the determination to share the faith that my Mom and Dad started, my siblings enriched and my teachers fostered, I hope I give these kids the love of their faith to last for the rest of their lives.

Andy Cregan, Catechist, 5th and 6th Grades

For those of you who don't know me, my name is Andy Cregan, my wife's name is Nancy, and we have 4 children—Nicolette, Melissa, Andrew and Ethan. All four of my children attended catechism at St. Clement/Holy Family Parish from 1st through 12th grade.

I began helping wit this program when my oldest, Nicki, began 1st grade and now she is 27. I began teaching because of the role my Catholic education (8 years at Holy Cross Grade School, Euclid, Ohio and 4 years at St. Joseph High School, Cleveland, Ohio) played in molding me. I also felt that if I was sending four of my children through the catechism program of the Catholic Church, then I should be willing to help and participate as well.

When I was in grade school, we lived 100 yards from the Catholic Church and grade school. Our neighborhood was mostly Catholic, however many of my friends attended the public school. My mother for many years taught, what we then called PSR or CCD, which was always either on Monday or Wednesday evenings, and she always would take me with her to help. I remember she taught 7th and 8th grade over the years. When classes started up each year the students had quite the attitude, there were places they would rather be, but it would never fail that after a couple classes they lost the attitudes and willfully participated. My mother has always had a way of getting the message across without pleading or demanding responses, rather she got the message across through interaction and participation. She would say you are much more likely to remember a lesson that you enjoyed.

I have used this as a model and try to make class enjoyable, something the children want to participate in. There are so many outside influences fighting for these children's time today. My goal has always been taken from a manual I received at a seminar when I first started teaching, and that is to further each child's love of God and increase their understanding of the practice of their faith, their conversation, and participation. I am not overly concerned with the ability of students to recite verses from the bible, although I encourage they take time and read it, rather I am more concerned they are given examples and live it. I always tell them people will know you are Christian by your actions and your love. Thank you for allowing me to participate and learn with your children. And oh yeah, have a doughnut while we are at it.

Barb Genetín, Catechist, Junior High and High School

I think most people can agree that a faith life is a never ending process.

Mine began with two great parents that baptized and raised me as a Catholic. They were very devout, even through the loss of a 16 year old son, my brother, when I was 12. That event certainly made an impact and influenced me to "keep the faith" even during secularist college. I was truly blessed to meet a man (my husband, Greg) who was entrenched in the faith, if not more, as me. Raising six children can certainly make or break a faith. I'm pretty sure we survived!

I began teaching CCD approximately 16 years ago, mostly at the high school level with other various parent/teacher volunteers. One of the highlights during those early years was to attend a youth retreat at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio. It was there during a mass of over 1000 students and chaperones in a prayerful, reflective moment the priest asked for anyone who wished to help youth should stand up. As I was praying and eyes closed, I stood up believing there were many others doing the same. When I opened my eyes and looked around, I found myself and one other person the only ones standing in this sea of people. I was mortified! My mind was screaming to sit down, but I knew I couldn't without embarrassing myself. I thought "what did I just do??"

From that point on I have been involved with teaching the youth. I believe teaching our youth about the Catholic faith is paramount! The volatility of our culture demands that we as a parish community - the priests, teachers, congregation members and mostly the PARENTS entrust time and effort in forging a strong faith In these young people to be the future of our church. I am committed to doing just that.


