Cindy Wenberg (poll worker) says:
"I wanted to get involved in the election, so

I could see for myself the election process. This was my second election working as one of two printer judges at St. John Neumann Church.

My position entails setting up the printer, manually printing out a ballot that has been spoiled, and checking to make sure the ballot printed matches the receipt that the voter has in hand.

I do that by matching their party and precinct. If everything matches I collect their receipt, give them their ballot and they go vote.

I have to reconcile at the end of the night with receipts collected and ballots printed. If election integrity is a top priority for you, please get involved in the process."

## **Our Meeting Speakers**

Art Morales - Went through his background so listeners see how he is committed to our community. He wants to get together with the community members to listen to us. He brought the QR code to scan that takes us to the city's website (specifically, the city

council's meeting agendas).

Randy Nelson - He's a candidate for the Hospital District Board. Told his background story. He's been on many boards (not as an elected official) like the Yuma County Airport Board. He has a lot of business know-how. The Hospital District Board has to do with land the hospital uses, etc.

It has nothing to do with the hospital daily operational practices. The important issue here is the communication between the Hospital District Board and the Hospital Operational Board.

**Tanya Wright** spoke about the importance of educating voters regarding early voting: Late EARLY ballots are the holdup. <u>EARLY ballots must be turned in EARLY, NOT on Election Day because of all of the verification processes they have to go through.</u> It takes time to verify each and if there are discrepancies, the voter is contacted in which then they enter into a 5-day ballot curating period.

We definitely don't want these kinds of delays! The final results, as of now, will be ready in about 9 days AFTER the Primary Election Day. This cannot happen again. If a voter didn't turn in their early ballot in time (before election day), it is best for them to use the early ballot as a cheat sheet on election day and request a new ballot then relinquish the early ballot.

<u>Benefits of turning in early ballots early:</u> you secure your vote, you stop receiving those pesky "vote for me" texts from 10 different candidates a day and you help the GOP save time and money by not having to chase your vote.
