How and why the Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation created the Saluting America's Band Directors project


What is the Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation?

The Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation was founded in 2017and is based in Pickerington, Ohio. It was created to recognize and carry on the work of the late Mike Sewell, who dedicated his life to the music programs in Pickerington and the Columbus/Central Ohio area for almost 40 years. Mike was director of bands for the Pickerington Local School District and had forged connections among generations of students and musicians that live on in his memory. The Foundation is the sponsor of The Tournament of Roses® Michael D. Sewell Service Through Music Award. This award was initiated by the Sewell family and the Foundation as a way to honor Mike's dedication to using music with his students and groups to encourage service in their schools, the community, and across the country. The award was implemented for the 2018 Rose Parade bands and is presented each year as a way to honor a participating Rose Parade band that best exemplifies service to their community. Mike always told his students, "The greatest gift you can give someone is your time." The award was inspired by that concept.



What is the Saluting America's Band Directors™ (SABD) project?

The SABD project was conceived by the Sewell Foundation as a way to recognize and salute the extraordinary dedication and accomplishments of band directors everywhere—public and private schools at all levels, colleges and universities, the military, and community bands. With their strong relationship with the Tournament of Roses, the Foundation sought to create a special entry in the Rose Parade®. Its proposal was historic: to be the first entry accepted by the Tournament of Roses to have both a float and a marching band composed solely of band directors. The band is named The Band Directors Marching Band.™





Why the project theme, "America's Band Directors: We teach music. We teach life."?

The extraordinary dedication and accomplishments of band directors are well known to their students, to parents and to teachers and administrators. No matter where they teach and work, dedicated music educators and directors work long hours to not only teach and conduct music, but to teach life skills as well. Student lives in particular are positively changed by motivational leaders who teach, inspire and mentor them.

After the 2022 Rose Parade, what happened next?

The Saluting America's Band Directors' entry in the Rose Parade generated countless positive comments from participants and viewers across the country. Soon after, an invitation was received from the planners of Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade® to appear and perform in the 2023 Parade. And now, The Band Directors Marching Band returns for the 2026 Rose Parade.

The Saluting America's Band Directors[™] project At a glance







Project name: Saluting America's Band Directors[™] (SABD).

SABD's mission: Saluting America's Band Directors serves to highlight the outstanding work of America's band directors and to bring attention to and advocate for the important work of our nation's music educators. SABD represents every "music man" and "music woman" in every community across America who endeavors to teach music to our nation's students.

Project sponsor: The Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation, based in Pickerington, Ohio, was created to carry on the legacy of the late Mike Sewell, beloved longtime band director in the Pickerington, Ohio school system.

Initial SABD event: SABD's inaugural event was its appearance in the 2022 Rose Parade.® The entry of The Band Directors Marching Band and float won the Tournament of Roses Showmanship Award.

Unique aspects of our Rose Parade entry: First Rose Parade entry comprising a float and a marching band together, as well as the first known marching band in which all members are active or retired band directors.

SABD Today: Following the overwhelmingly positive response and success of our 2022 Rose Parade appearance, the Sewell Foundation accepted an invitation to march and perform in the 2023 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade® in New York City and now the 2026 Rose Parade. The Foundation believes that through these projects, it can create one-of-a-kind experiences for deserving music educators, that will continue to shine a light on all that band directors do in their classrooms, their communities and beyond.

Once again the BDMB will March the parade route accompanying an amazing Float crafted by AES (Artistic Entertainment Services). This year's entry is entitled "Banding Together" and it salutes all the students, teachers, and communities who band together to make music happen. The magic in teamwork happens everyday on the band field and we can't wait for everyone to see our float. Featured riders are recipients of The Tournament of Roses Michael D Sewell Service Through Music Award. Beginning with the 2018 Rose Parade, the Sewell Service Through Music Award has been presented each year to a participating Rose Parade band director and program that displays above and beyond service through music in their school and community. Jim Hahn, long time Southern California middle school educator and Tournament of Roses band liaison, will also be recognized on the float for his years of service to students and band programs in the Rose Parade. Not only do they teach music, they hold responsibilities in professional organizations promoting music education. Many are professional musicians and are part of performing ensembles. They are all very excited to be a part of this year's Rose Parade. For many, it is a once in a lifetime experience that they would otherwise never have! Each member is proud to represent their school, their community, and all music educators.

