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Are You Winning Souls Or Chasing The Titles?

Ephesians 4:1-16 ~ ¹I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called, ² with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, ³ endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism; ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all. ⁷ But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸ Therefore He says:

When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men.

⁹ (Now this, He ascended—what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? ¹⁰ He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) ¹¹ And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, ¹² for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, ¹³ till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; ¹⁴ that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, ¹⁵ but, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ— ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love.

You may have noticed the difference in the formatting of my article for this month's theme, *Are You Winning Souls Or Chasing The Titles?* Instead of providing definitions pertaining to words that make up the theme for this month (actually, this month's theme is clear and has little room for misinterpretation), in direct symmetry to the topic at hand, I was inspired to present definitions on the various *titles* that are prominent in Christianity—not all, of course—but the most common titles known that would better serve the focus of this July 2021 topic.

Some of the most notable titles and positions indicated in The Holy Scriptures that were recorded are as follows: *apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers* (Ephesians 4:11). I have also added the position, *deacon* (1 Timothy 3:8-13). Most positions refer to in the male gender, so that is how it is indicated below. However we know that all things work together for good, to those who love the Lord, who are the called according to His purpose (Romans 8:28)—both male and female. So, again, here are the titles:

Apostle:

- **Matthew 10:1~** ¹And when He [Jesus] had called His twelve disciples to Him, He gave them power over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease.
- **2 Corinthians 11:13** ~ ¹³ For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ.

Prophet:

- Deuteronomy 18:18 \sim ¹⁸ I will raise up for them a Prophet like you from among their brethren, and will put My words in His mouth, and He shall speak to them all that I command Him.
- Matthew 7:15 ~ ¹⁵ Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves.

Evangelist:

- 2 Timothy 4:2 ~ ² Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.
- 2 Timothy 4:5 ~ But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

Pastor:

- Acts 20:28 ~ ²⁸ Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.
- 1 Peter 5:2 ~ ² Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly;

Bishop:

- 1 Timothy 3:1-2 ~ ¹ This is a faithful saying: If a man desires the position of a bishop, he desires a good work. ² A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, temperate, sober-minded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach;
- 1 Timothy 3:3-7 ~ ³ not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, but gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous; 4 one who rules his own house well, having his children in submission with all reverence 5 (for if a man does not know how to rule his own house, how will he take care of the church of God?); 6 not a novice, lest being puffed up with pride he fall into the same condemnation as the devil. 7 Moreover he must have a good testimony among those who are outside, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.

Deacon:

1 Timothy 3:8-13 ~ ⁸ Likewise deacons must be reverent, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy for money, ⁹ holding the mystery of the faith with a pure conscience. ¹⁰ But let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons, being found blameless. ¹¹ Likewise, their wives must be reverent, not slanderers, temperate, faithful in all things. ¹² Let deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. ¹³ For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.

For The Equipping Of The Saints

I do not want to present a message out of turn, but when I received the topic for this month, it brought back to remembrance negative experiences from my past—and some from a not-too-distant past.

I have been engaged with ministries who have appointed servants of God to positions (again, both male and female), such as deacons, teachers, pastors, and apostles—this was not uncommon. What was perplexing for some of these appointments; however, is when it came to positions such as *pastors* and *apostles*. (Note: according to some scholars, apostles and bishops are considered similar in duties and responsibilities.)

I witnessed individuals appointed to an apostolic and pastoral position when these individuals never had a flock, never even came close to establishing a church or separate ministry; nor has been considered an evangelist in the field, evident by circumstances that entailed their appointment by the leadership. I have seen appointments on the apostolic level that was a declaration of those things to come (faith-based appointments), instead of upon what had transpired, but had not come to pass.

Although The Holy Scriptures does not indicate a number of followers that would recognize someone as an apostle, bishop, or pastor, I would think that to hold any one of these titles would mean that you can easily be set apart from the rest of God's Chosen. *In other words, if a person ministers on street and has a group of individuals that he or she regularly engages with, would that person be considered a pastor?* In that case, everyone who ministers on the street or via electronic conferencing can be considered a pastor. I would believe, based upon The Holy Scriptures that there is much more to being a pastor, a bishop, or an apostle than that.

