Each episode begins with 2-4 crew sitting at the table. We begin by talking about the band, the tour, and the year(s) it took place. **ARTIST** will then be introduced and share their stories and memories.

Leo Rossi will introduce the A,B, and C story throughout each episode – each tour had it's unique set of circumstances. The A story will be of significance to the times they were in and the challenges they faced.

ARTIST PARTICIPATION ARTIST(s) will be asked to participate as schedules allow.





Episode 1: Fleetwood Mac "Rumours" Tour - 1977-78 Before there were cell phones.

A-STORY

Ray Lindsey was Lindsey Buckingham's guitar tech. While in rehearsals, Stevie Nicks was having troubles playing the opening acoustic guitar section on "Go your own way", she was just learning how to play guitar. A frustrated Lindsey Buckingham told Stevie that Ray could play the part better than her, which landed Ray a spot in the band for years to come. We have audio clips of this conversation.

B-STORY

The Crew

The band was on a world tour including Australia, New Zealand and Japan. During this time these countries did not have adequate sound and lighting systems equivalent to that of the United States. The crew, using their ingenuity, devised a plan to lease a Stretch DC-8 Cargo Jet to fly all the sound and lighting equipment to these countries which had never been done before. The crew also devised a plan to sublease the jet to cattle merchants to offset the costs thus generating more profits than the actual tour. As one would imagine, the crew had to deal with a smell that was quite nasty.

C-STORY

Special Guest(s):

Leo and the fellow crew member Rhyno, are left behind at a truck stop, late at night, during the bus trip to next city . With **no cell phones** to call the bus driver, they had employees at a truck stop call state troopers to find the bus and have them turn around, this caused a melt down. The bus driver was finally pulled over by state troopers and turned around to go back to pick them up thus causing devastating delay and possible cancellation in setup for the upcoming show the next day.



Episode 2: Run DMC- "Together Forever" Tour – 1987 Someone Call Security!

A-STORY

During a concert in 1986, a wave of fights and stabbings erupted during a concert at the Long Beach Arena, injuring 39 people and prompting police to storm the arena and shut down the show.

It prompted a quick response for more security measures and thus the beginning of the use of metal detectors. Andre Augustine was the supervisor and his security team put into motion the use of these devices and the tour went on with no further incidents.

B-STORY

The Crew

Andre Augustine was a former NFL player for the NY Jets who found his way into security. During this tour Andre got arrested for taking away counterfeit merchandise from a guy selling on venue property in Philadelphia, the counterfeiter accused Andre of stealing even though he was selling fraudulent merchandise. There was cash in the bags Andre took so the police saw it as theft and this got Andre thrown in the slammer. Why would the police side with an obvious counterfeiter and not security who were protecting the rights of a rap group? Special Guests: Joseph Simmons & Darryl McDaniel



C-STORY

Barrels were placed outside venues for patrons to discard any illegal items not allowed in the building. No warnings were mentioned in the advertisement of these shows so when patrons arrived, that barrel filled with knives, firearms, various pills, marijuana, etc. The repercussions of getting caught with these items inside the venue was to be dealt with by local law enforcement.

The pressure from promoters and the cities was at an all time high. If they had any further incidents, the entire tour would be cancelled.



Episode 3: Chaka Kahn "I Feel for You" Tour - 1984 This is My Night

The Crew Coming

A-STORY

Chaka, known as the Queen of Funk, was an African American women who broke barriers in R&B. She left the comforts of Rufus to go on her own. Leo was her 'Tour Manager' but quit because Chaka was doing drugs and her camp was in denial, Leo saw this as GREED!, Etta James told Leo "Don't let her die on your watch", he soon after quit because he cared too much about Chaka when others didn't.

B-STORY

Chaka's wardrobe person (Lisa) would buy drugs for Chaka and herself. Leo was onto this and one day spotted her in a limo doing sexual favors for drugs. Leo opened the car door and pulled Lisa out then sent her packing, she was fired! Special Guest: Chaka Kahn

C-STORY

During a show, Chaka hit a note she never thought she could and wet herself out of excitement. She asked Leo right in the middle of the show if she could change and he replied; "No, you've got to get back out there". This led to them having an ongoing personal joke between the two of them. Chaka would often look offstage at Leo and make a gesture about changing clothes in which Leo would gesture back.

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Episode 4: Bette Midler "No Frills" Tour - 1982 Divas not a bad word.

A-STORY

The definitive story of AIDS within rock n roll was headline news. The tour was ground zero of our first pandemic HIV/AIDS. There were numerous illnesses and deaths within the tours circles. Bette had a close relationship with the LGBTQ+ community and she championed the AIDS cause assisting and honoring every person that she was close to affected by the pandemic. She attended many funerals.

B-STORY

The Crew

In 1982 the movie "Jinxed" starring Bette was released and it failed at the box office. With a struggling acting career, Bette decided to returned to her roots in music and hired Jerry Levin and Leo Rossi to create a rock show "No Frills", following the release of the album of the same name. With a mixed crew of Gay Hollywood and Roc N Roll, the tour became a massive success. This coincides with the HIV pandemic.

C-STORY

This story is about the young Singer/song writer, actress Katy Sagal who was a member of the trio "Harletts" who sang and danced side by side on the tour. The story demonstrates how hard work combined with true talent can lead to success.

Episode 5: The Beach Boys – "50th Anniversary Reunion" Tour - 2012

We started it all..

A-STORY

In 2012, Leo was Tour Director for the Beach Boys 50th Anniversary reunion tour. With criticism and doubt to the success of this type of reunion tour, the Beach Boys were the laughing stock of the music industry.

With the leadership of Leo Rossi and his crew, the tour became a huge success that spawned other legacy acts to embark on their own 50th anniversary tours. This is still happening today!

B-STORY

Mike Love owns the name "Beach Boys". Brian Wilson can only use his name as a member of the Beach Boys. This ongoing feud has lasted for decades. Mike and Brian wanted to have their own entourages on the tour so Leo had to merge and manage two entirely separate touring entities creating one for the tour. Its truly a complicated story with a success story for the ages.

Special Guest: Al Jardine Co-founder of 'The Beach Boys'.

C-STORY

Leo's son 'Ryan' passed away in 2011 from cancer, this took Leo into deep dark depression. In 2012, Leo was offered the Tour Director position on the Beach Boys 50th but initially turned it down because depression overruled his passion. Destiny and fate connected Leo and Jeff Foskett (guitar player for Beach Boys), who convinced Leo that this was going to be a special tour and with Leo's special skills he could make a difference. Leo decide to take the tour and it was a decision that not only changed him but the life of many others.
