## **REGISTRATION OF HORSES**

This Association shall provide a form for and maintain a file of registrations for all horses. All horses registered in mid-season must be registered in writing on the proper UHC horse registration form. NO OTHER FORM OF REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED.

## PROMOTERS SHOW APPROVAL

- 1. Promoters, clubs or individuals desiring to stage or sponsor shows recognized by the United Horsemen of the Carolinas will submit a request to the Vice President, and requst an application for a show date. Once completed by promoter, application should be sent to the address provided on the application, along with a payment of \$100.00 (plus \$75 if requesting insurance coverage through UHC), to the Vice President NO LATER THAN November 15<sup>th</sup>, in order that the board can review applications and draw up a preliminary show calendar prior to the final assignment of dates. The Application fee will be refunded in full if the date(s) requested is denied by UHC.
- Each application submitted will only be allowed to have two approved dates for shows, per calendar year. If additional days are available, the acting Vice President will let promoter know.
- 3. Applications for show approval may be accepted and added to the show calender, after Jan 1<sup>st</sup> IF there are dates are available.
- 4. If such an application is satisfactory, the Vice President will issue a statement of official approval to the proposed show. If such application is unsatisfactory, the Vice President will so inform the show committee making application, giving the reason or particulars for disapproval within seven (7) days.
- A show approved by UHC must be open to all members and any individual desiring to enter unless just case can be shown why an individual should be denied the privilege of showing.
- 6. The last approved show must be held by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in October.
- The results of any approved show must be completed in their entirety. The results shall be given to the Points Secretary of the UHC or designated person at the end of said show along with the ORIGINAL JUDGES CARDS SIGNED BY THE JUDGE.
- 8. All shows shall be given a rain date within eight (8) days following the original show

date *or another date may be assigned at the discretion of the Vice President.* In case of a show being cancelled for emergency reasons, the UHC Board shall provide a new date if possible. If the promoter has an additional show date, there is the option of using that date as a double judged show. It will be the promoters responsibility to find the 2<sup>nd</sup> judge for that date, and the judge MUST be from the approved judges list. If your choice for 2<sup>nd</sup> judge is NOT on the approved judges list, UHC board must approve before hiring (in the event that there isn't a board meeting before your next show, judge approval will be at the discretion of the President and Vice President and promoter will be notified).

- 9. Show dates shall be awarded in the following order of preference:
  - A. Charitable/Non-Profit Organizations
  - B. New Charitable/Non-Profit Organizations
  - C. Individual Promoters that sponsored a show last year
  - D. New Promoters

## **JUDGES**

- All judges asked to officiate at a UHC approved show must be approved by the UHC Board of Directors. NO EXCEPTIONS. The judges list, if one is to be distributed for the coming year, must be approved at the October Board of Directors meeting each year so the Vice President & Secretary can advise the show promoters in December of the approved judges.
- 2. A judge may be approved only ONCE during any show season for UHC sanctioned shows and cannot be used at the same show two (2) years in a row.
- The judge must be furnished with a copy of the UHC Rule Book at least one week prior to show date to assure he/she is familiar with the rules and regulations of the UHC.
- 4. No judge shall arrive more than thirty (30) minutes prior to show time.
- 5. The Judge shall not discriminate as to breed, type, class, color, age or sex. The judge shall have the authority to place an exhibitor or horse in whatever position in a class he/she thinks merit of the exhibitor or horse justifies. His/Her decision shall be FINAL. Once a horse has been placed there shall be no changes, with the exception of a class being rerun for any reason, i.e. a protest or similar problem with results.
- The judge shall at all times conduct his/her business with show officials ONLY and be in their company while on the show grounds. THERE SHALL BE NO FRATERNIZATION BETWEEN ANY EXHIBITOR AND THE JUDGE BEFORE AND

#### DURING THE SHOW.

The results of any approved show must be completed in their entirety. The results shall be given to the Points Secretary of UHC or designated person at the end of said show along with the ORIGINAL JUDGES CARDS SIGNED BY THE JUDGE

## RINGMASTER

- 1. Any reputable person may act in the capacity of ringmaster. However, he/she should be familiar with the show rules, ring etiquette, be able to identify safety risks, and to intervene as necessary. He/She must understand that he/she has been selected to help the judge, NOT ADVISE HIM/HER. He/She shall carefully refrain from discussing, or seeming to discuss, the horses or exhibitors with the judge. Ringmaster shall not take part, or seem to take part, in any of the judging.
- 2. He/She must be present when an exhibitor has permission to speak with the judge.
- 3. He/She shall not permit any undue delay of the show progress and shall have the authority to excuse un-sportsmanlike exhibitors from the ring.