Know Who Is Spiritually Feeding You

I stayed in a ministry for quite a long time—actually too long—before I mustered the courage to ask why Holy Communion was not presented to the congregation. I was informed that they were *Hebrews*. I was stunned. The Lord instructed His disciples to *Do this in remembrance of Me*. I was more than capable of doing so on my own or elsewhere, but that ministry was my home church—I did not want to engage in Holy Communion elsewhere—so that was *the final straw*, as the elders

would say. I left. How do you honor leadership in the flesh more than Jesus, our Savior? I did not understand why it was necessary to take on the title Hebrew when we are all Gentiles!

I also had the experience of meeting someone who wrote books on the Christian faith who offended me while promoting their personal endeavor. This person who had excelled beyond what I have done—I never published a book—communicated to me in a spirit of derision. The experience was so disheartening and uncomfortable—I was informed that I was doing too much. What perplexes me is that why would anyone tell another that he or she is doing too much on behalf of our Lord and our God? What spirit is that? What is even more perplexing, this person had a title, and continues to have titles. How is such an action inspired by The Most High God?

Recently, I experienced a rude awakening by someone who has a street ministry and holds the title *pastor* who committed an act that I could not believe. I had to work on releasing this situation from my heart. How does anyone support calling him— or herself a deacon, evangelist, teacher, pastor, bishop, without demonstrating the spirit of love, compassion, or empathy, especially during a period of bereavement? I had to remove a significant amount of detail about this situation after I typed it; it would not have served me to share it in detail, but the revelation about this individual was stunning in the worse way—actually shocking. This person had a street ministry for years, but turned a blind eye to someone—a dearly beloved that was considered a brother. I am working on letting this go; knowing that it cut deep at first, but my saving grace is that I know that God is the Judge of us all—and I must and will let it go. Yes; the topic of winning souls or chasing titles is a sensitive topic for me. For many are called, but few are chosen (Matthew 22:14); and it appears from time to time that those who we believe are chosen (for only God truly knows), at times do not look or act much differently than those who are cold and heartless; or who are out there in the world without the love of Christ Jesus.

Let My Actions Speak For Me

I pray that I am not offending my Lord and my God for this month's message. I want to remain upright at all times. If I ever take on a title that represents my calling, I want my gifts to speak for me for that calling. I do not want a handful of individuals to bestow upon me any titles that never reflect my calling. Do not give me the title of apostle—yet, what just came to me while typing is that decades ago, I was one of the founders of a ministry that was incorporated. This ministry was formed in New York State, but the pastor relocated out-of-state where he lived. Even with that experience, in my heart, I would not consider myself or the other founding members as apostles. I had written messages, and have come forth and spoken, but I would not consider myself a preacher. Definitely do not refer to me as a pastor-in-the-making—where is my flock? Outside in the streets? I would not consider myself an under shepherd, although I can call and minister to individuals when led. A conference call may be a vehicle to reach out to others, but the world is doing that, too, via way of Twitter, Instagram, Tic Tok, Facebook, Skype, and Zoom. Should administrators of such platforms who expound upon God's Word also be called an 'apostle," 'pastor," 'bishop" because they were able to get a group of individuals on the computer, or on the phone, on a regular basis? It is written that The Good Shepherd will call, and the sheep will respond and come. Again, God is The Judae.

Matthew 6:19-21 ~ ¹⁹ Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; ²⁰ but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Where Your Treasure Is

I understand that multitudes mainly focus on ministry, so there is a dependence, to a degree, upon the goodness of others, whether financially or otherwise. However, if one in Christ sees a need

and refuses to assist because he or she wants to be paid, or believes attaining a title will give him or her more prestige, than that to me is placing one's spiritual wellbeing on the line. *Are you a pastor? Then why not share a page or two to an ecumenical magazine on a monthly basis?* If you hold any of these positions: an apostle, a bishop, a pastor, evangelist, teacher, or deacon, then The Lord and our God, by the power of The Holy Spirit should provide to you a fresh Rhema Word to share. As you hold a title that represents service to The Most High God, you should have at least one message from time to time that could truly be a blessing to others. Your title(s) should be supported by the fruit you bear (Galatians 5:22).

