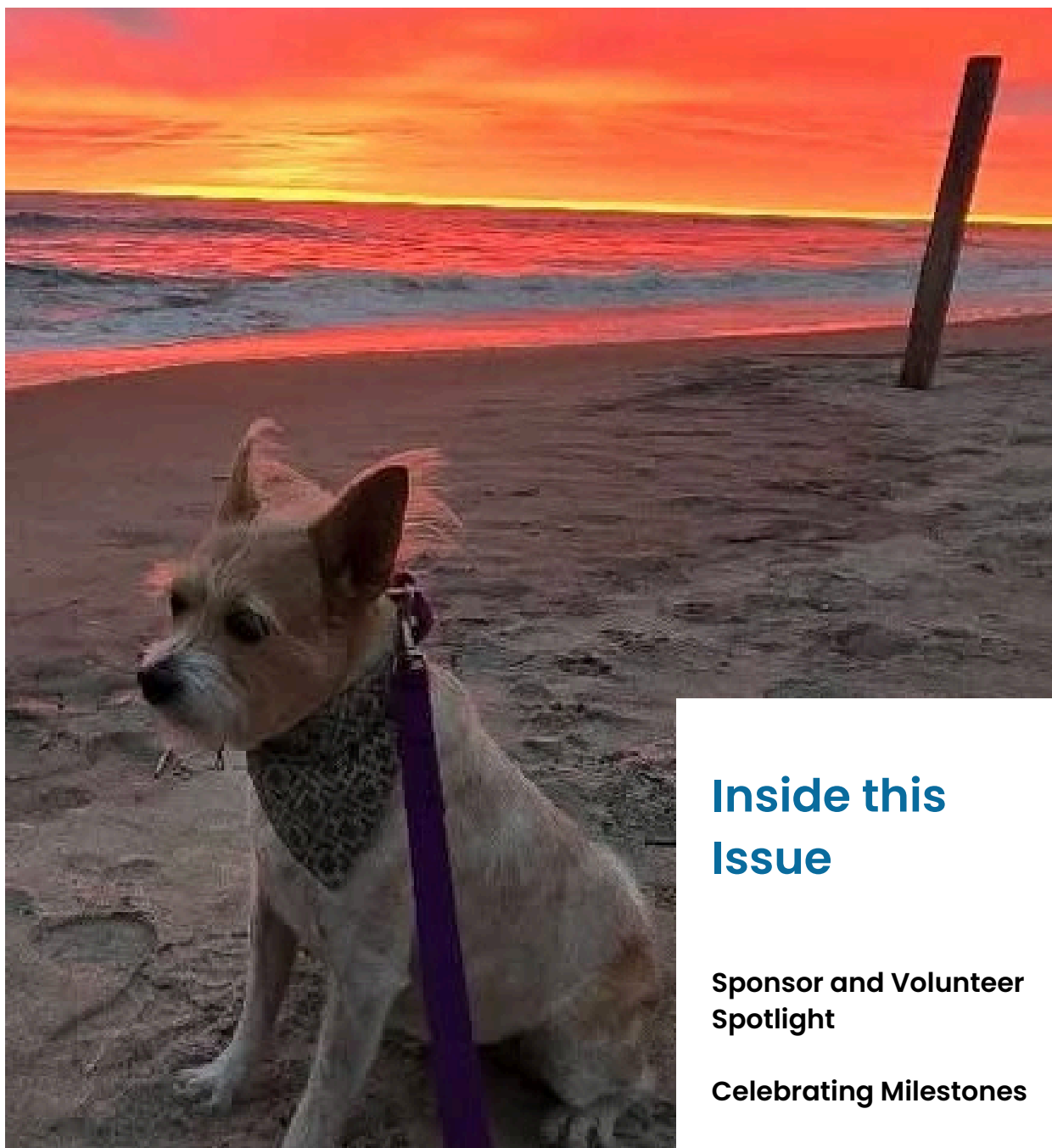

As the new year unfolds, the future of our dog-friendly beach is set to take shape, as our 18-month pilot program concludes. We are expecting a decision from our Volusia County Council in March or April. We hope for a YES!

Many coastal communities recognize the value that dog-friendly spaces add to local tourism and the well-being of residents, influenced by a growing trend towards inclusive outdoor spaces for pet owners. Our dog-friendly beach, which offers a haven for both dogs and their humans, continues to be increasingly popular as people seek more opportunities to integrate their pets into everyday activities.

