

We are on the road to Lent, beginning Ash Wednesday March 5— and ending on Easter Sunday April 20, 2025. We will be scheduling special services on Ash Wednesday and Holy Week which consists of Holy (Maundy)Thursday April 17 and Good Friday April 18. We also plan on having an Easter Sunday Celebration on April 20.

For those of you who get confused about all the hoopla of Eastertime, I've provided a recap:


- 1. Purpose of Lent: Lent is a significant time for followers of Jesus, dedicated to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It serves as a period of spiritual growth, reflection, and renewal, leading up to Easter Sunday.
- 2. History: Lent dates back to the early Christian church, with roots in the 4th century. Initially, it was a time for new converts to prepare for baptism. The 40-day duration mirrors Jesus's 40 days of fasting in the desert.
- 3. Practices:
- o Prayer: Increased prayer helps believers deepen their relationship with God.
- Fasting: Many followers of Jesus give up certain foods or habits to practice selfdiscipline.
- Almsgiving: Emphasizes serving others through donations, volunteering, or advocacy.
- 4. Spiritual Growth: Lent is a time for self-examination and renewal of faith. It encourages believers to recognize their dependence on God's grace and to confront any distractions that may hinder their spiritual journey.
- 5. Journey Toward Easter: Lent prepares followers of Jesus for the celebration of Easter, fostering a deeper appreciation for the events of Holy Week and the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- 6. Conclusion: Engaging fully in Lent allows followers of Jesus to reflect on their spiritual lives, recognize the power of grace, and emerge with renewed faith, ready to celebrate the new life in Christ.

As always, if you need more details or have any questions, feel free to ask! This is a special time to remember that you are not alone God goes with you. While many Christians practice fasting and denying ourselves for forty days – we encourage you to meditate on the following:

 What habit, mindset, or emotion would you like to leave behind this Lenten Season?

Creating a Culture of Renewal

As I continue in year two of the Creating a Culture of Renewal, I challenge all of us to begin prayerful consideration of a new vision for Sierra Pines UMC. A dream that furthers Jesus' dream for the world, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

If you remember, a Jesus-like dream is feisty and bold, bigger than you are and scary. It focuses on the flourishing of our community and inspires and unifies us. A vision is different from a goal. A vision is the big-picture idea and a goal is smaller, more discrete, more do-able. For example, "One nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all" from the Pledge of Allegiance is a vision. Some goals that support that vision might be all men and women of a certain age have the right to vote, or every person has the right to a fair and speedy trial.

Solidarity with the Sojourner

Multiple denominational leaders gathered for a webinar to discuss the United Methodist response to immigrant justice and United Methodists across the connection on February 10. The webinar was called "Solidarity with the Sojourner: Understanding U.S. Immigration and Our Call to Respond" and is available for viewing at:

The webinar provided an in-depth overview of the current U.S. immigration landscape and explored the challenges immigrant communities face There was reflection on our faith's call to action and a discussion of practical ways United Methodists can respond. The United Methodists Social Principles affirm our commitment to offer support and welcome immigrants, migrants and refugees into our congregations. "As people of faith committed to justice, compassion, and dignity for all, we strongly oppose ICE raids that harm immigrant communities, create fear, separate families, and go against our moral calling to welcome and protect the vulnerable," per Bishop Julius Trimble.

Locally, some of us have attended Zoom meetings with the Annual Conference, led by Bishop Sandra Olewine and other knowledgeable leaders with ideas about how we can support and exhibit welcome to our vulnerable neighbors. If you are aware of ICE/DHS activity you are encouraged to call (916) 382-0256 so that observers might be notified. More to come from your church leadership regarding safeguarding our church and next steps.
