

### May 8th -- Zoom Meeting

1. Order -- Meeting was called to order by Chair, Janie Jarrett at 6:36.
2. Minutes -- Secretary, Elaine Warstler read the minutes from the April Dinner/Business Meeting. Justin Garrison made a motion to approve with a second by Janie.
3. Treasurer's Report -- Treasurer, Anita Davolt reported that there is \$3311.96 in the general fund with \$166.61 remaining in the scholarship fund after deducting \$800.00 in scholarships awarded to local HS Seniors.

#### 4. New Business --