## SAFETY

- A youth exhibitor must be able to reach the stirrups at all times during a class with the exception of the "Leadline" class. Exhibitors may not show with feet dangling above stirrups.
- 2. Any horse and/or rider exhibiting unsafe or unpredictable behavior during a class will be immediately excused from the arena for the safety of themselves and other riders and/or horses without refund of show fees. This includes: "excessive" jerking or hitting horse, or cause undue discomfort or distress, during any class, AND/OR on show grounds. Show management and/or Judge reserves the right to ascertain what qualifies as "unsafe and unpredictable" behavior.

## **POINTS & AWARDS**

- 1. UHC shall provide Year End Awards for all Mandatory classes and for those Optional classes which are held at 50% or more UHC approved shows. To be eligible for UHC Year End Awards the exhibitor must be a member in good standing. The horse MUST be registered with the UHC Awards Secretary on the standard form provided. All horses registered in mid-season must be registered in writing on the proper horse registration form. NO OTHER FORM OF REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED. Participation will be counted toward the horse/rider combination, unless the said class is judged on the rider or horse, in which case participation counts on the rider or horse. The horse/rider combination (or rider/or horse, if class is judged on either) receiving the greatest number of points in a class will receive Grand Champion Award, with the second place horse/rider receiving a Reserve Champion Award.
- 2. Points shall be awarded in each class as follows:

```
1 st Place - 5 points
2nd Place - 4 points
3rd Place - 3 points
4th Place - 2 points
5th Place - 1 point
```

- 3. For Showmanship, and Jr/Sr Horse Classes, the points are given to the division at which the exhibitor showed chooses on its entry form. If no request made on entry form, it is at the Points Secretary discretion to choose which division to apply the points, based on what division the exhibitor showed at that show.
- 4. Awards shall be presented as follows:

```
1 st Place - Blue Ribbon
2nd Place - Red Ribbon
3rd Place - Yellow Ribbon
4th Place - White Ribbon
5th Place - Pink Ribbon
```

\*Instead of "Ribbon" an appropriate award would be given in the same color (i.e. cup, koozie)

5. Seventy-five percent (75%) pay back classes shall be as follows:

1-5 horses 1 money (100%)
6-10 horses 2 monies (60%, 40%))
11-15 horses 3 monies (50%, 30%, 20%)
16-20 horses 4 monies (40%, 30%, 20%, and 10%)
25-30 horses 5 monies (40%, 30%, 15%, 10%, and 5%)
PERCENTAGE IS AFTER THE 25% HAS BEEN TAKEN FROM TOTAL NUMBER OF ENTRIES

- 6. At the end of show season Mandatory Classes will be reviewed. A lack of participation can result in the class being removed from the Mandatory Class list and put on the Optional Class list.
- 7. Optional Classes are not required for any UHC Approved Shows. However, Year End Awards will be given if fifty (50) percent of the UHC approved shows offer these classes.
- 8. The Show Chairman may hold any class not listed on the Mandatory and Optional Class Lists, but the UHC Awards Secretary will not tabulate points on such class.
- 9. If any Horse or Exhibitor is found by UHC Points Secretary, to not eligible to be in the class in question, the exhibitor/horse will be disqualified for that classes and no points will be awarded and exhibitor will be notified immediately. If the exhibitor/horse is awarded a placing then the placing will be removed from the point's structure and any one scoring points under that placing will be moved up and points awarded accordingly.
- 10. If there is a discrepancy regarding an exhibitor at a show, by anyone other than show secretary, it MUST be brought to the attention of a UHC board member during that show and discussed immediately.
- 11. In the case of a tie regarding high point winners (High point at an individual show or yearend awards) the winner will be determined by the exhibitor/horse that has won the most 1<sup>st</sup> places, and then which exhibitor/horse entered in the greatest number of classes.

