PACKER FARM TOUR FA

How early should we arrive?

Plan to arrive 10-15 minutes before the scheduled start of your tour. This will give you time to gather your group together and take care of any payments. If you are going to be late please call us (541) 234-4006 and understand that you may have to be placed into a new time bracket.

What should we do when we arrive?

Upon arrival please have your group contact person meet one of our staff before entering the farm. Please wait to unload busses until instructed.

What is your cancellation policy?

In order to adjust our staff we ask for 48 hour notice if you need to cancel your tour. Cancellations made with less than 48 hours will be invoiced for our minimum group rate of \$80.

Can we still come to the farm is it's raining?

Yes! We still do farm tours even if it's sprinkling, some of our activities are even under cover!

In the case of HEAVY rain/storm we may be forced to reschedule your tour.

Who all needs to pay?

1 Teacher/Group Leader per every 10 students is free! All other parents, siblings, staff, and friends are welcome to join the tour for the same price, \$8/person. Aides for students who require a 1:1 ratio are free.

How can we pay?

Payment is expected on or before your tour date. We will send you an invoice after you have confirmed your group size. If additional people wish to join the tour after you have been invoiced please let us know and we will make arrangements for them to pay on site.

What should we wear?

Please wear appropriate outdoor clothing. Be prepared for an outside visit to our working farm.

How long is the tour?

For planning purposes expect 1.5-2 hours at the farm. Your guided tour will take approximately 30 minutes, larger groups may take longer, and then your group is free to enjoy more fun on the farm. The guided tour portion does not include time in the corn maze or picking pumpkins.

Snack & Lunch at the farm?

Limited snacks are available for purchase inside the sales barn. We do not have concessions on site. If you would like to bring a lunch and eat it there, we have a picnic area for you to use.