The direction of dog-friendly beaches hinges on balancing the needs of dog owners with environmental concerns and public safety. Our pilot program has demonstrated that we can achieve that balance, with designated dog areas, waste disposal stations, and leash laws. Additionally, community involvement and advocacy have played a crucial role, encouraging responsible pet ownership and fostering a sense of shared responsibility among beachgoers.

Our Paw Ambassadors have removed 5,268 lb of trash from our 0.6 mile dog beach since November 2023, making it one of the cleanest beaches in Volusia County or anywhere. Leslie and Warren are not only sponsors; they are Paw Ambassadors! Liebchen and ZoZo too!!

Leslie Lee and Warren Ziebarth have been involved with Daytona Dog Beach Inc. even before the ceremony was held to begin the pilot program on November 1st 2023. Leslie says they may have been taking part in a Mutt Strut some three years ago when she and Warren met Nanette McKeel Petrella, President of Daytona Dog Beach Inc. It was the first time they heard about plans being formed to introduce a dog beach in this part of Volusia County. That's when they became regulars at events designed to bring others out to raise awareness and interest.

Leslie and Warren's business, Toodleloo LLC, works much the same way. Their private investment company deals primarily with first trust deeds and most of their clients are introduced to them through referrals from people they know. Some of those clients were also, like Leslie and Warren, the first ones to sponsor waste stations as the inception of Dog Beach was just getting underway.

From happy hours to public meetings with county and city officials, the word was spreading and crowds were getting bigger and more excited. Meetings with elected officials brought so many, chambers were overflowing with supporters.

Finally the day came and "Paws on the Beach" became a reality for an 18 month trial period. Leslie and Warren were part of the crowd with their dogs, Beau and ZoZo. They estimated Beau was about 10 years old when they adopted him. He was able to enjoy happy days on the beach before he crossed the Rainbow Bridge not long ago at the age of 20. Just about 3 months ago, 10 year old ZoZo became a big sister to 2 year old Liebchen (which means Little Darling in German) when Leslie and Warren welcomed her into her furever home.

Leslie and Warren keep busy. Leslie takes Italian classes, Warren does home remodeling, both are active at the gym or camping in their van either locally or cross country! But there is always time for them to grab leashes for ZoZo and Liebchen, and they all enjoy their time as Paw Ambassadors. "Trash we find", Leslie says, "is 99.9 percent human". Warren adds, "It's a great place to bring your dog, just follow the rules." And to that, Leslie explains, "It's a false illusion" that Dog Beach is dirty and dogs are not controlled. Instead we hear from those we meet, with or without a dog, locals and visitors, how clean this beach is and how much fun everyone, especially dogs, are having."

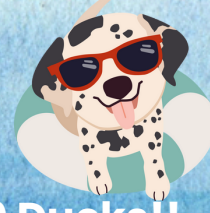

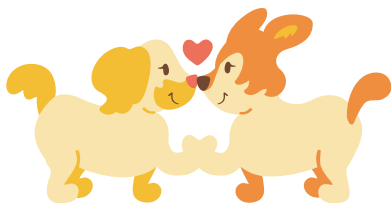

Roger adopted Joy, an almost 8-year-old black and white Boston Terrier about a year ago. As Roger tells it, "the adoption notice was on a bulletin board in a vet's office. The breeder who had her felt she was past her time." A phone call and meeting later and Joy was off with Roger for a new adventure. Joy is truly a JOY! Roger says she gets along with everyone. She has barked maybe 10 times since he's had her, is skittish around anything with air brakes and does not like to be alone!" Like Roger, she shares his love for summer and walking on the beach. What does she enjoy? "Joy loves jumping in the water and getting her "sniffies" in on the sand."

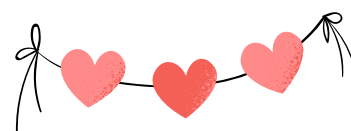

A Passion for Paw-sitive Change: The Journey of Daytona Dog Beach Paw Ambassador Paula Deignan-Reynolds

Born and raised in Northeastern Pennsylvania near the Pocono Mountains, Paula found her way to the sunny shores of Daytona Beach with her pup, Mia, in tow. Their journey led to a deep connection with Daytona's Dog Beach, a place that's become a sanctuary for both dogs and their humans.

