BRIEF ORDER FOR CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS p. 56 L: In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and the Holy Spirit. C: Amen.

L: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.

L: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Silence for self-reflection

L: Most merciful God,

C: we confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. FIRST READING: Amos 8:4-7

L: The First Lesson is from the 8th chapter of Amos.

4 Hear this, you who trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land,

5 saying, "When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain,

and the Sabbath,

so that we may offer wheat for sale?

We will make the ephah smaller and the shekel heavier and practice deceit with false balances,

6 buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals and selling the sweepings of the wheat."

7 The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will never forget any of their deeds.

PSALM 113

1 Praise the Lord!

Praise, O servants of the Lord; praise the name of the Lord.

- 2 Blessed be the name of the Lord from this time on and forevermore.
- 3 From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised.
- 4 The Lord is high above all nations and his glory above the heavens.
- 5 Who is like the Lord our God, who is seated on high,
- 6 who looks far down on the heavens and the earth?

7 He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ash heap,8 to make them sit with princes, with the princes of his people.9 He gives the barren woman a home, making her the joyous mother of children.Praise the Lord!


SECOND READING: 1 Timothy 2:1-15

L: The Second Lesson is from the 2nd chapter of 1 Timothy.

2 First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, 2 for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. 3 This is right and acceptable before God our Savior, 4 who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. 5 For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, 6 who gave himself a ransom for all - this was attested at the right time. 7 For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth; I am not lying), a teacher of the gentiles in faith and truth. 8 I desire, then, that in every place the men should pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or argument, 9 also that the women should dress themselves in moderate clothing with reverence and self-control, not with their hair braided or with gold, pearls, or expensive clothes, 10 but with good works, as is proper for women who profess reverence for God. 11 Let a woman learn in silence with full submission. 12 I do not permit a woman to teach or to have authority over a man; she is to keep silent. 13 For Adam was formed first, then Eve, 14 and Adam was not deceived, but the woman was deceived and became a transgressor. 15 Yet she will be saved through childbearing, provided they continue in faith and love and holiness, with self-control.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 16:1-15

L: The Holy Gospel according to St Luke, the 16th chapter.





16 Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. 2 So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.' 3 Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. 4 I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' 5 So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' 6 He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down guickly, and make it fifty.' 7 Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' 8 And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. 9 And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes. 10 "Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is

dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. 11 If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? 12 And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? 13 No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth." 14 The Pharisees, who were lovers of money, heard all this, and they ridiculed him. 15 So he said to them, "You are those who justify yourselves in the sight of others, but God knows your hearts, for what is prized by humans is an abomination in the sight of God.





L: Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray...


C: Our Father, who art in heaven,

PREPARING FOR THE LORD'S SUPPER

We believe that Holy Communion is a gift of Christ to His Church. However, all who receive this gift must first examine themselves. "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup." – 1 Corinthians 11:28

Therefore, prayerfully consider the following:

- Do I believe that I am a sinner without hope of eternal life except for God's mercy offered through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ?
- Do I repent of my sins in thought, word and behavior?
- Do I believe that Jesus Christ is God's Son and my Savior?
- Do I believe that Jesus Christ is personally and physically present in Communion with His Body and Blood?
- Do I desire by God's power and God's Word to live a life pleasing to Him?

We believe your "Yes!" to these questions affirms a common faith with confirmed Lutheran Christians and is your invitation to Communion.

We encourage non-communing children to accompany their parents for a personal blessing. White grape juice is available.
