INTRODUCTION

Have you ever felt like your heart has been broken into a million and one pieces? Have you ever been so devastated and broken that you never thought you'd ever recover from the unexpected, devastating blows of life? A broken heart can occur at any time because of traumatic events in your life which creates pain and suffer

I should have been living on the back ward of the Ypsilanti State Mental Hospital forty years ago, But God who is rich and mercy delivered me.

Mental illness has always been an issue in the Churches and we suffered in silence because of the stigma for decades. Yet, when I came to my breaking points, God was there every step of the way to give me breakthroughs, breaking me free from the wounds of the past.

The first of eight principles towards wholeness are found in the excerpts from CHAPTER 1: DON'T LET YOUR BACKGROUND KEEP YOUR BACK ON THE GROUND

As a child I felt like Humpty Dumpty who fell off the wall, broken into a million and one pieces. Life seemed to be filled with broken dreams and shattered visions. An egg like me is very sensitive, delicate and fragile, after all, and its contents are protected only by its outer shell. It's wrapped up so delicately that it requires nurturing and special care, otherwise, it will crack, then break. A crack developed in me very early, and I often wondered why God created me at all.

I was their oldest child. Being born the oldest of five had great advantages and disadvantages. Most of the time I was responsible for finding safety for my siblings during my father's temper tantrums and outbursts. My father could make us all walk on eggshells and quake trembling with fear. One night I remember hearing screaming, yelling, sobbing and arguing. As the four of us ran downstairs into the den, we stopped at the door. Frozen in our tracks, we yelled, "Daddy, stop it!"

We watched Daddy choke and shove Mama into the wall for years, and we decided that the best way to settle arguments is to fight. We fought one another and others until sometimes the kids in the neighborhood had to go to the hospital.

In our neighborhood, on the Northeast side of Detroit, Michigan, we saw the same dysfunctional relationship pattern that we saw at home. Children learned what they saw in their environment, not what parents or adults say. While we were sitting on the front porch, I remember seeing Miss Pauline hit her husband, Mr. John, on the head, and knocking him out on the lawn every day. He'd lay there drunk for hours. But then he'd get up and beat Miss Pauline.

I saw Mr. Ivy chase Mrs. Ivy down the street with a gun. Every day I saw a young teenage mother of two toddlers follow her pimp husband, begging him to come back home.

I watched Mama wait on Daddy hand and foot, and yet, I wanted to be just like her and all the other women in the neighborhood. I thought that when you were married you had to cry a lot, and do everything men wanted you to do. I decided that I was going to be a good wife just like my Mama.

When Daddy left for California, I was afraid and felt unprotected I was bullied as I walked home from elementary school. The turmoil at home and fights in elementary school were minor compared to the endless ridicule, teasing and jeering I experienced at Cleveland Junior High School. The three-and-one-half-mile walk from junior high school, seemed like an endless, dangerous journey, as the boys continued to jeer, "Skinny legs, skinny legs, ha ha ha."

"I remember running home and playing my favorite song, "You'll Never Walk Alone" by Rogers and Hammerstein on the piano daily. The words of the song were combating the storms of life, comforting and encouraging me not to be afraid.

God was with me through the bullying and bad times. He Will Never Leave You Nor Forsake You. Can you think of a song that can walk you through your storms in life? The right songs with the right sound that have meaning and purpose.

Experiencing domestic violence, colorism, bullying and other negative experiences created a distorted self-perception. When perception is stronger than truth it leads to deception, victimization and intimidation.

My perception of life was distorted. When children live in any abusive environment (abnormal misuse of God's creation), Adverse Childhood Experiences interferes with their normal development, and it alters who they were created to be.

I continued my relentless search, desperately looking for love in all the wrong places, trying to fulfill unmet emotional needs in unhealthy ways. Soul wounds influence our choices. I encountered my first experience with cocaine, hash and angel dust. My head started to spin, I asked, "What in the world is this?" As the group laughed, it felt like my mind left my head, moved to the left, returned, and moved to the right and kept on going. They yelled, "Angel dust!"


A broken- hearted person, when wallowing in the pain can become chronically and clinically depressed, and dangerously desperate and relentless in their search which can lead to frustration, anger anxiety and a myriad of mental and physical health problems.