Before making Daytona Beach their home, Paula was drawn to the idea of living close to nature and, most importantly, a beach where she could enjoy time with her dog. "There were many parks and nature trails to explore with our pups in my hometown, but my goal was to live no more than 30 minutes from a beach where I could bring my dog," she shares. Since becoming a Paw Ambassador, Paula and Mia have made it a priority to walk the beach almost every day, especially at sunrise when the beauty is truly breathtaking. "The landscape changes daily, and it's been amazing to witness the subtle transformations of the beach," she says. Their daily walks have allowed her to connect with fellow dog lovers and appreciate the small details of the beach that often go unnoticed. "It's like a scavenger hunt every time, looking for what may have washed up or been left behind," she adds.

What Paula loves most about being a Paw Ambassador are the people and dogs she meets along the way. "Our lives have been blessed by the new friends, two and four-legged, we've made," she says. The camaraderie on the Dog Beach is palpable, and her volunteer work has allowed her to meet people from all walks of life, all with a shared love for their pups. Mia, her spirited Jack Russell mix, is often by her side.

Mia, an only pup raised alongside a 16-year-old calico cat named PookiScammer, is both protector and confidant. "She's my source of strength, affection, and millions of smiles," Paula fondly says.

As a Paw Ambassador, Paula hopes to see the continued success and preservation of the dog-friendly beach. "It's a treasure, and its popularity is still growing," she says. The beach is a place for both celebration and solace, where dogs and their owners create lasting memories, whether it's a first visit or a bittersweet goodbye. "It's a small area of a great beach expanse, but it's incredibly special," she concludes.

For Paula, the future of Daytona Dog Beach looks bright, and she's committed to ensuring it remains a place for dogs—and their humans—to enjoy for many years to come.

Being out on the beach, interacting with people, and seeing the positive impact they have is one of the highlights for the Hudsons. "The best part is being out on the beach and interacting with the people," Theresa says. "It's rewarding to see how much people appreciate our mission and how it brings the community together."

The couple's passion is clear: they want to help ensure that Daytona's dog-friendly spaces thrive and continue to grow, bringing joy to pet owners and their dogs alike.

Of course, no story about dog-friendly beaches would be complete without mentioning the Hudsons' furry companion, Tiny. A Jack Russell-Pit mix, Tiny may not be the biggest dog (weighing in at just 30 pounds), but he certainly has a big personality. "Tiny loves walking on the beach, seeing new things, and meeting other dogs," Kris shares. "However, he's a little scared of the waves and the water." Even with his hesitation about the waves, Tiny enjoys the beach and all the new experiences it offers, making him the perfect beach buddy.

As for what the future holds, the Hudsons have big dreams for the dog-friendly spaces in the Daytona area. "I hope the future is that all the beaches in Volusia County become dog-friendly," Kris says. With passionate volunteers like the Hudsons leading the way, it seems the future for Daytona Dog Beach—and other dog-friendly spaces in the region—is bright.

Home for the HOLIDAYS Parade



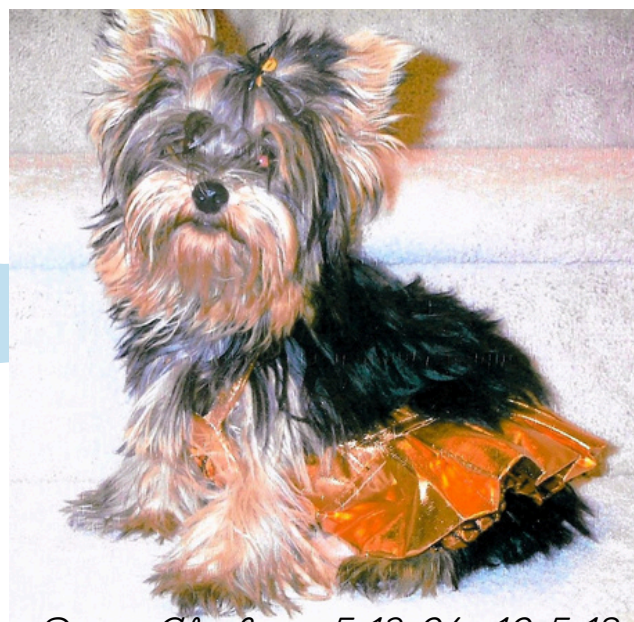

We welcomed our Paw Ambassadors to our 1st Celebration of 2025. Racing's North Turn hosted, outdoing themselves again, providing a wonderful evening for all, both our 2 legged and 4 legged guests.