#### **General Rules for UHC Shows**

(santioned show awards may differ)

- 1. Points are accumulated on all mandatory & optional classes If a class is not on the UHC mandatory or optional class list, points from the class will not count toward awards. [Note: Points are based on horse/rider combination excluding Halter)
- 2. All Age Divisions are determined by the age you are on Jan 1 of the current year. No Exceptions will be made. If determined that an exhibitor is showing in wrong age division at a show, and has accumulated points, the points will be removed.
- Class Placings will be available for viewing on website within 10 business days after show.
- 4. If you show WESTERN, your points count toward WESTERN special awards. If you show WORKING WESTERN, your points count toward WORKING WESTERN special awards. If you show HUNT SEAT, your points count toward ENGLISH special awards. If you show SADDLE SEAT, your points count toward ENGLISH special awards.
- 5. In order to qualify for a year end Overall High point & Overall Reserve High Point Award Adult or Youth Western, Working Western, Hunt Seat, or Saddle Type horse/rider combination must accumulate a minimum of 50 points total & be a UHC member.

#### **High Point & Reserve Halter**

- 1. All points for halter follow the **HORSE**.
- 2. Halter points do not count toward Hunt Seat, Saddle Type, or Western overall High Point & Reserve awards.
- 3. For Showmanship, and Jr/Sr Horse Classes, the points are given to the division at which the exhibitor showed chooses on its entry form. If no request made on entry form, it is at the Points Secretary discretion to choose which division to apply the points, based on what division the exhibitor showed at that show.

## High Point Grand & Reserve Awards for Individual Mandatory/Optional

Number of shows required for year end awards, will be set each year by the Board of Directors before the start of show season. It may vary from year to year based on number of shows on the calendar. To qualify for yearend awards, Rider/Handler must be UHC member at time points are won for points to count.

[Note: For individual class awards, points are awarded to the horse/rider combination (except Halter, which points are awarded to the horse)

## **SPECIAL MEDAL PROGRAM**

Open to ANY UHC member & registered horse. *Points for medal awards (gold, silver, and bronze) will be accumulated on the exhibitor only and not the Exhibitor/Horse combination.* This allows exhibitors who show different horses throughout the year to be able to earn enough points for a medal award. **NO 50% RESTRICTION ON PARTICIPATION** ... attendance at any number of shows earns eligibility as long as the Exhibitor earns minimum points as follows:

GOLD-75 POINTS SILVER-50 POINTS BRONZE-25 POINTS

#### YOUTH SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

- 1. Youth must be a UHC member in Good Standing for current year.
- Award is decided by the President with recommendation to be given by youth advisors/director.
- 3. Recipient must show good manners and be willing to help with UHC at any time during the year as well as show good sportsmanship at all UHC functions.

#### YOUTH PARTICIPATION AWARD PROGRAM

To qualify for this program, you must:

- 1. Be a youth member of UHC in good standing.
- 2. Participate in at least 50% of the current years scheduled shows. This can include showing or volunteering.
- 3. Youth must complete proper form and turn it in to the show office or the awards secretary within 15 day of show date.
- 4. Form must be complete. Incomplete forms may not be counted.
- 5. Forms must include the class number and name for each show.

#### ARABIAN/ HALF ARABIAN OVERALL HIGH POINT HORSE AND RIDER AWARDS.

#### ARABIAN RIDER OF THE YEAR AWARD:

## To qualify for this program, you must:

- Rider/Handler MUST be a UHC member and NCAHA member for the current year. Points will be counted as of date joined or renewed in UHC. Horses must be registered with UHC. (NOTE: NCAHA YOUTH associate memberships are free upon application to NCAHA membership secretary.)
- 2. To be awarded to the RIDER/HANDLER with the highest total number of points earned in UHC Mandatory and Optional Classes. Points may be earned on any number or combination of Arabian or Half-Arabian horses registered with UHC at time points are earned.
- 3. Rider must have shown in at least 4 of the UHC sponsored/sanction shows for the year.
- 4. This a perpetual award. Recipient keeps trophy for one year. It is passed on to next year's recipient. Name of recipient is placed on a plate that remains on the award.

