

Brett Houldin is the General Manager of Racing's North Turn Restaurant, which he is proud to say is the most "dog friendly restaurant in the entire Volusia County." Brett had been running restaurants for over 25 years and was working in south Florida, when he was invited to interview for the position of General Manager at Racing's North Turn at 4511 South Atlantic Avenue in Ponce Inlet. In case you didn't know, it is on the site where auto racing began on the beach in 1936. The restaurant also houses a Racing Museum where you'll see iconic photos and items from racing's past and maybe, even catch a glimpse of some of today's NASCAR drivers in town to take on the curves at Daytona International Speedway.

Owners Brad and Mary Hoffman had a vision of a "very family oriented" restaurant. They began by having steps installed down to the beach, opening an area with games for the kids and entertainment, mainly in the evening. Then the second step was to make it VERY dog friendly. Being at the helm of a dog friendly restaurant in Florida is not new to Brett. In both Amelia Island and Hallandale Beach, he saw how much people enjoyed bringing their pets and 30 to 40 dogs at a time was not unusual!

Brett says, helping animals has always been a big part of his life. "Whether it was a pet shop or a zoo, they all had my name and number and would call if they needed help. I had possums, raccoons, skunks, prairie dogs, hedgehogs, you name the animal, I've had them over the years and found good homes for them!"

When he heard about the Dog Beach trial program in Ormond Beach, Brett said he was "thrilled" because they had "lots of dog beaches in southern Florida" and he wanted to get involved. "More people enjoy the animals in the restaurant and there has yet to be a single complaint at this restaurant."

And it's not only dogs. Right next door from Racing's North Turn Restaurant is the Marine Science Center. Turtles are part of the community too! He and his wife Cathy are getting involved with as many animal organizations as they can. Their dog "Roxy" is a "Frenchie," and he describes her as "the most curious dog I've ever had and goes everywhere with me."

Pet parents and enjoy "Canines and Cocktails" Monday through Thursday from 2 to 5pm. Racing's North Turn has a dog menu, but dogs are not their only pet guests. Brett says, "there have been parrots on people's shoulders, a cat, a rabbit once, all are welcome." That's why he encourages any who have anything to do with animals to hold their events with them or just drop off a donation box.

Brett invites you to pack up your pet and plan a visit to Racing's North Turn Restaurant. "Make sure you come and meet me when you come in. I want to meet everyone in the community and your animals! My staff and I will help you with any event you have going on!"

If you ask Joe Piaskowski..how did you get here? He may tell you what he told me, "Just like the Beatles song, it was a Long and Winding Road." Joe says when he graduated High School in 1993, he joined the Navy and spent 3 years doing many different jobs. While he was in the Navy his family moved from Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, to Florida. When he was discharged, he came to join them in Florida. His career in the service industry (which he describes as a long and interesting trip), spans 26 years and says, "I've done it all, seen it all and I'm very happy".

He has worked at many major restaurants in town, from beach bars to seafood restaurants and everything in between. He took a break from the service industry for a few years to explore his other passion in life: Photography. He has since returned to the restaurant industry and landed as the General Manager of Dalmare Italian Chophouse 814 South Atlantic Ave, in Ormond Beach.

Joe says Dalmare is a "fusion of an Italian Restaurant and a Chophouse and our goal is to offer the best of

both worlds." Since Dalmare, which is Italian for "By the Sea," is right across the street from the beach, they feature "a coastal beach theme which is reflected in our cocktails and our menu." Hungry? How about lobster pasta, coastal clam linguine, salmon done with a cedar plank for a more smoky flavor and of course big flavor steaks and chops. Joe tells me "Everyone is welcome and being right across from the beach, it's all very casual."

The growing clientele at Dalmare includes the four-legged kind. They have an outdoor patio where dogs are welcome to join their humans while they dine, Sunday through Thursday 4p-9p and 4p to 10p on Friday and Saturday. Joe says if your pup is hungry, they will be happy to make something just for them. Your dog might be star struck when musician Bernie Boehm performs at Dalmare. He brings his dog and loyal companion Luna, who he calls up to strum on the guitar on the song "Little Luna."

Joe is excited to include pets at Dalmare. He was 6 years old, and his first pet was "Barker and he was the cutest beagle ever, he followed me everywhere!" Currently Joe has three dogs, "a mixed breed named Champ, a Boston Terrier/Chihuahua mix named Logan, and a Jack Russell Terrier/Chihuahua mix named Red. They are the loves of my life, my children."

