Nancy was a member of the Indiana Extension Agents Association and the Hancock County Extension Representatives for 23 years. She established and maintained various organizations including The Alliance for Community Education, the Hancock County Library, the Greenfield Christian Women's Club, the Hancock County Red Cross Chapter, the Hancock County Food Pantry, the Hancock County 4H Queen Pageant, the Hancock County Mental Health Association, and Leadership Hancock County. She was a member of the Indiana State Fair Queen Committee for 12 years and co-owned "Laugh and Learn Presentations." Nancy was also a member of the U&I Hancock County Extension Homemakers and was current President of the HRH Volunteer Guild and served on the Hancock Hospital Foundation Board.

Nancy performed 25 years of service for the Indiana Association of Family and Consumer Sciences and 24 years of service for Epsilon Sigma Phi National Honorary Extension Fraternity. She was a member of the AAFCS Extension Section, a member of Senior Services, and a member of the Greenfield Kiwanis Club. Nancy also judged foods for county and state fairs. In her memory, Stacia's Leadership class came together to create the Excellence in Leadership Award—a fitting tribute to a woman who exemplified the very best of leadership qualities. Since its inception in 1997, this annual award has recognized individuals who embody the spirit of Stacia—those who demonstrate a balanced commitment to community, home, and work; a fervent passion for improving the world around them; and unwavering integrity, dedication, candor, and compassion.

Yet, perhaps the most poignant aspect of this award is not the accolades it bestows, but the manner in which it is bestowed—through the votes of fellow class members. For it is they who intimately understand the essence of true leadership, and it is they who honor Stacia's memory with each passing year.

In a world often fraught with challenges and uncertainties, Stacia Alyea's legacy serves as a beacon of hope—a reminder that, even in the darkest of times, the light of leadership shines brightest when fueled by integrity, compassion, and a steadfast commitment to the betterment of all.

May we all strive to embody the spirit of Stacia, and may her memory continue to inspire generations of leaders to come.
