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Arkansas's Original Corps of Engineers Lake

Nimrod Lake

Just west of the intersection of Scenic 7 Byway and State Hwy 60, this 3,550-acre lake is Arkansas's oldest lake created by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Legendary for its great crappie fishing, it also offers good fishing for largemouth bass, bream, and catfish. Recreation areas on the lake offer campsites, playgrounds, swimming areas, fish cleaning stations, & picnic shelters.

Free-Flowing and Wild...

South Fourche River

One of the few free-flowing streams in the Ouachita Mountains, the South Fourche LaFave River offers great fishing year-round and canoeing and kayaking opportunities in the winter/spring months.

The South Fourche Recreation Area is located just south of Hollis at the Scenic Highway 7 Bridge over the river. The park is a great place for a picnic and it offers camping and access to the South Fourche.



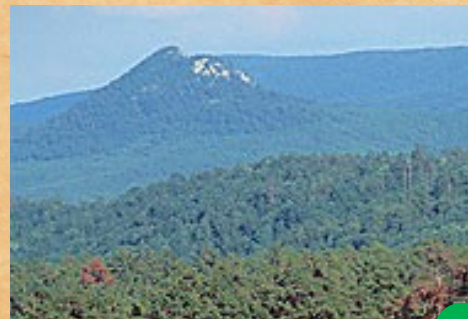

Mountain of Beauty & Legend

Forked Mountain

One of Arkansas's most photographed mountains, this iconic mountain rises above the South Fourche Valley with beautiful views in every direction.

Native American legend says this unique peak was formed from ill-fated love between two members of competing tribes. Forked Mountain can be reached by turning east on Trail 86 Road, just south of Hollis and very popular with hikers.



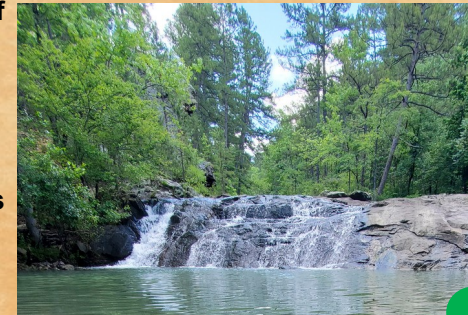
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A Beautiful Waterfall in the Flatside Wilderness Area

Forked Mountain Falls

Surrounded by natural beauty in the 9,500 acre Flatside Wilderness Area, Forked Mountain Falls is a beautiful waterfall and accessed from a 3 mile, out-and-back trail that begins and ends at the Forked Mountain Bluff Site just off of Trail 86, east of Forked Mountain.

The trail winds its way along Cedar Creek, following an old logging road that ends at the falls. And in the summertime, it makes a great swimming hole (water permitting).

Telling the Story of the Civilian Conservation Corps

Hollis CCC Camp

This roadside park - just south of Hollis on Scenic 7 Byway - tells the story of the Hollis Civilian Conservation Corp (CCC) Camp, a Depression-era program designed to provide much-needed employment and develop the country's natural resources.

Walk the park's trails and view exhibits on life in the camp as well as many of the building foundations and similar items that remain.



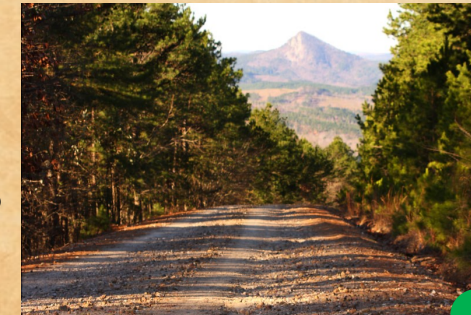

Enjoy an Auto Tour of the Ouachita National Forest

Winona Drive

This 27-mile gravel road travels through the Ouachita National Forest and offers beautiful mountain views and the feeling of being in the wilderness, while still in your automobile.

The drive begins south of Hollis on Scenic 7 Byway and travels east to where it comes out on State Hwy 9, just a short drive south of Lake Sylvia, part of the Arkansas State Parks system.



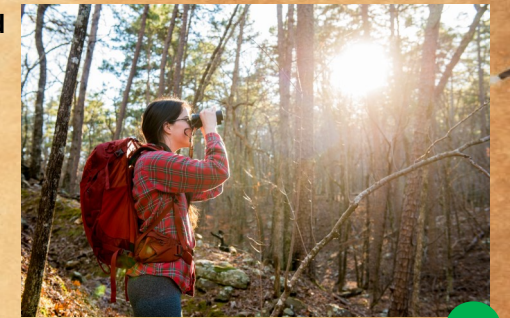
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A National Recreation Trail Connecting Two States

Ouachita Trail

Stretching for 233 miles from Eastern Oklahoma to Pinnacle Mountain State Park just west of Little Rock, this trail is a great way for outdoor lovers to enjoy and experience the beauty and nature of the Ouachita Mountains.

The Hwy 7 Trailhead is located just north of Iron Springs Recreation Area and offers a convenient location to access the trail, whether going east or west.



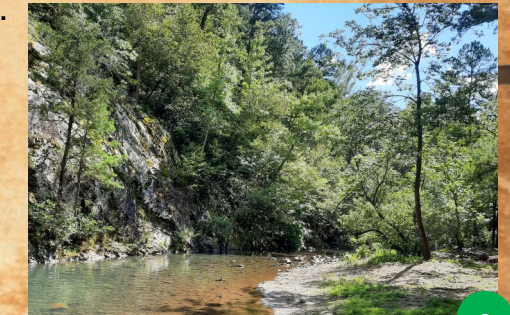
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Picnic Alongside a Mountain Stream

Iron Springs Rec. Area

This popular day use area is located alongside Scenic Highway 7 and is a true roadside oasis. Surrounded by natural beauty in a natural gorge area, it is a wonderful place to enjoy a picnic, skip rocks, or take a hike.

The 4.3 mile Hunt's Loop Trail begins and ends at Iron Springs and offers panoramic views and a chance to view the park's namesake springs