## ARABIAN (or Half-Arabian) HORSE AWARD:

#### To qualify for this program, you must:

- 1. ALL Riders/Handlers of the horse must be UHC and NCAHA members for the current year. Points will be counted as of date joined or renewed with UHC, and horse MUST be registered with UHC at time points are earned.
- 2. To be awarded to the HORSE with the highest total number of points earned in UHC Mandatory and Optional Classes. Horse Points may be earned with any number or combination of riders who are UHC and NCAHA members in good standing at time points are earned. (Note: NCAHA Youth associate memberships are FREE upon application to the NCAHA membership secretary.)
- 3. Horse must have shown in at least 4 of the UHC sponsored/sanction shows for the year.
- This a perpetual award. Recipient keeps trophy for one year. It is passed on to next year's recipient. Name of recipient is placed on a plate that remains on the award.

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR ALL CLASSES**

- 1. No membership application shall be back-dated for any reason whatsoever.
- 2. Either, the President, Vice President or Director appointed by the President shall act as a show steward at each UHC approved show. He/She shall have the responsibility to see that UHC rules are enforced at the show; in particular, the steward shall enforce class specifications, regulations and requirements; he or she must advise the judge, ringmaster, show chairman and exhibitors of all infractions and see that steps are taken to correct or rectify matters.
- 3. The show management is responsible to see that the UHC Rules & Regulations are strictly adhered to and properly enforced to the best of their ability. Further, it is the obligation of the show management to provide a safe show environment for all exhibitors and/or participants. The show manager/management shall reserve the right to divide any class that may be deemed unsafe as a result of excessive entries into two or more sections.
- 4. On all Mandatory & Optional Classes the UHC Rules will govern.
- 5. The exhibitor is responsible for errors on entry blank.
- 6. Contestants may enter or leave the ring only at the direction of the judge or ringmaster. Failure to comply will mean disqualification for that class.
- 7. The decision of the show judge shall be FINAL in all cases.
- 8. Competition in ALL AGED Divisions shall be determined by the exhibitor's age as of JANUARY 1 st of current year. An ADULT is 19 years & over and a YOUTH is 18 years & under (broken down in to 14-18 and 13 years & under).
- No horses shall be permitted to enter a class, and no money shall be accepted for any entry into a class after the class has been called to enter the show ring and judging has begun.
- 10. SHOW ANNOUNCERS shall refrain from using the PA system for any reason other than emergencies or as directed by the judge, ringmaster or shows chairman once any class has started competition. Announcements, advertisements, etc., may be made between classes and at intermission.
- 11. SHOW ANNOUNCERS shall be required to give the name of the class and the number of entries only. Horse exhibitor & rider's names may be used to announce the winners.
- 12. Any Mandatory Class listed on a show program must be held as long as there is at least one entry.

- 13. Before any class can be added to the Mandatory Class List, it must first have been on the Optional Class list for at least 1 year and have been held at least 50% of the shows.
- 14. Any Mandatory Class that does not average 3 or more entries at the end of the show season may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be moved to the Optional Class List. Any Optional Class that averages 3 or more entries at the end of the show season may be moved to the Mandatory Class List.
- 15. Classes to be reviewed by the show committee within 45 days after the final show of the season.
- 16. Tack changes are for a maximum of 5 minutes and must be requested in writing on the entry form.
- 17. Two minutes will be allowed for gate calls.
- 18. If a show is stopped due to bad weather, points will count for all classes held.
- 19. All Saddle Type Classes at UHC shows are open to purebred and half bred saddle type & non-stock type horses.
- 20. No officer, director, or member may use their title or association with the UHC in addressing in person, by phone, or any communicative means, a judge or show official when questioning the personal position or use of ones' horse in a show. Violation of the above shall be grounds for suspension of membership under disciplinary procedures.
- 21. A "Go as You Please" class includes a walk and any other gait desired by the rider. These classes are open to Non-trotting horses. Consistency of gaits must be maintained in both directions of the ring.
- 22. Gaited horses are permitted in all GAYP classes as well as any Halter class.
- 23. Time out can be called for equipment failure. Length of time out will be at the discretion of the judge. Exhibitor or representative must request the time out from the Ring Master only.
- 24. There will be a 15-minute break between the halter/showmanship division and the first performance class.
- 25. **ANYONE AT A UHC SHOW**, may be asked to leave a show for any instance of perceived misconduct or endangering other riders/horses/spectators. Following two dismals from shows, the person will be banned from UHC shows for the remainder of the current show season. All incidents of misconduct or endangerment **MUST** be reported to a UHC Officer or show management.