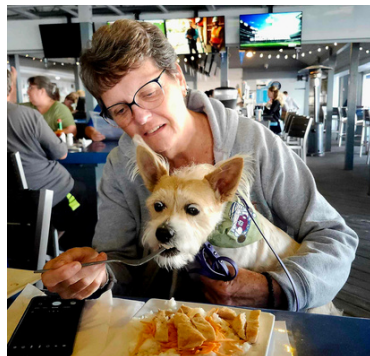
We provided celebration favors which make the connection between our efforts on the dog beach and an item within our mission: To promote dog beaches within Volusia County where well-behaved canine citizens can exercise in a clean, safe environment without endangering or annoying people, property, or wildlife. The key words are **without endangering wildlife**, which we succeed at. Along with bird/dog themed drink coasters, everyone received a reprint of a brochure that is published by Volusia County Environmental Group. The brochure focuses on the "Birds on the Beach".

Through December 2024, Paw Ambassadors have covered 1,301 time slots on the dog friendly beach. With our November Results of 766 lb and December Results of 248 lb, we are beyond proud that to have collected 5,062 lb of trash from the dog-friendly beach. Added to the 1,270 lb collected at DDBI People & Paws monthly beach cleanups and the 230 lb collected at the Jimmy Buffet Day Beach Clean-up, we have removed 6,562 lb of trash from our beaches since July 2021.

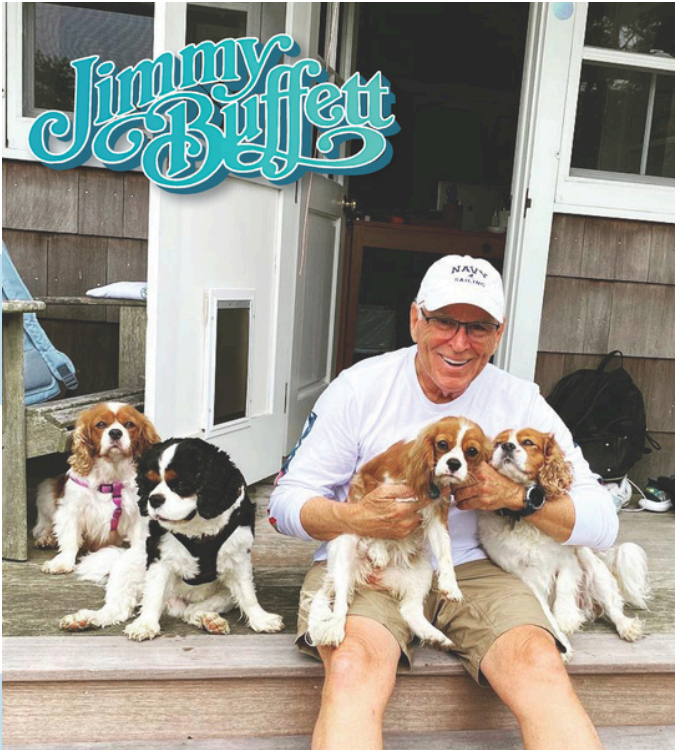
We presented our PAW-SOME and TRASHIEST Paw Ambassador Awards for Nov-Dec to Debi Coursey and her beloved Dutchie. They completed 59 cleanups of the beach and collected 525 lbs over these 2 months.

Trash Removal from Beaches!



In the 15-months of the dog-friendly beach pilot, dedicated volunteers have filled 1,381 time slots, diligently collecting 5268 pounds of refuse from this cherished shoreline. When combined with the 1,270 pounds gathered during the People & Paws monthly beach cleanups and the 230 pounds amassed at the Jimmy Buffet Day Beach Clean-up, a grand total of 6,768 pounds of litter has been banished from our beloved beaches since July 2021.

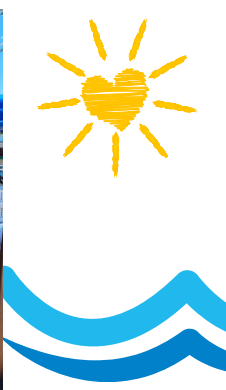

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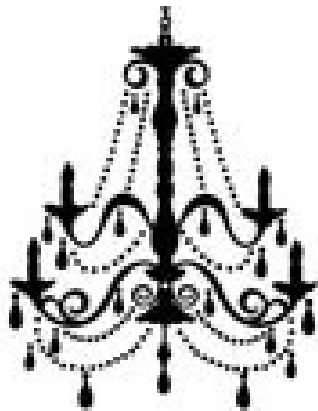
