  - *Sample B was asked of ½ of respondents = 392 Jewish adults nationally / 130 Jewish adults in the New York City area.*
  - *An asterisk (\*) in a response category means that less than 0.5% of respondents chose that response category and a dash (–) represents no response.*
  - *“Asked” is the percentage of respondents from each survey population that are asked a question because they meet criteria based on a response to a previous question, meaning not all respondents received that question.*