Service Through Music Initiative: Service is a part of citizenship in a free society. Musicians are specifically called to use their skills and gifts to inspire and lift up the community. This is what we mean by Service Through Music. Service Through Music is a core principle of The Band Directors Marching Band. It is a value that Mike Sewell held dear. This year's Service Through Music Initiative has three parts:

Part 1: Local Service Through Music Events

Individual members of the Band Directors Marching Band are invited to organize and execute Service Through Music projects in their local communities. In order to illustrate "The Magic in Teamwork," these projects will include two or more performing groups. The projects use music to provide a service to the community. Projects taking place across the country can be viewed on our website.

Part 2: The Band Directors VIRTUAL Band Video

Members of The Band Directors Marching Band will contribute videos of themselves performing "Brand New Day," arranged by Robert Thurston. These will be combined to create a virtual band video to be released on November 11, 2025 in honor of Veterans Day.

Part 3: The BDMB Service Through Music Project when in California

The capstone of this year's Service Through Music initiative will be a ceremony and performance when the group is together in California. The event will honor those fire fighters who responded to the wildfires in the Los Angeles area in January of 2025.

The Band Directors Marching Band is led by nationally known music educator and innovative band director Jon Waters. He is currently director of athletic bands at Bowling Green State University and serves as head director of the Falcon Marching Band. Previously, he was assistant professor of music education and director of bands at Heidelberg University. He previously taught at The Ohio State University where he served as director of marching and athletic bands.

Band Members

Current and retired band directors and music educators may apply for membership in The Band Directors Marching Band for each major event. Qualified individuals are selected by a committee of the Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation based on required band instrumentation, the geographic location of the applicant and the date of receipt of the application.

Members of The Band Directors Marching Band come from all US states, Canada, Mexico, and Panama. Participants range from recent music education graduates through retired veteran directors. Collectively, band members have taught and mentored hundreds of thousands of students and led bands in sizes from a couple of dozen to hundreds of members.

We believe that each iteration of The Band Directors Marching Band are the most experienced marching bands ever assembled. Collectively, the band directors have thousands of years of experience teaching and performing.

The Band Directors Marching Band[™] reunites for 2026 Rose Parade[®]

Columbus, OH—Three hundred and Fifty band directors from across the United States, Canada, Mexico, and Panama will again form The Band Directors Marching Band™ to march in the 2026 Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade®. The band's appearance is a part of the Saluting America's Band Directors™ project of the Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation, based in Pickerington, Ohio.

The band's Participation on January 1 follows its successful appearance in the 2022 Rose Parade® and the 2023 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade®. Through its theme, "America's Band Directors: We teach music. We teach life", the Saluting America's Band Directors project aims to spotlight the extraordinary dedication and accomplishments of band directors everywhere. Regardless of where they teach and work—public and private schools, colleges and universities, the military, or community bands—dedicated music educators and leaders work long hours to not only teach and conduct music, but to impart critical life skills. Student lives in particular are positively changed by motivational leaders who teach, inspire and mentor them.

As in 2022, the 2026 Band Directors Marching Band will accompany a float entitled "Banding Together." The float-band entry is unique to Saluting America's Band Directors. Crafted by Artistic Entertainment Services, the "Banding Together" float salutes all the students, teachers, and communities who band together to make music happen.

The Performance for the 5.5 mile route through Pasadena will be led by nationally-known music educator and innovative band director Jon Waters, director of bands for Bowling Green State University. The parade will be televised to national and international audiences.

As the sponsoring organization behind the project, the Michael D. Sewell Memorial Foundation was created to recognize and carry on the work of the late Mike Sewell, who dedicated his life to schools and community music programs in Pickerington and the Central Ohio area for almost 40 years.
