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### FORWORD

This month's theme will be upon the topic: *Spirituality and Traditions:* Respecting Both for a *Healthy Relationship with God.* While this may be easy to differentiate for some, it may not be for many because traditions are common behaviors, beliefs, and practices that are shared and usually reinforced from generation to generation, or from group to group. Furthermore, when one thinks of tradition when it comes to spiritual beliefs, it can sometimes evoke a negative connotation. What comes to mind (at least for me) when thinking of traditions is that traditions are usually reverenced and honored, with the anticipation that such behaviors, beliefs, and practices remain alive for years to come, due to its significance to the originating generation or group. As most of us know, not all traditions are passed down (example: languages, clothing, professions).

### Comparing Spiritual and Traditional

To be considered *spiritual* means having qualities that reflect spirit-like characteristics or qualities. It may be safe to share that if one considers him— or herself as spiritually-focused, it does not equate to being void of traditions—and *vice versa*. To combine tradition and spirituality does not necessarily mean it is against what is considered good and perfect under the Will of God. I believe to a degree that both a spiritual walk and certain traditions **must** go hand-in-hand.

Matthew 5:17-20 ~ <sup>17</sup> Do not think that I [Jesus] came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. <sup>18</sup> For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled. <sup>19</sup> Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>20</sup> For I say to you, that

unless your righteousness exceeds the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.

What I believe is important to understand is this: As Believers, we should be mindful of when traditions interfere with, or goes against, the spiritual teachings of the gospel.

#### Traditionally Minded

I must admit, when I recently re-read the scriptures, Mark 7:5-15, about Jesus' disciples being scorned for not washing their hands before eating bread, it troubled me, especially in light of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic that has galvanized the world. The Pharisees had an issue with Jesus' disciples because it was a tradition to wash hands before eating bread. When Jesus was approached with the matter, He addressed their concerns in what was, or should have been, an enlightening manner to those who questioned Him:

Mark 7:5-13 ~ <sup>5</sup>Then the Pharisees and scribes asked Him, *Why do Your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashed hands?* <sup>6</sup>He answered and said to them, *Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written:* 

'This people honors Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me. And in vain they worship Me. Teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.'

<sup>8</sup> For laying aside the commandment of God, you hold the tradition of men—the washing of pitchers and cups, and many other such things you do. <sup>9</sup> He said to them, All too well you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep your tradition. <sup>10</sup> For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'He who curses father or mother, let him be put to death.' <sup>11</sup> But you say, 'If a man says to his father or mother, "Whatever profit you might have received from me is Corban" —' (that is, a gift to God), <sup>12</sup> then you no longer let him do anything for his father or his mother, <sup>13</sup> making the word of God of no effect through your tradition which you have handed down. And many such things you do.

*Wow! What a lesson!* The Pharisees and scribes did not expect Jesus to take that opportunity to express *His* displeasure as to how they favored the traditions of men over the commandments of God. Jesus rebuked them for their traditions and practices that disadvantaged and harmed those God's commandments were designed to protect, respect, and honor—their true elders—*mothers and fathers*. What Jesus confronted them with is how they were holding onto a tradition that practiced putting one to death if someone cursed their mother or father; however, they also held as a tradition at least one practice that is against one of God's commandments—*to honor thy mother and father* (Exodus 20:12). Those Jesus admonished had practiced denying whatever profit their parents were entitled to by claiming such profits were being dedicated to God (Corban).

The key issue here is not so much that they were wrong about cleanliness; one should wash hands before eating. It was that the Pharisees and scribes mentioned that doing so was *according to the tradition of the elders*. What I received from these scriptures, in part, is that if they had not credited religious leaders as their elders, this may not have been the teachable lesson that it was then and is today. Jesus knew the hearts of those He encountered. He gave them something to think about—whether they desired to acknowledge their fault or not—and it came in a manner least expected. They honored the traditions of men, but neglected the teachings of God.

**1 Corinthians 1:27** ~ <sup>27</sup> But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty....

#### In Remembrance of Him

As it is written, Jesus requested that His disciples reverence God, His Father, as well as acknowledge Him for what He was meant to do—this would be considered a spirit-led tradition.