Acts 19:11-17 ~ ¹¹ Now God worked unusual miracles by the hands of Paul, ¹² so that even handkerchiefs or aprons were brought from his body to the sick, and the diseases left them and the evil spirits went out of them. ¹³ Then some of the itinerant Jewish exorcists took it upon themselves to call the name of the Lord Jesus over those who had evil spirits, saying, *We exorcise you by the Jesus whom Paul preaches.* ¹⁴ Also there were seven sons of Sceva, a Jewish chief priest, who did so. ¹⁵ And the evil spirit answered and said, *Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are you?* ¹⁶ Then the man in whom the evil spirit was leaped on them, overpowered them, and prevailed against them, so that they fled out of that house naked and wounded. ¹⁷ This became known both to all Jews and Greeks dwelling in Ephesus; and fear fell on them all, and the name of the Lord Jesus was magnified.

...But Who Are You?

There are too many people suffering. There are too many people who are losing their way. There are too many lost souls who do not have someone to encourage him or her, so why risk taking on a title that does not align with your calling? You not only jeopardize the individual who seeks out someone who desires to hear or receive a spiritual covering or word, but because of your desire to take on a position that you are not called, for can cause you to eventually become spiritually corrupted. What is your title? What do you call yourself? Can you support your given or self-proclaimed title with the duties and responsibilities that go with it? Are you winning souls, or are you simply chasing titles? Are you certain that God approves of the positions or titles pronounced upon you? Is The Holy Spirit evident in what you are doing? Are you losing your gifts, or are more destitute (whether spiritually or otherwise) than those you claim to serve? That could be a sign that you are out of God's Will; especially, if your prophetic messages are not coming to pass. Be encouraged; you can make the change to do what is just and right—being called a Child of God is what truly matters. The other titles will not change your calling. What is for you, is for you. If you are chasing titles, let them be. Have comfort in knowing you are a King's Kid! You are a Child of The Living God (Romans 8:14). Your purpose is your purpose. Your calling is your calling.

The Titles That Matters Most

When all is said and done, I pray that my Lord and my God calls me by the name He has for me that is written in The Lamb's Book of Life. I pray that when I transition, God will call me His good and faithful servant. I pray that my soul is kept by the Lord and I am called His. *How about you? Are you winning souls or are you chasing the titles?*

James 2:14-20 ~ ¹⁴ What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, *Depart in peace, be warmed and filled,* but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit? ¹⁷ Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. ¹⁸ But someone will say, *You have faith, and I have works.* Show me your faith without your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. ¹⁹ You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe—and tremble! ²⁰ But do you want to know, O foolish man, that faith without works is dead?

Have a transformed mind, look to Jesus.



word of God says he who desires the office of a bishop desires a good work listen to what it says:

- I Timothy 3:1-7-This is a true saying, if a man desire the office of a bishop, he desireth a good work.
- v-2 A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behavior, given to hospitality, apt to teach;
- v-3 Not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous;
- v-4 One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity;
- v-5 (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God)?
- v-6 Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil.
- v-7 Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.

So, the prerequisite to Minister is not to boast of the **title or to be a performer**, but one must have a good reputation as a husband, a teacher, a warm person given to hospitality, sober and sober minded, not desirous of receiving goods and money because of greed, not a fighter but patient & humble, one that can take care of his own house and have respectful children, a minister must not be filled up with pride, and he must have a good reputation.

The Lord made himself of **no reputation-Philippians 2:7-8.**

So, is it the souls that we desire, or are we chasing the titles for prestigious purposes?!

Considering all that is happening around us and everything that is taking place upon the earth speaks that we're closer to the Lords return than we have ever been and it appears to me that the church is very unbalanced because our focus has not been on the Lords return, the Lord's purpose or lost souls.

What I am seeing today causes me to be a bit frustrated concerning what is going on within the church of today despite all the end time signs that we are seeing & experiencing. Plagues are occurring in different forms all around us but because so much is going on in the earth, we have become distracted from the actual events that are occurring in the spirit realm. That's how it was in the days of Noah. Whereby we begin to fall away from the principles and purpose that God truly had intended for mankind. Which is defined in his Word but skewed to some degree because man manipulates it rather than truly studies to gain an understanding of His principles and full purpose. So, we hit and miss until such a time that the scales of blindness are pulled away from our eyes where darkness fades and light appear in its fullness. Truly humbling us to our correct posturing before an awesome almighty God. The measurement of this statement is based on the outcomes that we begin to experience due to our obedience to the guiding of the Holy Spirit. ... if an honorably discharged U.S. veteran dies while serving time for a year or more, that a veteran's military benefits could be, in whole or in part, denied?






