Midsummer Festival Viking Village

The genesis of our group was a handful of people who wanted to continue the Viking Village at the Scandinavian Midsummer Festival in Burnaby, British Columbia. A handful of individuals formed the nucleus of the group and in 2004 a small Village was set up at the Midsummer Festival. In the five years since the Viking Village has grown from two tents to twelve. Visitors step back into time and visit a Viking encampment where a wide range of historically accurate activities are taking place.

Our Midsummer Festival often includes a dramatic presentation of a piece of Norse culture. We have held a bride price negotiation and an Althing which included the resolution of disputes by lawspeakers and a dispute that resulted in combat.

Other Events

We have produced Viking Age encampments and displays at the White Rock Museum and Archives, Reach, Abbotsford Museum and Surrey Museum. For three years now we have also participated in an historical timeline event hosted by the Pacific Association for Recreating the Middle Ages (PARMA). This is a week-long event which is held at the Fort Rodd Hill National Historic Park, Victoria, over the week including the July 1st Canada Day holiday.
