- R**ighteous, rock-solid in heart and mind, from a growing relationship with Jesus.

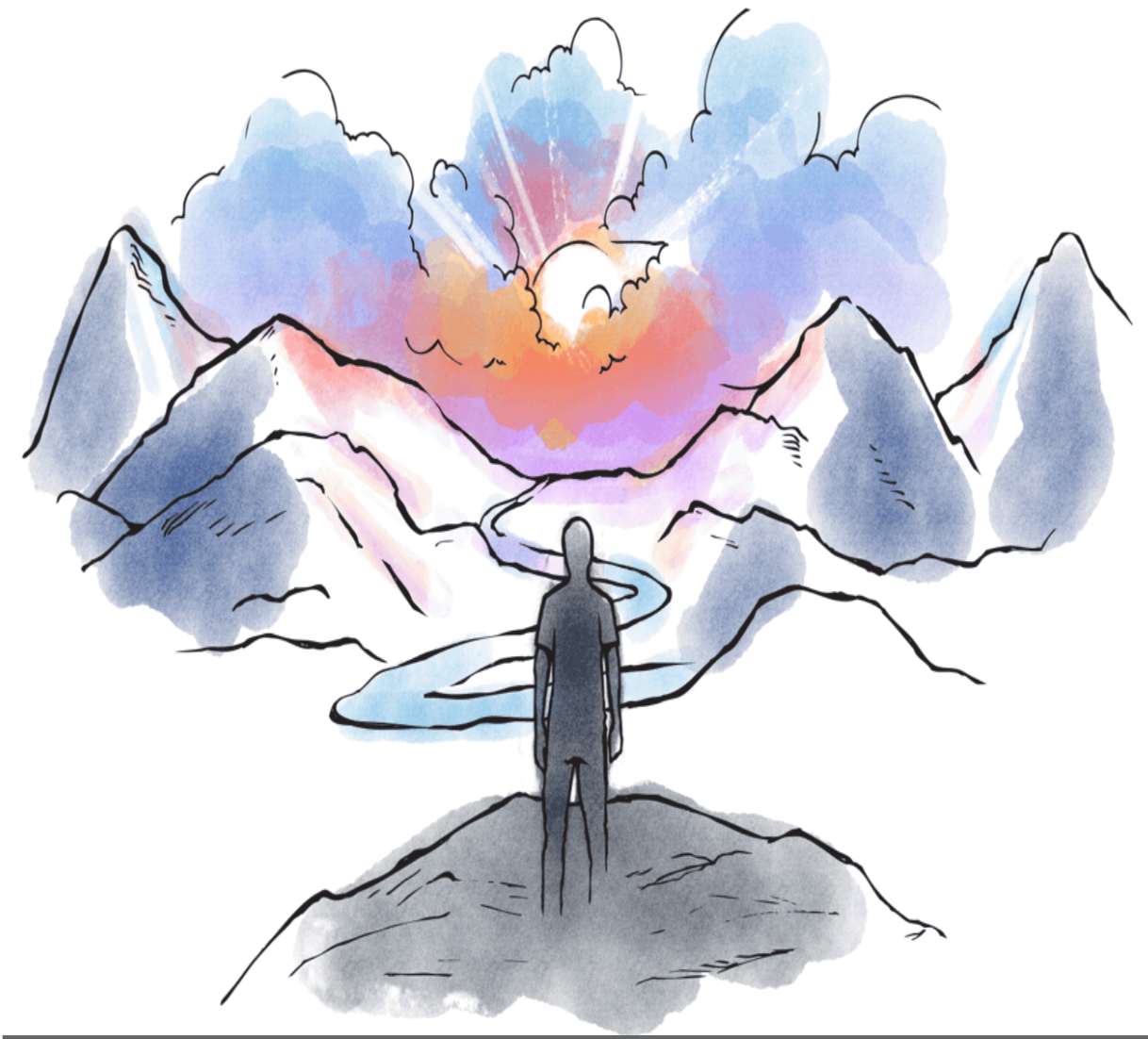