Today, mental health problems that affects a person's thinking, emotional state, and behavior are diagnosable illnesses often rooted in soul wounds. **Mental illness is defined as a condition affecting thinking, perceptions, moods, emotions, and behaviors which diminish the quality and longevity of life.**

After I was literally broken, I learned how to become responsible for my own happiness and began learning how to make better choices in alignment with my purpose and destiny. I stopped allowing my background to keep my back on the ground and began a journey learning how to walk in the steps that were ordered for me by God.

My Perspective - Key Words

Harvest (noun) is: a parcel of land that has been cultivated with seeds that: (1) have reached maturity, (2) that have reached its peak in fruition, or (3) that have completed the final phase of its plant product (a crop). If all or most of the desired or satisfactory conditions of the crop have been met, the harvest is ready to be gathered or sheaved for its final destination. See, *Matthew 9:37-38* and *Revelation 14:15* above.

Matthew 20:1-5 ~ ¹ For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. ² Now when he had agreed with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. ³ And he went out about the third hour and saw others standing idle in the marketplace, ⁴ and said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right I will give you.' So they went. ⁵ Again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour, and did likewise.

The Parable Of The Sower Speaks For Itself

It is not uncommon to experience or learn about a situation when someone has made a comparison to another that generated sentiments of dissatisfaction, or feelings of being undervalued. However, in Jesus' parable above about the sowers, the landowner made agreements with various laborers during different periods of the day. To add, each laborer were offered the same compensation for their efforts, and the landowner honored his agreement to all of them.

Each laborer willingly agreed upon the set amount of compensation for their efforts. So, why do you believe Jesus expressed in His parable discontentment and complaints from some of the laborers? How did the earlier set of laborers know that they received the same amount of wages as the latest laborers who worked in the field? They saw what the landowner of the vineyard was paying out. What is the message that Christ Jesus wanted all to receive? Could it be that God's chosen do not believe that Gentiles should receive the same blessings for being laborers in His field as they? Could it be that those with prestigious titles and those who worked years in the 'harvest'—whether Jew or Gentile—believe that those who come to Christ Jesus late in their lives should not attain the same mercy, grace, and favor as they? Perhaps, it could simply mean that our Lord and Savior Jesus is informing all of humanity that regardless to the level one is at when sincerely accepting Him as Savior, that the gift of eternal life is at hand—the gift of salvation—and all that comes with it according to the Will of God His Father.

Matthew 20:8-16 ~ 8 So when evening had come, the owner of the vineyard said to his steward, 'Call the laborers and give them their wages, beginning with the last to the first.' 9 And when those came who were hired about the eleventh hour, they each received a denarius. ¹⁰ But when the first came, they supposed that they would receive more; and they likewise received each a denarius. ¹¹ And when they had received it, they complained against the landowner, ¹² saying, 'These last men have worked only one hour, and you made them equal to us who have borne the burden and the heat of the day.' ¹³ But he answered one of them and said, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? ¹⁴ Take what is yours and go your way. I wish to give to this last man the same as to you. ¹⁵ Is it not lawful for me to do what I wish with my own things? Or is your eye evil because I am good?' ¹⁶ So the last will be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen.

Today You Shall Be With Me In Paradise

Needless to share, the crucifixion of Jesus is paramount for the salvation of humanity. In addition to Jesus' tremendous demonstration of love, which was His willingness to give His life so that all who receive Him may have right to the gift of everlasting life, another significant event occurred during that same period of time.

Luke 23:39-43 ~ ³⁹ Then one of the criminals who were hanged blasphemed Him, saying, *If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us.* ⁴⁰ But the other, answering, rebuked him, saying, *Do you not even fear God, seeing you are under the same condemnation?* ⁴¹ And we indeed justly, for we receive the due reward of our deeds; but this Man has done nothing wrong. ⁴² Then he said to Jesus, *Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom.* ⁴³ And Jesus said to him, *Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise.*