Luke 22:17-20 ~ <sup>17</sup> Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, *Take this and divide it among yourselves;* <sup>18</sup> for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes. <sup>19</sup> And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, *This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me.* <sup>20</sup> Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, *This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.* 

Do we not honor the Lord and our God by the breaking of bread and drinking of wine in honor of Him *until He comes again?* Yes; this tradition, this sacrament, is called *Holy Communion*. The Lord did not despise all traditions; He despised traditions that men developed, taught, and sustained that were against the teachings of God. He despised traditions that disrespected the Will of God.

### Being Clean Inside and Out

It is evident by the Word of God that Jesus believed in being cleansed; spiritually and physically (having a clean heart, a renewed mind (Psalm 51:10)); the significance of the washing of feet (symbolic of a humble walk in Christ Jesus (John 13:1-7)). Yet, Jesus knew how to get the attention of those He wanted to reach; even when it was difficult or challenging for His disciples (and multitudes today), to understand or receive easily. But, by the grace of God, His chosen had a made up mind to continued to follow and obey Jesus. None were lost except the Son of Perdition, Judas.

As an example for us today, we should not shun certain traditions or observances such as Holy Communion or baptisms, which symbolize the body of Christ Jesus and being born again, respectively. These sacraments engage the Holy Spirit. It is what Jesus requested of His disciples to do then, and for us to do today. We actively take part in these observances because we do them in remembrance of Him as our Redeemer who lives, by the grace of God our heavenly Father, under the power of the Holy Spirit. Such sacraments bring us closer to God—it helps us in becoming spiritually clean inside so that we may glorify God the Father. While the majority of the time such spirit-led traditions are performed where at least two-or-three are touching and agreeing (Matthew 18:19), it is a personal declaration as to who we are and what we are to our Lord and God. Spirituality and traditions can and should be interconnected in harmony and in alignment with the Will of God; being empowered by the Holy Spirit, and a humbled and repentant heart.

Matthew 3:11-15 ~ <sup>11</sup> I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. <sup>12</sup> His winnowing fan is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather His wheat into the barn; but He will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire. <sup>13</sup> Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. <sup>14</sup> And John tried to prevent Him, saying, I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me? <sup>15</sup> But Jesus answered and said to him, Permit it to be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness. Then he allowed Him.

### Where Your Heart Is

### Matthew 6:21 ~ $^{21}$ Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

The treasures of our heart reveal who and what we are to God and to mankind. *Our spiritual walk, as well as the traditions that we adhere to, are usually led by where our heart is.* Therefore, we should ask for the Holy Spirit to touch our hearts lest we go astray. Spiritual traditions that we adhere to must be in alignment and mirror the Holy Word. We should be encouraged and remain faithful when Christian traditions approach, especially Lent, Easter (Resurrection Sunday), and Christmas, so that sacraments do not evolve into traditions that lack or quenches the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Exodus 12:14-17 ~ <sup>14</sup> So this day shall be to you a memorial; and you shall keep it as a feast to the Lord throughout your generations. You shall keep it as a feast by an everlasting ordinance. <sup>15</sup> Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread. On the first day you shall remove leaven from your houses. For whoever eats leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, that person shall be cut off from Israel. <sup>16</sup> On

the first day there shall be a holy convocation, and on the seventh day there shall be a holy convocation for you. No manner of work shall be done on them; but that which everyone must eat—that only may be prepared by you. <sup>17</sup> So you shall observe the Feast of Unleavened Bread, for on this same day I will have brought your armies out of the land of Egypt. Therefore you shall observe this day throughout your generations as an everlasting ordinance.

Not all of God's chosen were meant to follow all of the traditions in the Holy Bible; there are traditions strictly designed for the Hebrews to follow and obey. However, know that Jesus declared that we are all saved by the grace of God and not by works.

Ephesians 2:14-18 ~ 14 For He [Jesus] Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, 15 having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, 16 and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity. 17 And He came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to those who were near. 18 For through Him we both have access by one Spirit to the Father.

Forbid that we maintain certain traditions that were upheld in the Old Testament that cause the Word of God to be of no effect, such as the sacrificing of animals. To reinforce the Word, *Jesus paid it all; we do not need to continue certain practices and traditions as in the Old Testament because God blessed both Jews and Gentiles with a New Covenant.* Those who are God's chosen have their faith sealed by the Blood of The Lamb.

