

White Candle (for protection)
Small Mirror
Paper and Pen
Fireproof Bowl
Salt (for protection)

Steps:

Prepare Your Space:

Cleanse with sage. Create a protective circle with salt.

Light the white candle, reciting:

"With courage and light, I stand strong,

Fear is gone, my path is long."