#### HALTER

Colts & Fillies at Halter - 2 & Under
Saddle Type Horse at Halter - Open
Championship Halter - Grand & Reserve (No Entry Fee)
English Horse at Halter - 3 & over - open
Showmanship at Halter - 19 year & Over
Showmanship at Halter - 14 years - 18 years
Showmanship at Halter - 13 years & Under
Western Horse at Halter - 3 & Over - Open
Stock Type Horse at Halter - Open
Ranch Type Horse at Halter - Open
Longe Line - 2yrs & Under - Open

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR ALL HALTER CLASSES**

- 1. For the purpose of determining eligibility for competition, the age of the horse shall be computed by the calendar year, starting on January 1, of the year foaled.
- 2. Horses are to be judged on conformation, substance & quality. Unsoundness is to be counted strongly against.
- 3. If there is a pattern for showmanship, it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

#### Colts & Fillies at Halter - 2 & Under

- 1. To be shown in Halter, or bridle, if English Type.
- 2. To be shown in hand at walk, jog or trot.

#### Saddle Type Horse at Halter

- 1. To be shown in Halter, or bridle, if English Type.
- 2. Horses to enter the ring at a walk, strike a trot as the approach the judge, and trot to their position on the rail.
- 3. Horses should be presented one at a time to judge, trot away from judge and return to line up, and walk a circle on loose lead in both directions, and return to their original positions on the rail for final inspection.
- 4. Horse cannot cross enter into the Stock Type Horse at Halter.

#### English Horse at Halter - 3 & over - open

- 1. To be shown in hand at walk and trot.
- 2. To be shown in English Type Halter or bridle.

3. Horse should be suitable as an English mount.

## Showmanship at Halter - 19 Years & Over

- 1. Western type horse to be shown in Western halter
- 2. English type horse to be shown in English halter or bridle.
- 3. Judged 30% on appearance of horse or pony, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude).
- 4. If there is a pattern it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

## Showmanship at Halter - 14 Years - 18 years

- 1. Western type horse to be shown in Western halter
- 2. English type horse to be shown in English halter or bridle.
- 3. Judged 30% on appearance of horse or pony, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude).
- 4. Exhibitor to be 14 years old to 18 years old as of Jan 1 of current year.
- 5. If there is a pattern it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

## Showmanship at Halter - 13 Years & Under

- 6. Western type horse to be shown in Western halter
- 7. English type horse to be shown in English halter or bridle.
- 8. Judged 30% on appearance of horse or pony, 10% on appearance of exhibitor, and 60% on showmanship (poise, knowledge, alertness and attitude).
- 9. Exhibitor to be 13 years or younger as of Jan 1 of current year.
- 10. If there is a pattern it must be posted prior to the beginning of the show.

#### Western Horse at Halter - 3 & Over - Open

- 1. To be shown in Western Halter.
- 2. To be shown in hand at walk and jog.
- 3. Horse should be suitable as a Western mount.

#### Stock Type Horse at Halter - Open

This includes all Quarter Horses, Paints, Appaloosas, and any horse fitting this general classification (registration papers are not required).

- 1. To be shown in Western OR English Halter/Bridle.
- 2. To be shown in hand at walk and jog or trot.
- 3. Horse should be suitable as a Western or Hunt Seat mount.
- 4. Horse cannot cross enter into the Saddle Type Horse at Halter

## Championship Halter-Grand & Reserve (No Entry Fee)(No Points)

- 1. Open to 1st & 2<sup>nd</sup> Place Horses from that show's Halter Classes
- 2. To be shown in Halter, or bridle, if English Type.
- 3. To be shown in hand at walk, jog or trot.