2 Thessalonians 2:13-14 ~ <sup>13</sup> But we are bound to give thanks to God always for you, brethren beloved by the Lord, because God from the beginning chose you for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth, <sup>14</sup> to which He called you by our gospel, for the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>15</sup> Therefore, brethren, stand fast and hold the traditions which you were taught, whether by word or our epistle.

#### The Old Landmark

I can remember where I was at when I experienced seeing a storefront business opened on a Sunday; it was alarming—*back then.* Since then, decades later, and for many, going to a store on Sunday has become less and less against the grain and commonplace. The scripture that came to mind is—*Be ye not conformed to this world…* (Romans 2:2). Admittedly, the alarming effect no longer has the enormous sting it used to, but the conviction is still within. That is when I know the Holy Spirit loves me.

**Hebrews 3:7-8** ~ <sup>7</sup> If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? <sup>8</sup> But if you are without chastening, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate and not sons.

Surely, we should honor God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit every day of our lives; giving all the honor, glory, and praise for the marvelous things and good works that we are blessed with each day. Surely, we should carry on the tradition of training up children in the way that they should go according to the Holy Word so that they will not depart from the path of God (Proverbs 22:6).

Spirit-led tradition is important for us all, especially when it comes to fighting a good fight against wickedness in high places; for if we did not have a solid, constant foothold in our faith—a practice that we adhered to—we would be like a ship without a sail going to and fro without guidance and a strong foundation.

Mark 6:34 ~ <sup>34</sup> And Jesus, when He came out, saw a great multitude and was moved with compassion for them, because they were like sheep not having a shepherd. So He began to teach them many things.

Jesus taught how we should give to those in need. He taught how to pray and fast; how we should not concern ourselves with earthly treasures, and how to seek and serve God. These are spiritual practices that are reinforced in certain traditions so that we may not only honor the Lord and our God in spirit, but so that we can pass on such knowledge to others by the unction and power of the Holy Spirit.

## **Spirituality and Tradition Together**

In closing, there is no way to avoid these two strongholds from overlapping. Spiritual-minded individuals who seek God's direction should have constants to adhere to. Furthermore, traditions should have a healthy place in a worshipper's life, knowing that the Word of God takes precedence over any tradition that is not demonstrated in the Word of God.

Matthew 17:1-9 ~ <sup>1</sup> Now after six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, led them up on a high mountain by themselves; <sup>2</sup> and He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light. <sup>3</sup> And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Him. <sup>4</sup> Then Peter said to Jesus, *Lord, it is good for us to be here; if You wish, let us make here three tabernacles: one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.* <sup>5</sup> While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and suddenly a voice came out of the cloud, saying, *This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!* <sup>6</sup> And when the disciples heard it, they fell on their faces and were greatly afraid. <sup>7</sup> But Jesus came and touched them and said, *Arise, and do not be afraid.* <sup>8</sup> When they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only. <sup>9</sup> Now as they came down from the mountain, Jesus commanded them, saying, *Tell the vision to no one until the Son of Man is risen from the dead.* 

Imagine how Paul must have felt upon seeing Jesus in such radiance, with such magnificence! Paul wanted to honor Jesus—but God! (We may have aspirations and plans, but God! He will have the last say.) There is a time and place for honoring the Lord and our God, so long as it does not quench the spirit or deters one from his or her spiritual path.

Hebrews 13:20-21 ~ <sup>20</sup> Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, <sup>21</sup> make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.

### Stay Encouraged

We cannot truly fathom how great our Lord and God is, but what we can identify with is our Lord and our God's mercies towards us. Knowing that there are recorded accounts of how Jesus walked this earth—and knowing how He lived and died for us—should cause us to serve Him with an abundance of gratitude and humility. We know that we could never repay Him for what He has done, and continues to do for us, by the power of the Holy Spirit—we know this—but the way we can honor Him is to love and obey Him.

We should, therefore, be willing to spread the gospel so that the Holy Word may be received by all who will believe—and for those who truly believe, may we rejoice together, and be continually encouraged in knowing that we have a glorious expected end in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 2:14-16 <sup>14</sup> Do all things without complaining and disputing, <sup>15</sup> that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, <sup>16</sup> holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain.

