"By Who's Authority?"

"Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also because of conscience. This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. Give everyone what you owe him: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor." [Romans 13:1,5-7NIV]

In case you haven't noticed it, we're in an election year. Given this is our every-four-year-cycle of major as well as minor elections, we have been and will continue to be bombarded by news and advertising about all of the races that are ongoing. Frankly this year seems crazier than usual, what with a pandemic and civil unrest added into the mix. Many of us might be wondering if this is a sign of the apocalypse. As it is, in many of the races, it seems that what we are hearing from those who are running for office is the same that has been said in the past. One candidate says they are the best while dismissing the other candidate's credentials. Another candidate claims to be able to solve all of the woes of the electorate if only they would vote for him/her. And no doubt the level of anger from all of the candidates

As we move through these summer months, when we'll be subject to pseudoconventions and ever-increasing political ads in what seems to be a very long election cycle, I believe it is instructive to remember by whose authority elected public servants get their authority. As we read in the text above, "there is no authority except which God has established". In the Kingdom of God, the Redeemer rules all regenerate believers through Jesus and the gospel in personal faith and love. In the king-

dom of men, the Creator rules all sinful but rational creatures through the state and the law in civil justice and order. As both Redeemer and Creator, God is at once the Lord of both kingdoms; as both righteous and sinful, the Christian is at once a subject of both kingdoms. Therefore whether we are empowered by Christ in faith-activated love (Christian righteousness) or compelled by the laws and statues of the state in law-abiding reason (civil righteousness), the Christian citizen lives not for himself but for the benefit of others.

Notice I used the phrase "public *servants*". The men and women who govern are God's servants and as a consequence are not to use their authority for private gain or to place an undue burden on the populace, but to do all in the name of love and for the benefit of our neighbors. In the Old Testament we have the biblical witness where God overthrows those in power who abuse that power. In today's representative democracy we have the responsibility and the ability to decide if our public servants are using the authority given to them wisely. As we get ready to enter the voting booths on November 3rd, let us seek God's guidance in our choices. And let us remember it is by God's authority that we all answer to.

HOW LUTHER'S ROSE SUMMARIZES THE GOSPEL


The most enduring symbol of the Lutheran Reformation is the seal that Luther himself designed to represent his theology. By the early 1520s, this seal begins to appear on the title page of Luther's works.

Here is how Luther himself explained its meaning:

First, there is a black cross in a heart that remains its natural color. This is to remind me that it is faith in the Crucified One that saves us. Anyone who believes from the heart will be justified (Romans 10:10). It is a black cross, which mortifies and causes pain, but it leaves the heart its natural color. It doesn't destroy nature, that is to say, it does not kill us but keeps us alive, for the just shall live by faith in the Crucified One (Romans 1:17). The heart should stand in the middle of a white rose. This is to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace—it puts the believer into a white, joyous rose. Faith does not give peace and joy like the world gives (John 14:27). This is why the rose must be white, not red. White is

the color of the spirits and angels (cf. Matthew 28:3; John 20:12). This rose should stand in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that a joyful spirit and faith is a beginning of heavenly, future joy, which begins now, but is grasped in hope, not yet fully revealed. Around the field of blue is a golden ring to symbolize that blessedness in heaven lasts forever and has no end. Heavenly blessedness is exquisite, beyond all joy and better than any possessions, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal.