## Ranch Type Horse at Halter - Open

- 1. Horses to be shown in plain, clean and functional, western tack.
- 2. Rider attire will be jeans (such as blue, black, dark brown, dark gray) and a long-sleeved collared shirt, cowboy boots and a cowboy hat or approved helmet. A conservative scarf around the neck is also optional.
- 3. Tack should be traditional and conservative in appearance and should not display extraordinary silver or other decorations other than normal buckles and connecters. Judge may fault exhibitors who are in violation of the intent of this rule.
- 4. No banded or braided manes, or hoof black will be allowed.
- 5. To be shown in hand at walk and jog.

## Longe Line - 2yrs & Under -

The purpose of showing a horse on a longe line is to demonstrate that the horse has the movement, manners, expression, attitude, and conformation to become competitive under saddle. Therefore, the purpose of this class is to reward:

- 1. Quality of movement
- 2. Manners/Expression/Attitude
- 3. Conformation suitable to future performance, and the horse should be judged with its suitability as a future performer under saddle in mind.
- 4. This class should define what it means to be a "Western pleasure prospect" or "hunter under saddle prospect."
- 5. Because these are 2-year-olds and under, they are not expected to demonstrate the behavior or quality of a finished show horse, but only that performance necessary for a reasonable presentation to the judge.

The exhibitor will enter the longeing area and await the audible start signal. When the signal is given, the exhibitor will be allowed 1 ½ minutes (90 seconds) to present the horse. At the end of 1 ½ minutes, a signal will be given again to signify the end of the demonstration. Show management has the option of adding a "half-way" signal if they choose. (The signal may be a bell, whistle or announcement.) Once the class has started, horses warming up prior to their go may only warm up at the walk. The horse will be scored at the walk, jog or long trot, and lope or canter in both directions. Exhibitors may begin work in the direction of their choice (counter or clockwise). Horses are to be shown in a halter. Either a regular or a show type halter is acceptable.

#### PERFORMANCE CLASSES

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR ALL PERFORMANCE CLASSES**

- 1. Martingales, tie-downs, mechanical hackamores, draw reins, and gag bits are prohibited except in training classes, or exhibitor is a youth and requires the use of equipment to insure safety.
- 2. Horses to be shown with correct, suitable English or Western attire. Formal dress with coat is not required. However, APPROPRIATE HAT AND BOOTS OR SHOES WITH A HEEL ARE REQUIRED in all performance classes.
- 3. To be eligible to show in the 75% payback Championship classes, entries must have shown in at least 1 (one) other class in that division. (i.e. Western or English)
- 4. Horses may be shown in all Open English classes under either, Hunt Seat or Saddle Seat attire and tack.
  - A. Dressage saddles with straight smooth leather flaps may be used in saddle seat classes provided saddle seat bridle is used.
  - B. Horses may be shown in any standard, English single bit, pelham or double bridle. Curb chains allowed on curbs, pelhams or kimberwicks. Curb chains may be wrapped.
  - C. Whips, spurs, or crops are optional in all English Classes.
  - D. English sidesaddles are allowed in all English and open classes.
  - E. Light contact must be maintained with all reins at all gaits.
  - F. Dressage Saddle may be used in all hunt seat classes provided an English-type bridle without a flash noseband is used.
  - G. Martingales and/or tie-downs will be allowed for breed specifics.
- 5. In all Western classes horses shall be shown in a western saddle.
  - A. Silver equipment will not count over a good working outfit. Western Sidesaddles are allowed in all Western & open classes.
  - B. In all Western classes horses 5 years and under may be shown in any class in snaffle, bosal, or curb. Horses 6 years and over may only be shown in a curb. Curb chains are permissible, but must meet the approval of the judge. No wire curbs (regardless of how padded or covered), nor any chain strap narrower than one-half inch will be permitted.
  - C. In all Western classes reins shall be held in one hand and cannot be changed during performance. Hand to be around reins. One finger between reins is permitted with split reins. No finger between reins with the use of a romel. The romel must be carried a minimum of 15" from rein hand. Horses shown in a snaffle bit or bosal must be shown with both hands on reins.
  - D. Chaps, spurs, rope and riata are optional in all Western classes.
- 6. Horses may be backed in all classes (English, Western, and Open) at the Judge's discretion.

