Apple has a Passcode to get into your device - or Face ID - or Touch ID

- The Passcode that you use to lock the front screen of your device:
 - computer System Settings > Touch ID & Passcode
 - iPhone or iPad System > Settings > Face ID & Passcode
- Yes, this can be the same passcode for all 3, make it easy on yourself!
- It could be a 4- or 6-digit number (iPhone, iPad, computer)
- Or a single word (for the computer) Use only lower case. WRITE it clearly.
- In public, be sure to HIDE the screen with one hand as you type in your Lock screen passcode with the other. If the bad guys get this front passcode - you are screwed! They will have total access to your device and all the data in your life!

Apple ID 2 parts - everything in your Apple world revolves around this - iCloud too!

User Name - your email spelled out (ex.) henrysmith@gmail.com

Password - not too difficult - numbers, letters, words, symbols (ex.) Sally68#5

PS - Passwords on websites, banking, etc. - create a password 12-15 numbers, letters, uppercase, words, symbols to make it hard to break (ex.) Mp92#BY73@65ng Make a DIFFERENT password for ALL the places you need a password. Keep all passwords in a database, text file or neatly written and with your important papers. But NOT in your Last Will - which becomes public records.
