• Do I have to have a Horse ID Certificate to participate in roadster classes?

 Yes, for all USEF-rated shows. While Horse ID Certificates are not required at non-rated show, we encourage the use of the Certificates to promote the roadster discipline.

• Does my horse have to be registered with a breed registry?

No, ARHPA welcomes all horses that meet the "roadster type." However, some classes are breed-specific (such as the Mid Ohio Memorial Day Trotting Sale Roadster Challenge). Horses entered to show in those special classes are required to have current registration papers with the breed registry specified for the class.

How do I apply for a Horse ID Certificate?

• Fully complete the Horse ID Certificate Application form found at www.roadster.show and submit online. For ARPHA members, there is no charge within the first 60 days of ownership of that horse.

• Do I have to identify my horse's breed and pedigree information on the Horse ID Application form?

• We encourage you to identify your horse's breed and/or pedigree information, if known, on the Application. ARHPA is committed to promoting roadsters and part of that commitment includes gathering information on breeds and/or pedigrees that excel in the show ring. In addition, having this information helps ARHPA better understand and serve its membership and develop new classes and programs for its members.

- If I applied for a Horse ID Certificate at a show but have not received my Certificate before the next show, what do I do?
 - The show secretary at the first horse show will provide you with a copy of the completed application. Show that copy to the show secretary at the next horse show and that is sufficient to enter your horse.
- How do I transfer the Horse ID Certificate when I sell my horse?
 - Fill out and sign the transfer form on the back of the Horse ID Certificate. Send the Certificate and the transfer fee to ARPHA and we will issue an updated Horse ID Certificate to the new owner
- I lost my Horse ID Certificate. How do I replace it? OR, I just purchased a horse. How do I find out if my horse already has a Horse ID Certificate?
 - Contact ARHPA for a replacement Certificate and/or to determine if your new horse already has a Certificate. There is a charge for replacement Certificates.