During this very brief communication, this man asked something of Jesus; that He remember Him when He enters into His kingdom. Is that what our Lord wants us to do? To not only acknowledge Him for who He Is, but most importantly, to accept Him for who He Is to us and ask Him to remember us before God His Father—to not forget us? So powerful! (The adversary knows that Jesus Is Lord, but will not accept Him. See, Matthew 4:1-11.) This sinner, who was hanging on his cross, acknowledged Jesus as having committed no sin. While hanging on His Cross for humanity, Jesus accepted this sinner who acknowledged his sin before Him. This man received the very same reward that we Believers of Christ Jesus will attain one day. To emphasize, when he—the sinner—accepted Jesus while hanging upon his cross, before the end of that day, had received the same gift of salvation that those who believe in Christ Jesus and labored in His harvest can look forward to attaining one glad day. All because Jesus was willing to die upon His Cross for all of humanity, regardless as to whether one was an early laborer for His kingdom, or someone who had recently accepted Him as their personal Lord and Savior! How great is that! How great is our God!

Our gift of salvation is not contingent upon how many years of servitude; yet, truly of great importance so as to fight a good fight of faith throughout one's lifetime, nor upon our level of skill in a particular area (but do not be ignorant of the Word of God, for our God knows the heart), nor based upon spiritual gifts attained, but upon our belief and acceptance of who Jesus Is and what He Is to us up to and through the end of our journey in the flesh. So the question is: *Are you ready to serve?* What is your excuse?

Revelation 22:14 ~ ¹⁴ Blessed are those who do His commandments, that they may have the right to the tree of life, and may enter through the gates into the city.

Do Not Wait Any Longer

As it is written, there were three men who hung on a wooden cross the day that Christ Jesus was crucified (Luke 23:32-33); however, two were heaven-bound, but the greatest difference was that only one could be called *Savior*. The man who asked to be remembered came so very close to not only losing his natural life, but his spiritual life as well. To point out, The Holy Scriptures does not make reference as to whether this man had actually accepted Jesus as his Savior **before** he

was hung on his cross, but there is a strong probability that he knew of Jesus, lest he would not have been able to chastise the other criminal who spoke against Jesus. What The Holy Scriptures attests to is that this man had a special encounter with Jesus like no other—they both died and were united in His kingdom. Had it not been for the timing of his crucifixion, and his willingness and sincere heart to acknowledge his respect for Jesus, he could have died that day, but not have been accepted into the kingdom of God that day. The criminal who spoke kindly and humbly before Jesus did not jeopardize his soul as the other criminal who also was hung and died that very same day. Both sinners had the same opportunity, but only one acknowledged The Risen King respectfully. So, the question is: If you have not as yet acknowledged that you are a sinner in need of salvation, what are you waiting for?

NOTE: The following content of this paragraph may be considered a sensitive topic for some relating to the transition of individuals who died from COVID-19. If this matter is too sensitive for you, please skip this paragraph. As of this day, in the United States of America, there have been over 756,564 deaths—over Seven Hundred Fifty-Six Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Four deaths due to the pandemic COVID-19 (Worldometer, Oct. 15, 2020). There were those who were given the opportunity to say goodbye to their close relations due to the lengthy period of time suffering from this dreadful virus. Some transitioned rapidly without warning; startling and crushing the hearts of those left behind who loved and cared for them. What I am getting to is that if this pandemic has not confirmed that tomorrow is not promised to even those who were strong in health, sound mind and body, then what will?

John 12:42 ~ ⁴² Nevertheless even among the rulers many believed in Him, but because of the Pharisees they did not confess Him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue.

Believe, Confess, and Serve

Do not be as the laborers in the parable (Matthew 20:1-16), or as the rulers who were afraid and more concerned about their relationship with men (John 12:42). They were too busy thinking about receiving or maintaining their own prestige or attaining compensation based upon terms that had nothing to do with kingdom building.

Jesus said if you confess Him before men, He will confess you before His Father who is in heaven (Matthew 10:32). If we confess that we are sinners; that Jesus is The Son of The Living God and He is our Redeemer, we are saved from eternal death (John 3:16). So, if you are reading this and have not yet received Christ Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior, the question again is: What are you waiting for? Are you ready to serve? Don't look to the left, nor to the right. Look straight ahead and make that change to received Christ Jesus while the blood is still running warm in your veins.

Matthew 1:23 ~ ²³ Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name *Immanuel*, which is translated, *God with us.*

John 12:27 \sim ²⁷ Now My soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I came to this hour.

