It is **now up to you to find your own accompanist**. We will help by giving you a list of people who are willing to be here on certain days and times along with the accepted fee for their time and expertise.

The fees for accompaniment have been agreed by everyone and are payable directly to the accompanist when you go for your run through. Please contact them as soon as you get your time and date and send them a copy of your music.

Grades 1 – 4 standard (1 or 2 short pieces)	£25.00
Grades 5 & 6 standard (1 or 2 short pieces)	£30.00
Grade 7, 8 & Diploma (1 piece)	£40.00
Multiple or extended pieces may need more rehearsal time, for which a further charge will be made.

CHANGING, COACHING & WARM UP ROOMS

We cannot guarantee a warm up room at our venues. Please come prepared. However we will try to provide one if possible. For groups performing at St Cedd's a room must be booked with Philippa Penkett before the event. Please see our Safeguarding Policy for details of supervision.

RULES AND REGULATIONS	
It is very important to read these as there are changes this year	
1	COPIES OF MUSIC: Must be brought to the festival and given to the adjudicator at the start of the class.
2	COVID 19: In the event of the return of a large breakout of Covid 19, social distancing must be strictly adhered to. All government rules will be followed.
3	ELIGIBILITY: The festival is for amateurs, except for open classes. This does not apply to accompanists and conductors.
4	AGE: All ages of competitors will be calculated as of 31st August 2025. Open classes have no age limit.
5	ENTRIES: All entries should be made online. Where this is not possible a paper form may be requested.
6	NUMBER OF ENTRIES: You may enter up to TWO SOLO classes in EACH SECTION plus group entries. This still gives you the flexibility to enter, for example, 2 piano PLUS 2 speech and drama PLUS 2 string classes. The EXCEPTION is for Classical and Musical Theatre Singing where 2 classes in each section may be entered.
7	LATE ENTRIES: The online entry system has a cut off date when no further entries can be made.
8	ENTRY FEES: The total correct entry fee must be sent via the Square link on your confirmation email, by BACS or on the Square QR CODE link (in the syllabus and on the website) immediately entries are made. Fees are not refundable.
9	ACCOMPANISTS: You are responsible for arranging and paying for someone to play for you. A suggested list of people to contact can be found on our website and in our printed syllabus. If your piece requires an accompanist it is best to use one rather than play unaccompanied. Contact your accompanist as soon as you have received your date and time.
10	PHOTOCOPIES: Adjudicators will require a copy of your piece.
11	OWN CHOICE PIECES: You are not allowed to play the same piece in more than ONE class.
12	REPEATS: No repeats to be played but da capo is necessary.

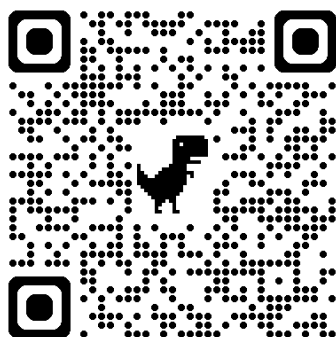
13	TIME LIMITS: Time limits of pieces must be strictly observed. Your introduction (if giving one) should be counted in the time.
14	TIME OF THE CLASS: The start time of each class will be sent to all competitors. We endeavour to start a class on time. Please arrive at the venue at least 10 minutes before the start time. Sometimes classes do over-run.
15	WHEN YOU HAVE ANOTHER CLASS: If you have another class in another room or building don't worry. We will change the order of competitors and call you again at the end.
16	MUSIC STANDS: A music stand will be provided for all SOLO competitors. Duettists and larger groups must bring their own stands.
17	ADJUDICATORS: The adjudicator's decision is final. Speaking to the adjudicator during the progress of a class is not allowed.
18	ASSESSMENT: Adjudicators are provided with our assessment criteria and marking scheme. A copy can be found on the website and in our printed syllabus.
19	CERTIFICATES: All competitors are awarded a certificate which we try to present after each class.
20	MEDALS: We are no longer awarding medals for high scores.
21	TROPHIES: We have a number of trophies which, over the years have been kindly donated by Chelmsford dignitaries, businesses and individuals. They are on loan to you for the year and care should be taken with them.
22	TROPHIES: If a trophy is allocated to a class the winner of the class should be awarded 85 or more marks to receive the trophy.
23	TROPHIES: All trophies must be returned by September 20 September 2025. There is no excuse for any being late and it is your responsibility to get them back to us.
24	MARKSHEETS: The adjudicator will write comments about your performance giving hints and tips for the future. These should be collected after each class.
25	RECORDING AND PHOTOGRAPHY: It is strictly forbidden to use video or audio recording during performances, nor should you take photographs. This is against our Safeguarding policy and you will be removed from the premises if you are found to be doing this.
26	PHOTOGRAPHY: You may be able (if time permits) to take a photograph of your child with their certificate/trophy/adjudicator at the end of a class and with the permission of the steward and adjudicator. Please adhere to our safeguarding policy regarding social media.
27	PHOTOGRAPHY: With parental permission an officer of the festival may ask to take a photograph to be used on our Facebook page or website. When this is done, no names of children will be published.
28	DISQUALIFICATION: No competitor will be disqualified for whatever reason without the sanction of the Festival Chairman.
29	COMMITTEE DECISIONS: These are final, whether they be before the festival or during the events. We reserve the right to alter any arrangements.
30	COMMUNICATIONS: By e mail is preferred please.
31	PERSONAL DATA: Please see our GDPR policy. We hold data purely for the purposes of running the festival.
32	COPYRIGHT: All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law. They may be sung as a concert item with no costume or movement without the need for copyright. Where movement and costume is included copyright permission is required and the festival committee accepts these entries upon the understanding that permission has been sought.

