POSITION SUMMARY

The Indigenous Certified Diabetes Educator (CDE) provides culturally safe, trauma-informed diabetes education and support to Indigenous clients across the lifespan. This role blends Western clinical expertise with Indigenous cultural knowledge, land-based practices, and community-led wellness approaches. The ideal candidate builds strong relationships, supports self-determination in health, and is passionate about improving diabetes outcomes within Indigenous communities.

Key Responsibilities

Client Care & Education

- Provide one-on-one and group diabetes education (prevention, management, nutrition, medications, glucose monitoring, insulin therapy, foot care, and lifestyle strategies).
- Create individualized diabetes care plans that incorporate traditional food knowledge, cultural practices, and community needs.
- Support clients in understanding their diagnosis, lab results, and treatment options in clear, culturally appropriate ways.
- Assist with screening, monitoring, and follow-up for diabetes-related complications.

Cultural Integration

- Incorporate Indigenous wellness perspectives, traditional foods, land-based activities, and cultural teachings into education and programming.
- Work collaboratively with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, Traditional Healers, and community partners.
- Support culturally grounded diabetes prevention initiatives such as cooking programs, traditional food gatherings, and movement-based cultural activities.
