Dear Faithful Patriots,



14 U.S Cities Planning to Ban Meat, Dairy, Private Cars by 2030

14 American cities have set a "target" to comply with the World Economic Forum's (WEF) green agenda goals by banning meat, dairy, and private car ownership by 2030.

The U.S. cities have formed a coalition called the "C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group" (C40).

The C40 has established an "ambitious target" to meet the WEF's goals by the year 2030.

To fulfill the "target," the C40 Cities have pledged that their residents will comply with the following list of mandatory rules:

- "o kg [of] meat consumption"
- "o kg [of] dairy consumption"
- "3 new clothing items per person per year"
- "o private vehicles" owned
- "1 short-haul return flight (less than 1500 km) every 3 years per person"

The C40 Cities' dystopian goals can be found in its " <u>The Future of Urban Consumption in a 1.5°C World</u>" report.

The report was published in 2019 and reemphasized in 2023.

The organization is headed and largely funded by Democrat billionaire Michael Bloomberg.

Nearly 100 cities across the world make up the organization.







From the Arizona Constitution Article 2:

1. Fundamental principles; recurrence to

Section 1. A frequent recurrence to fundamental principles is essential to the security of individual rights and the perpetuity of free government.

2. Political power; purpose of government

Section 2. All political power is inherent in the people, and governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed, and are established to protect and maintain individual rights.

21. Free and equal elections

Section 21. All elections shall be free and equal, and no power, civil or military, shall at any time interfere to prevent the free exercise of the right of suffrage.

32. Constitutional provisions mandatory

Section 32. The provisions of this Constitution are mandatory, unless by express words they are declared to be otherwise.

33. Reservation of rights

Section 33. The enumeration in this Constitution of certain rights shall not be construed to deny others retained by the people.
