We have 3 new items for donation, "Don't Tread On Me"patches for \$2 and two hat buttons with the Arizona Flag and Conservative Republicans with an elephant for \$2 each.

**Old Business:** We signed up 7 new members and had 7 registrations at the BBQ and Brew Fest, and brought in a large amount of donations for merchandise. We also secured several voter registrations at the March 7<sup>th</sup> Arms Unlimited event.

**New Business:** We will have a booth at the 10<sup>th</sup> Yuma year celebration on April13 – 10Am-6PM.

**Steve Markgart** is one of our speakers this evening. He is a candidate for AZ House LD 25. He is a conservative who wants to preserve our beautiful state of Arizona. He is tough on the **Border** and said the illegals and drugs coming across the order were a planned invasion. Patriots need to be loud, don't give up. We need DJT back in the White House. He is an advocate on **Education** which should consist of reading, writing and arithmetic. History and civics should be required in the curriculum and the Pledge of Allegiance needs to be included. His views on the **Election Process** are that we need to go back to one day voting, paper ballots and no mail in ballots.

**Tim Dunn** is our featured speaker tonight. He served in the AZ House for 12 years and is now running as a candidate for the AZ Senate. He was born and raised in Yuma with a strong background in farming, agriculture and Vice President of the Farm Bureau. He introduced a bill on ballot harvesting and if a person is convicted they cannot run for or hold office. Mr Dunn currently has 25 bills going to the Senate. Hobbs has vetoed 32 bills and passed just 24 from the House to the Senate. She vetoes everything that would help the people of Arizona. Representative Dunn is asking for your vote for Senate based on his experience over these past 12 years in the House.

**Good of the Order:** Greg Wilkinson – Republican GOP Chair, spoke to us about a rally in Somerton for LD23 Michele Pena and Michelle Atherr on March 23<sup>rd</sup> from 12-4 PM. Greg said there are 36 delegates from Yuma with only 20% currently registered. Neil gave us an update on the latest "Forbidden Information". Gilbert said we will not have a booth at the county fair but you can still get involved in other events taking place. Gilbert adjourned the meeting at 7:36 PM.