Soul Insurance

It is so interesting how many of us believe in all types of insurance—medical insurance, vehicle insurance, home insurance, but not soul insurance—the type of insurance that has already been paid in full.

Revelation 1:18 \sim 18 I am He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Hades and of Death.

For those blessed with the presence of The Holy Spirit, we know that God The Father and His Son Christ Jesus Are Real. Just read The Holy Scriptures for yourself if you have any doubts that

you should believe in The Holy Trinity. Over two thousand years ago, writings were passed down that revealed the coming of Immanuel, that is, *Christ with us* (Matthew 1:23). So, what are you waiting for? Many are called; few are chosen (Matthew 20:16). Why take a chance on being among the many who are not chosen to serve after being offered so great a gift? Is there anything greater than working for one's own soul salvation and on behalf of the salvation of others?

- **Joshua 24:15** ~ ¹⁵ And if it seems evil to you to serve the Lord, choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.
- 2 Thessalonians 3:1-5 ~ ¹ Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may run swiftly and be glorified, just as it is with you, ² and that we may be delivered from unreasonable and wicked men; for not all have faith. ³ But the Lord is faithful, who will establish you and guard you from the evil one. ⁴ And we have confidence in the Lord concerning you, both that you do and will do the things we command you. ⁵ Now may the Lord direct your hearts into the love of God and into the patience of Christ.
- Matthew 20:6-7 ~ ⁶ And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing Idle, and said to them, 'Why have you been standing here idle all day?' ⁷ They said to him, 'Because no one hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right you will receive.'



Selecting A Qualified Fitness Instructor Pt II Sgt. Nate Griffin

In my last article, I covered some of the issues you may encounter when looking for a qualified fitness instructor. This time, I'd like to cover some important questions to ask when screening possible candidates for coaching you in the area of fitness.

- 1. What are their qualifications/education? It is not wise to pick someone because they are someone you know who lifts weights or works out, as qualification. You also want to beware of those who collect all of their material from social media. Would you select a doctor, lawyer, accountant or other specialized skilled professional, who gathered all their material from Google, Facebook, and The Gram?
- 2. What is their experience in working with someone of your need set? How many people who were in the same starting position as you are now, have they worked with and successfully helped?
- As for proof of their certifications, education and references. Remember, your life is on the line. You will be giving this person full permission to manipulate your cardiovascular system in a way that is extremely dangerous.
- 4. What is their philosophy when it comes to fitness training? That will give you some insight into what their main focus will be on during your sessions.
- 5. In reference to experience, ask if they can provide references of other people in your age, gender, and current health condition category who would be able to youch for their them.
- 6. What kind of post training follow up do they provide? When you have completed your time with them, be it a few months or several years, what additional support do they provide? Some trainers cut all ties once all sessions have been honored. Other trainers will give their clients addition information to help keep them on track in the event, they wish to return for more training on another goal.
- 7. Do they have a degree as a registered dietician? This is really only necessary if you have a major eating disorder. Anorexia, bulimia-nervosa and so on, are examples of situations where you would need more counselling when it comes to nutrition other than, eat 3 small meals and 2 snacks, or drink this shake and pop these pills.

There you have it, my friend. One last note. This is my own opinion on the matter. That is, if your trainer looks like they need a trainer, you need to find another trainer. Why? Because, if they can't follow their own advice, it will be really tough to motivate someone else to do the same. You want your trainer to be transparent. Now, they don't have to reveal personal information that may prove inappropriate. But, sharing enough information that would help the client see that everyone is fighting a battle and that we all must gather the strength and assistance to press on to perfection.



Nation after nation have been called but only a few have answered the call to Christianity. God's hand of mercy has been rejected throughout all ages, yet he still stretches out his hand to a 'disobedient and gainsaying people.' **Romans 10:21.**

This also reminds me In Luke chapter 9 when Jesus told a man to follow him, but the man answered, "suffer me first to go and bury my father." They will receive us during God's perfect will and plan that he has designed for our lives and theirs. You see the multitude was the blessing they were the harvest that Jesus had called the disciples to. All they had to do was trust Jesus with what they had because He is Lord of the harvest and only need laborers, servants to fulfill the task not the titled or the entitled!