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## **Religious Traditions**

Religious traditions depending on where you worship can be a distraction to a spiritual relationship. The reason for making that statement is when having conversations with people your eyes are opened up to a lot of things that are transpiring within people's walk and personal relationships with God. In some of the roughest examples, I have been exposed to, it sounds very cultish and controlling. Being told how to think and feel as if it were scripted and there are consequences if you travel outside any lines or should I say guidelines. The freedom to know and feel God's presence independently is unheard of. Studying the Word is presented in a way that it is so regimented that experience is unheard of.

My question would be if salvation is free? Why should we be guilty of talking about an individual relationship with God and that which he has revealed to us when it is supposed to be intimate? Independent from anyone else. You can introduce a person to someone but after the initial introduction, your job is pretty much done when the other person decides to further their connection and build upon it.

Religious traditions a lot of times boil down to trying to recreate things that we have experienced that were pleasant and impactful for that time. To consistently try to recreate rather than having a natural experience brings a counterfeit and awkward setting at best. Then it becomes a routine and definitely not a cherished experience. That is when you lose your spiritual relationship factor and everything becomes robotic and programmed. That is when you start to question the motives behind the request made because you see no results in relation to the transforming power of God. Rather than the dictation of man.

One can teach principles based on understanding, but you cannot teach a relationship that has to be independently experienced to understand the essence. Essences bring out the oneness that one develops in a relationship which is hard to explain because it's derived between two parties. Therefore it is intimate, so we must be very careful along those lines of passing judgment because some areas are private and sensitive.

We must then learn to respect boundaries until such time one is opened to share. If you are in a natural relationship with your spouse there are parts that are public and others that are very private. There are corporate prayers and praise that are done, but there are also the same which are private. Where we experience God in such an oneness that it may be outside of explanation but we ourselves just know and rest contently in the experience. That our desire for others is that they go and experience it for themselves, having the understanding it occurs when we seek Him wholeheartedly.

Religious traditions can overshadow one's relationship with God because leadership becomes a substitute for God to the point that they are idolized by their members. Unfortunately in some cases, this becomes a place of control where members are restricted even in other parts of their lives. We have to ensure that God remains focal and that in leadership we lead and enlighten to the principles of God and not an outside agenda.

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
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
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## The Comparison of a Religious Mindset and Spiritual lifestyle Minister Donna Jones

Look at King Saul and David. Saul sought after personal achievement without walking with God. David sought after God and gained personal achievement as he was led by God and deeply cared for the people as well.

Judas sold Christ out while John the Beloved was not only given the ministry of the Book of Revelation but because Jesus knew His Heart, He even blessed John with the care of His mom. When someone trusts you with their mom they usually know you intimately and they sense a loving and kind heart in you. Judas wanted fame, walked in a religious state of mind, worrying about "kingdom" politics of when would Jesus take over. His kingdom desire wasn't really Christ like.

## "Religious Traditions vs. Spiritual Relationships" I Timothy 4:14-"Neglect not the gift that is in thee....." By Elder Diane Harvell April 7, 2020

As I think about the many commitments I've made for the sake of "Ministry," sadly I realize that I have wasted more time into what I thought was good or at least into what I thought God had called me to do by keeping up with traditions.

This is very serious because I almost lost my daughter to the world because of the traditions I kept. Believing that I was "bringing her up in the way that she should go." I was so committed to "going to church" every Sunday, attending bible study every week and back to church on Sunday all day and half the night, I thought that I was "doing good" but I didn't even realize this way of life was actually lethal and misleading to my family.

Please don't get me wrong, I am not against attending church services, and I am not bashing the only way that I knew how to serve God as many still do today, but I am saying that this is a religious routine and tradition that leaves little room for self evaluation of oneself, or little room to have a personal relationship with God, family or others. Everything I did involved being at church.

Vacations, birthdays, and recreational fun all involved being at church

and so I did not recognize that I wasn't cultivating one of my first gifts that God had given me, my daughter, who just needed me to be "Mom." We say, "Ministry" first begins at home.