Since one entrance to Dog Beach is right across the street, constructing the patio for pets and owners was in keeping with the beach theme. He points to the large community of dog owners and dog lovers in the area and is happy to be able to welcome all creatures and he finds customers are more than happy to have them there too.

Dalmare Italian Chophouse is not your "traditional Italian restaurant." They do pasta but with a different beachy theme. It's casual, wear your flip flops! Pets are always welcome on the patio.

Joe says it best! "We are here, we are ready to serve you, and we look forward to seeing you ALL for dinner."

## **Nancy Slade**

*A (Dogs Are Welcome) Vacations  
Property Owner*

If you travel with your dog, you know it can be challenging, and you have to make many arrangements. You find most places... "allow" dogs. Now meet a woman who says, "I WELCOME THEM." and when you meet Nancy Slade, you will find that is a HUGE difference.

Nancy has been a vacationer in New Smyrna Beach since 1992. In 2006 she married Ed, and their conversations began to include "we wished we could buy a place, at our happy place. If we had our own place here, then we would welcome dogs." That conversation happened more often over the years and in 2019 they began to look for property, beachside in New Smyrna. Nancy said they could find many properties where owners could have dogs, but renters could not. Their search brought them to Sea Woods, a 53-acre beachside community where they purchased their first condo in 2022.

Nancy says many rentals are afraid to host dogs, but she feels her "best guests are dog owners." Owners arrive at her condos with their dog to find neither of them will want for anything. For the pups she wants it to feel like home. Relax on the furniture or sleep in bed with pet parents? Of course! She supplies, treats and bowls, throws for the furniture, beach towels, toys, brooms, lint rollers, and more. You just bring food, collar and leash! Each dog gets their own souvenir toy (Todd the Turtle, Flo the Flamingo, Chloe the Clown Fish, or Sally the Star Fish) and homemade dog treats provided from a local vendor.

The first thing guests read is "Kick off your shoes, relax and stay awhile." Nancy explains "no one wants to just arrive at a condo and then have to run out to buy things." She tells me, "I'm not just an invisible investor, I am in the hospitality business, and I take that very seriously."

After the first year, the response from guests, and not all her guests have dogs, but both two- and four-legged response was so positive, a second vacation condo at Sea Woods was added. Nancy soon found she was getting inquiries from other owners who had requests from guests with dogs. She became what she calls an "accidental co-host." She's now involved with eight other condos, a single-family pool home (most recently enjoyed by two Chesapeake Bay retrievers) and a duplex. A question from many of her guests is, where can we bring our dogs? She would tell them of the lovely dog beach at New Smyrna Dunes Park on the Inlet. Then she began to learn more about a "pilot dog beach" program, that was then getting underway from Milsap to Rockefeller on Ormond Beach. Knowing this would be an additional great opportunity, Nancy got involved. Now as you walk the beach, you'll see a doggy bag dispenser sponsored by "Sea Mist Escape, Dog Friendly Beachside Vacation Condo, New Smyrna Beach."

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



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# What We've Accomplished

In September, we launched our sponsorship of three Fill A Bag Stations on Ormond's dog-friendly beach. Strategically situated at Rockefeller, River Beach, and Milsap Road beach areas, these stations beckon everyone to join forces with our dedicated Paw Ambassadors in maintaining the pristine beauty of our dog-friendly beach, setting a shining example for Volusia County. The process is refreshingly simple: grab a bucket, fill it, dump it, and hang it up for the next enthusiast.

**TOGETHER WE CAN MAKE A PAW-SITIVE DIFFERENCE!**

We held a raffle to raise funds to donate to Fill A Bag, a Key Biscayne non-profit, who worked with us and County of Volusia to provide the cleanup stations. Our volunteers raised \$110 and DDBI matched it with \$110. A \$220 donation has been sent to Fill A Bag with a huge thank you. We look forward to ongoing collaboration in efforts to keep our beaches and ocean pristine.



In the inaugural year of the dog-friendly beach, dedicated volunteers have filled 1,069 time slots, diligently collecting 4,048 pounds of refuse from this cherished shoreline. When combined with the 1,270 pounds gathered during the People & Paws monthly beach cleanups and the 230 pounds amassed at the Jimmy Buffet Day Beach Clean-up, a grand total of 5,548 pounds of litter has been banished from our beloved beaches since July 2021.