- 7. Horses to be judged on performance, manners and conformation.
- 8. If deemed safe by the judge, horses may be reversed at the jog or trot. Horses shall not be asked to reverse at the lope or canter.
- 9. Horses to be worked both ways of the ring at all required gaits in all classes.
- 10. Novice Rider or Horse Rule- Rider maintains a Novice status by division (ie. English, Western/Working Western). Once the rider wins the 5<sup>th</sup> blue ribbon (must be at least 3 entries in the class for the 1st place to count) in a division, then they are no longer Novice for that specific division following the current show season. However, the rider may remain a Novice rider in a separate division. First places earned in Novice classes at any show, regardless of organization/affiliation, in which there are a minimum of 3 exhibitors in the class count toward the total of 5 first places.
- 11. If found that Novice qualifications are not met, points for that class will not count towards year end awards.

- e. Carry object from one part of arena to another. Only safe and reasonable objects that can be carried on a trail ride may be used.
- f. Back horse through "L" shaped course.
- g. A Slicker.
- h. Ride over or dismount & lead horse over safe obstacle not less than 14" high or over 24" high.
- i. Remove & replace materials from a mailbox.
- j. Back through and around three markers set either in a triangle or a line.
- k. Side pass.
- I. Turn inside a square, not less than five feet (5').

THE GAIT BETWEEN OBSTACLES WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGE.

## Ride-A-Buck

- No saddles allowed.
- 2. Riders will hold a one-dollar bill between their bodies and their horse either by sitting on it or gripping it with their legs or knees.
- 3. Once class starts riders may not touch the dollar bill with their hands or they will be disqualified.
- 4. Gaits may be called at judge's discretion and must be executed promptly by participants.
- 5. Judge may not call for unsafe movements.
- 6. Riders are eliminated for losing their dollar bill. Last rider to keep grip on his/her dollar wins.

## Jack Benny Go As You Please

- 1. Riders must admit to being 39 years old or older.
- 2. Horses to be shown at a walk and any other gait. "Other" gait must be the same both ways of the ring.

## Open Pleasure Driving

- 1. Horse or pony to be shown to safe and suitable 2-wheeled vehicle.
- 2. Shown at a walk, trot, and strong or road trot. Excessive speed will be penalized.
- 3. A walk should be called for after strong or road trot.
- 4. Horses to be reversed ONLY AT A WALK.
- 5. Horses will be required to stand quietly and back readily.
- 6. Handlers to be allowed in the lineup.

## Assisted Walk Only - Open

- 1. Trainer or parent must accompany rider by walking beside the horse and rider or leading with a slack lead line.
- 2. The class will be worked at a walk only both directions of the ring.
- 3. In the line-up the judge may ask the exhibitors to back up their horses to help him or her judge the extent of the exhibitor's horsemanship.
- 4. The exhibitor will be judged on his or her basic position in the saddle: Hand position, seat position, and back position. (hands on reins, feet in stirrups)
- 5. The exhibitor may ride Western or English in this class.
- 6. This class is limited to exhibitors 8 years old and under who do not participate in any approved class at that show except Showmanship and Halter.

## Pony Go As You Please - Open

- 1. Horses are to be shown at a walk and any other gait. "Other" gait must be the same both ways of the ring.
- 2. Limited to ponies that are 14.2 hands or under.

## Calcutta -

All participating horses will enter the arena and line up on the rail. Each horse is pulled off the rail individually and presented to the spectators, at the gait of their choice. The spectators will then "place bids" on that horse/rider, as to whether they think this combination will win the class. After each exhibitor has been presented and bid on by the spectators, they will be placed on the rail and judged at a walk and a gait of your choice. Same gaits must be performed in both directions.

All monies generated by the "bids" will be grouped as follows: 20% will go to UHC, 50% will go to the first place winner of the class (to be split 25% to the exhibitor and 25% to the winning bidder), 30% will go to the winner of the placing chosen by the club before the class begins (this could be  $2^{nd} - 5^{th}$  placing) (to be split 15% to the exhibitor and 15% to the winning bidder).