33	AUDIENCE: Audience members are very welcome. Tickets may be obtained from the door for a nominal fee. Card payments are accepted as well as cash.
34	COACHING: No help or coaching of any kind should be given from the audience. No mouthing of words, no gestures etc.
35	USE OF BACKING TRACKS: There is no piano in the speech and drama room therefore backing tracks must be used along with your OWN equipment. For all other sections an accompanist should be used except in exceptional circumstances (eg: Music from other cultures)

HOW TO USE OUR ONLINE ENTRY SYSTEM

The task of preparing a syllabus, programme, spreadsheets, timetabling etc was always a daunting and very time consuming one. We have therefore subscribed to Run My Festival which takes all that work from us and produces lots of whizzy things for us. So, here's how to use it!

1. Login to www.chelmsfordfestival.online or go direct to **<https://chelmsfordfestival.runmyfestival.net>**
2. On the website go to **ONLINE ENTRY** tab and press on the link to **ONLINE REGISTRATION**
3. This takes you to run my festival pages and **NEW REGISTER HERE**
4. Once you have added your e mail address you will receive an e mail headed Thank you for registering. Click on the link and follow the instructions.
5. If you have already registered just log in with your user name and password.
6. You will see a message which says "Select entrant..... New.... From the menu and pick the type of entrant you would like". You will only see the classes available for that entrant. So if it's a soloist you'll only see solo classes, groups – only group classes etc.
7. **FOR SMALL GROUP ENTRIES** (duets, trios, quartets) click "**Create a new group with people**" which will then allow you to name individuals.
8. **FOR LARGE GROUP** entries click on "**Create a group by size**" – you don't need to fill in the names of your group members.
9. When you sign out the site takes you straight back to our webpage.
10. Once you've had a browse and decided your classes, make your entries and go to **CHECKOUT. Select pay via BACS then pay us the fee by BACS OR THE QR CODE BELOW.**

Teachers – this is a great way for you to give your pupils the link so you don't have to enter them yourself.

There is a cut off date and time of 4th October 2025 at 18:00 and after this no entries will be allowed.

P23 SOLO PIANO ADULT CLASS: THE CLASSICAL PERIOD £9.00

Not to exceed 4 minutes 30 seconds.

One piece from any composer working from 1820 - 1900. e.g: A Prelude and Fugue is regarded as one piece. A whole sonata would be over the time limit!

P24 SOLO PIANO ADULT CLASS: THE ROMANTIC PERIOD £9.00

Not to exceed 4 minutes 30 seconds.

One piece from any composer working from 1910 - present day. e.g: A Prelude and Fugue is regarded as one piece. A whole sonata would be over the time limit!

P25 SOLO PIANO ADULT CLASS: THE MODERN ERA £9.00

Not to exceed 4 minutes 30 seconds.

PIANO DUET CLASSES

One, or two short duets to be played by primary aged children

P26 PIANO DUET PRIMARY (FRIDAY 7TH NOVEMBER) £8.50

Not to exceed 3 minutes.

Award: The Chelmsford Trophies

One or two short duets to be played by secondary aged students

P27 PIANO DUET SECONDARY £9.50

Not to exceed 5 minutes.

One or two short duets to be played by primary and secondary aged students

P28 PIANO DUET ANY AGE £9.00

Not to exceed 4 minutes.

One duet to be played by a child and a family member who may be an adult

P29 PIANO DUET CHILD AND FAMILY MEMBER £9.50

Not to exceed 4 minutes.
